Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1668

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	Treasury to the credit of the State Board of Barber Examiners, for
8	the purpose of defraying the expenses of the board for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
10	\$ 239,438.00.
11	SECTION 2. With the funds approved for expenditure under
12	Section 1, the following positions are authorized:
13	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
14	Permanent: Full Time 2
15	Part Time 4
16	Time-Limited: Full Time 0
17	Part Time0
18	Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation
19	Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase
20	equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation
21	Plan or One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or Three Percent (3%)
22	whichever is greater, to be awarded on July 1, 2007.
23	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
24	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
25	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
26	Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008
27	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
28	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the
29	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
30	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
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- 31 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
- 32 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
- It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 33
- 34 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
- cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal 35
- Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 36
- 37 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- 38 Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 39
- projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" 40
- appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 41
- reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 42
- requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 43
- 44 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 45 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 46 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 47 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 48
- 49 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 50
- 51 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 52
- 53 appropriated level.
- 54 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 55
- 56 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 57 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 58 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise
- award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 59
- 60 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other
- 61 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless
- specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 62
- teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 63
- 64 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an
- 65 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public

66 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as

67 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement

- 68 of a departing employee with an individual from within state
- 69 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the
- 70 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses,
- 71 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be
- 72 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise
- 73 authorized in this act.
- 74 **SECTION 3.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 75 State Board of Barber Examiners shall maintain complete accounting
- 76 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 77 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 78 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 79 2007. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 80 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2009 shall be submitted to
- 81 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 82 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 83 during the Fiscal Year 2008 budget request process.
- 84 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 85 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 86 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 87 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 88 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 89 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 90 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 91 made without competitive bids.
- 92 **SECTION 5.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 93 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 94 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 95 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 96 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 97 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 98 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 99 and after July 1, 2007.
