## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1465

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

There is established the Mississippi Rural 33 SECTION 1. Physicians Scholarship Program for the purpose of identifying and 34 35 recruiting qualified university and college students from rural areas of the state for medical or osteopathic school 36 matriculation. The program shall consist of three (3) distinct 37 phases through which participants will progress, including: 38 39 (a) Undergraduate premedical education; 40 Medical or osteopathic school and residency; and (b) Post-residency entry into medical practice in a 41 (C) 42 rural or underserved area of the State of Mississippi. (1) The Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship 43 SECTION 2. 44 Program shall be administered by a commission to be known as the "Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Commission." The 45 46 commission shall be directed by a board composed of the following 47 members: Two (2) generalist physicians appointed by and from 48 (a) 49 the membership of the Mississippi State Medical Association, the 50 term of which shall be three (3) years and may be reappointed for 51 one (1) additional term; (b) One (1) generalist physician appointed by and from 52 53 the membership of each of the following organizations, the term of 54 which shall be three (3) years and may be reappointed for one (1)

additional term: 55

56 Mississippi Academy of Family Physicians; (i) 57 (ii) Mississippi Chapter, American College of 58

Physicians;

59 (iii) Mississippi Chapter, American Academy of 60 Pediatrics; (iv) Mississippi Chapter, American College of 61 62 OB-GYN; Mississippi Medical and Surgical Association; 63 (v) (vi) Mississippi Osteopathic Association; 64 65 Two (2) designees of the Dean of the University of (C) 66 Mississippi School of Medicine whose terms are at the discretion 67 of the dean, at least one (1) of whom is a member of the University of Mississippi School of Medicine Admissions Committee; 68 69 Two (2) medical students, one (1) of whom shall be (d) 70 selected yearly through a process developed by the dean of the School of Medicine in consultation with the chairs of the 71 departments of family medicine, internal medicine, OB-GYN, and 72 73 pediatrics, and one (1) of whom shall be nominated for a one-year term by the Mississippi Chapter of the Student National Medical 74 75 Association and approved by the Dean of the University of 76 Mississippi School of Medicine; 77 (e) A member of the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning; and 78 79 (f) The Chair of the Department of Family Medicine at 80 the University of Mississippi School of Medicine. The premedical advisors from the accredited four-year 81 (2) colleges and universities in the state and the directors or 82 designees of the primary care generalist training programs in the 83 84 State of Mississippi shall comprise an advisory committee to the board to assist the board in its administration of the Mississippi 85 86 Rural Physicians Scholarship Program. (3) Vacancies on the board must be filled in a manner 87 88 consistent with the original appointments. All appointments to the board must be made no later than 89 (4) September 1, 2007. After the members are appointed, the Chair of 90

91 the Department of Family Medicine shall set a date for the 92 organizational meeting that is mutually acceptable to the majority 93 of the board members. The organizational meeting shall be for the

purposes of organizing the board and establishing rules for 94 95 transacting its business. A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum at all board meetings. An affirmative 96 97 vote of a majority of the members present and voting shall be required in the adoption of rules, reports and in any other 98 actions taken by the board. At the organizational meeting, the 99 100 board shall elect a chair and vice chair from the members 101 appointed according to paragraphs (a) through (d) of subsection 102 (1). The chair shall serve for a term of two (2) years, upon the expiration of which the vice chair shall assume the office of 103 104 chair.

105 (5) After the organizational meeting, the board shall hold 106 no less than two (2) meetings annually.

107 (6) The board may form an executive committee for the 108 purpose of transacting business that must be conducted before the 109 next regularly scheduled meeting of the board. All actions taken 110 by the executive committee must be ratified by the board at its 111 next regularly scheduled meeting.

(7) Members of the board shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed, subject to the availability of funding, for mileage and actual and necessary expenses incurred in attending meetings of the board.

116 (8) The commission shall be at the University of Mississippi 117 Medical Center. Funding any required staff support and operation 118 must be from monies appropriated for the Mississippi Rural 119 Physicians Scholarship Program and not for the University of 120 Mississippi Medical Center.

121 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The Board of the Mississippi Rural Physicians 122 Scholarship Commission shall have the following powers and duties: 123 (a) Developing the administrative policy for the 124 commission and the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship

(b) Developing and implementing strategies and
activities for the identification and recruitment of students and
for marketing the program and for the implementation of the

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Program;

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129 program. In developing these strategies, the board shall seek the 130 input of various organizations and entities, including the 131 Mississippi State Medical Association, the Mississippi Academy of 132 Family Physicians, the Mississippi Chapters of the American 133 College of Physicians, the American Academy of Pediatrics, the 134 American College of OB-GYN, the Mississippi Medical and Surgical 135 Association and the Mississippi Osteopathic Medicine Association;

(c) Establishing a budget to support the activities of
the program and periodically reviewing and if appropriate,
revising, the scholarship and other stipends offered through the
program;

140 (d) Hiring an executive director and support staff141 necessary for the commission's work;

(e) Reviewing participants progress in the program andmentoring students and physicians participating in the program;

(f) Developing and participating in programs that provide initial practice support in collaboration with other interested professional organizations. All funding for practice support must be separate from University of Mississippi Medical Center funding and not under University of Mississippi Medical Center control.

150 SECTION 4. (1) The board shall develop and implement 151 policies and procedures designed to recruit, identify and enroll 152 undergraduate students who demonstrate necessary interest, 153 commitment, aptitude and academic achievement to pursue careers as 154 family physicians or other generalist physicians in rural or medically underserved areas of Mississippi, and to develop and 155 156 implement the programs designed to foster successful entry of 157 participants into medical school, completion of medical school, 158 enrollment into and completion of family medicine or other 159 generalist residency, and establishment and maintenance of a career in family medicine or other generalist specialty in a rural 160 161 or underserved area of Mississippi.

162 (2) The board shall have the authority through use of 163 generally applicable definitions, to designate an area of the 164 state as underserved or rural.

165 (3) The board, in conjunction with the University of 166 Mississippi Medical Center, shall have the authority to provide 167 students selected for scholarship funding with faculty mentors and other programs designed to enhance the students' likelihood of 168 admission to the medical school. The board and the University of 169 170 Mississippi Medical Center will develop course work that will provide scholarship students with the skills necessary for 171 172 sustained and successful medical practice in rural Mississippi.

(4) Each applicant for admission to the program must submit
an application to the commission that conforms to requirements
established by the board.

(5) In selecting participants for the program, the board may only accept an applicant if his or her academic record and other characteristics, if given consideration by the University of Mississippi School of Medicine Admissions Committee, would be considered credible and competitive.

181 (6) An applicant for the program may be admitted only upon a182 majority vote of the members of the board.

183 (7) Up to fifteen (15) students will be admitted to the
184 Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program each year,
185 beginning with the 2008-2009 academic year.

186 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) Participants must adhere to the policies and 187 practices as stipulated by the board to continue in the program.

188 Students in the program may receive tuition or other (2) 189 financial support that may be provided by the commission. If a 190 student in the program is admitted to and completes medical or 191 osteopathic school, any tuition or other educational and living 192 support provided to the student by the commission will be 193 forgiven. However, if the student is not successful in being 194 accepted into medical or osteopathic school within three (3) years of entry into the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship 195 196 Program, or if the student otherwise breaches his or her agreement

197 with the commission, all financial assistance provided to the 198 student must be repaid according to policies adopted by the board.

199 <u>SECTION 6.</u> (1) Students in the program may apply to any 200 medical or osteopathic school that is accredited by the Liaison 201 Committee on Medical Education (LCME) or the American Osteopathic 202 Association (AOA).

(2) Students in the program seeking admission to the
University of Mississippi School of Medicine shall be eligible for
a special admissions process pursuant to criteria established by
the School of Medicine Admissions Committee which will include
special consideration of the attributes of participation in the
program.

209 (3) In carrying out the admissions process developed for the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program participants 210 211 under this section, the goal is for the program to work with the School of Medicine to enhance the capability of participants to 212 213 successfully enter and complete medical school, train in family 214 medicine or other generalist primary care specialty and enter 215 practice in rural or underserved areas in Mississippi. To the extent feasible, the early admissions process should be completed 216 217 before November 1 of the year preceding a student's admission to 218 medical school.

219 SECTION 7. (1) Subject to the availability of funding, 220 students in the program who successfully matriculate to medical or 221 osteopathic school are eligible for ongoing financial support in 222 accordance with policies and requirements of the commission and in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations. The number 223 224 of students to be supported at the University of Mississippi 225 School of Medicine and at other schools will be established by 226 policy prescribed by the board.

(2) Subject to the availability of funding, students
enrolled at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine may
receive tuition support, funding to assist with the cost of books
and a living stipend, as prescribed by policy of the board and in
accordance with applicable regulations. Preferences for ongoing

232 funding must be given to those students admitted to the University 233 of Mississippi School of Medicine.

(3) For each year that a student in medical or osteopathic 234 235 school receives financial assistance, the student is obligated for 236 one (1) year of practice as a primary care physician in a rural or 237 underserved area in Mississippi. Breach of the agreement at any stage of training shall invoke the repayment of all financial 238 239 assistance provided to the student through the Mississippi Rural 240 Physicians Scholarship Program, including assistance provided during undergraduate school, as well as in medical or osteopathic 241 242 school, along with other penalties that may be prescribed in 243 policy by the board.

SECTION 8. Medical and osteopathic students in the program 244 245 must enter family medicine or other generalist residency programs according to their choice of specialty. Depending upon the 246 availability of funds, students who successfully enter residency 247 248 programs which have been approved by the board may receive further 249 financial support from the Mississippi Rural Physicians 250 Scholarship Program subject to applicable rules and policies of 251 the commission. All funding for financial support from the 252 commission to participants during their residency must be separate 253 from University of Mississippi Medical Center funding and not 254 under University of Mississippi Medical Center control and be 255 disbursed in accordance with applicable regulations.

256 SECTION 9. (1) Upon completion of residency, a participant 257 in the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program must proceed to enter the practice of medicine in a rural or 258 259 underserved area in Mississippi, as defined by the board and 260 consistent with generally acceptable designations. If an area 261 experiences significant changes in its medical or general 262 community which are not reflected by health professional shortage 263 area (HPSA) or medically underserved area (MUA) rural designation, 264 the board may receive testimony and, in its discretion, may 265 qualify the area as an underserved or rural area to allow the 266 program participant to fulfill his or her practice obligation.

267 (2) Upon entering the practice of medicine, a participant in 268 the program must serve in a health professional shortage area (HPSA), medically underserved area (MUA), or rural area otherwise 269 270 approved for practice under subsection (1) of this section for a 271 number of years which corresponds to the number of years, not to 272 exceed five (5), for which the participant received funding through the program. A participant who completes residency 273 outside the State of Mississippi who fails to enter the practice 274 275 of medicine as required under this section shall be deemed in breach of contract and shall be liable for the immediate repayment 276 277 of all financial assistance provided to the participant through 278 the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program, including 279 assistance provided during undergraduate school, as well as in medical or osteopathic school, along with other penalties that may 280 281 be prescribed in policy by the board. Any participant who fails to complete the period of practice for which he or she is 282 283 obligated to provide services in a health professional shortage 284 area (HPSA) or a medically underserved area (MUA) in exchange for 285 financial assistance received through the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program shall be liable for the repayment 286 287 of all financial assistance provided to the participant through 288 the program, along with other penalties that may be prescribed by 289 the board, an amount which shall be reduced on a pro rata basis 290 for actual years of practice by the physician in the area 291 designated by the board.

292 <u>SECTION 10.</u> The Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship 293 Commission, acting through the board, shall make every effort to 294 establish an initial practice entry support system for 295 participants in the program.

296 <u>SECTION 11.</u> This act may not be construed as granting the 297 Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Commission or its 298 governing board any governing or administrative authority over any 299 program administered by any college, university, medical school or 300 residency program in this state or any other program established 301 by state law, including the Medical Education Scholarship and Loan

302 Repayment Program established under Section 37-143-6.

303 **SECTION 12.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 304 and after July 1, 2007.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE MISSISSIPPI RURAL PHYSICIANS 1 2 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM AND COMMISSION FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECRUITING 3 AND TRAINING QUALIFIED PERSONS TO PRACTICE MEDICINE IN RURAL AREAS 4 OF THE STATE; TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI RURAL PHYSICIANS 5 SCHOLARSHIP COMMISSION TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM; TO ESTABLISH A 6 BOARD FOR THE MISSISSIPPI RURAL PHYSICIANS SCHOLARSHIP COMMISSION 7 AND TO PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES; TO PROVIDE THAT THE 8 COMMISSION SHALL BE HOUSED IN THE SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AT THE 9 UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI MEDICAL CENTER; TO PRESCRIBE THE 10 ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS SEEKING ENTRY 11 INTO THE PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A PROCESS IN 12 CONJUNCTION WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL OF MEDICINE 13 WHICH WOULD FACILITATE EARLY ADMISSION OF QUALIFIED PROGRAM 14 PARTICIPANTS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL OF MEDICINE; 15 TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSION TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO 16 PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS IN UNDERGRADUATE AND MEDICAL SCHOOL AND 17 RESIDENCY; TO REQUIRE MEDICAL SCHOOL PARTICIPANTS TO ENTER AND 18 COMPLETE FAMILY MEDICINE OR OTHER GENERALIST RESIDENCY PROGRAMS; TO REQUIRE PARTICIPANTS TO PRACTICE MEDICINE AS FAMILY PHYSICIANS 19 20 OR OTHER GENERALIST PHYSICIANS IN A RURAL OR HEALTH PROFESSIONAL SHORTAGE AREA OR MEDICALLY UNDERSERVED AREA OF THE STATE FOR THE 21 NUMBER OF YEARS, NOT TO EXCEED FIVE, WHICH CORRESPONDS TO THE 22 NUMBER OF YEARS THAT THE PARTICIPANT RECEIVED FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE 23 24 THROUGH THE PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE PARTICIPANTS WHO FAIL TO COMPLETE 25 THEIR FAMILY MEDICINE OR GENERALIST RESIDENCY AND PRACTICE OBLIGATIONS TO REPAY, ON A PRO RATA BASIS, ANY FINANCIAL 26 27 ASSISTANCE RECEIVED THROUGH THE PROGRAM PLUS PENALTIES; TO REQUIRE THE COMMISSION TO ENDEAVOR TO ESTABLISH AN INITIAL PRACTICE ENTRY 28 SUPPORT SYSTEM; TO PROVIDE THAT THE COMMISSION AND ITS BOARD HAVE 29 30 NO AUTHORITY OVER ANY PROGRAMS OTHER THAN THE MISSISSIPPI RURAL 31 PHYSICIANS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
