## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1691

## TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## **AMENDMENT NO. 1**

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
10	\$ 9,149,261.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14	Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source
15	funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for
16	the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
18	\$ 52,681,603.00.
19	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
20	above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state
21	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to
22	the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
23	July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008 \$ 5,750,000.00.
24	The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the
25	amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it
26	sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and
27	other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside
28	from such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
29	provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
30	as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
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- 31 any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of
- 32 1972.
- Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be 33
- 34 expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
- 35 authorized by law. The department shall make a detailed report to
- 36 the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage
- 37 funds by September 1 for the preceding fiscal year.
- 38 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 39 Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the
- amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred 40
- Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the 41
- 42 Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75
- 43 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of
- defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2008. 44
- 45 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 46
- 47 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
- Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars 48
- 49 (\$50,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, protection,
- conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and wildlife of this 50
- 51 state.
- 52 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 53 Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized.

- Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation 59
- 60 Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase
- 61 equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation
- Plan or One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or Three Percent (3%) 62
- whichever is greater, to be awarded on July 1, 2007. 63
- 64 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
- 65 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to

66 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal

67 Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008

funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 68

- 69 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the
- 70 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
- 71 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
- 72 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
- 73 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
- 74 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
- that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 75
- 76 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal
- Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 77
- 78 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 79
- 80 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" 81
- 82 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 83
- 84 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 85
- 86 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 87 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 88
- Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 89
- approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 90
- 91 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 92 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 93 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 94 appropriated level.
- 95 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 96 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 97
- act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 98
- 99 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise
- 100 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification,

101 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other

102 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless

specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 103

104 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the

next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an 105

educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 106

107 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as

108 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement

109 of a departing employee with an individual from within state

service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 110

departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, 111

112 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be

determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise 113

authorized in this act. 114

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115 SECTION 6. Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be

furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Five Hundred

117 Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per annum.

118 Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of

119 Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one county to another

on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on 120

121 out-of-county duty shall not be applicable.

122 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain 123

124 complete accounting and personnel records related to the

125 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such

126 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as

maintained for Fiscal Year 2007. It is further the intention of 127

128 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year

129 2009 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee

130 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level

131 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2008 budget request

132 process.

SECTION 8. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 133

134 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of

135 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized

136	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
137	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
138	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
139	performance measures provided below:

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the 170 171 following amount shall come from the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Special Pearl River Timber Fund No. 3465, for 172 173 the purpose of making improvements to the Pearl River Wildlife 174 Management Area.....\$ 50,000.00. SECTION 10. The board of supervisors of any county or any 175 group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and 176 177 empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and 178 with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the 179 purpose of creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and 180 fish habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within 181 such county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not 182 exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the 183 184 general county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the 185 186 actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental 187 188 thereto. Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and empowered, in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary 189 190 to carry out the purposes of this act with any other county, the 191 United States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be 192 necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for 193 such purposes. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee 194 SECTION 11. 195 or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of 196 197 Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for 198 any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of 199 Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof. 200 It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles 201 authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972. 202 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 203

Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the

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205 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not

206 to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), that may become

available to the department in accordance with the rules and 207

208 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.

- SECTION 13. In order to be in compliance with Sections 209
- 63-1-74 through 63-1-79, funds are herein provided and may be 210
- expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay 211
- 212 the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees
- 213 and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the
- 214 course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold
- 215 a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.
- 216 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 217
- authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi 218
- 219 Development Authority in the amount of Four Million Dollars
- (\$4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi 220
- 221 Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used to defray the cost of
- 222 constructing a North Mississippi Fish Hatchery.
- SECTION 15. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, 223
- 224 Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of
- 225 One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) and to enter into
- 226 an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
- 227 for a biology specialist and related supportive cost.
- 228 The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to
- escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and 229
- 230 Parks for this purpose.
- 231 **SECTION 16.** The department is authorized to spend up to
- 232 twenty-five percent (25%) of revenue in the State Park Timber
- 233 Endowment Fund, as needed, to operate and maintain the state
- 234 parks.
- SECTION 17. As funds become available to the department, an 235
- amount equal to One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars 236
- (\$1,500,000.00) may be used for completion of the North 237
- 238 Mississippi Fish Hatchery and any repair of levies or dams as
- 239 deemed necessary by the department.

240 **SECTION 18.** It is the intention of the Legislature that no

241 more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) be spent

- 242 from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the purchase of motor vehicles.
- 243 **SECTION 19.** With the funds appropriated herein, it is the
- 244 intention of the Legislature that a reasonable number of
- 245 Conservation Officers, Conservation Officer Supervisors, District
- 246 Managers, Area Managers, and Lake Managers shall be employed
- 247 and/or detailed to both temporary and permanent job assignments in
- 248 areas other than their county of residence.
- 249 SECTION 20. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 250 Commission of the Mississippi Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall
- 251 have the authority to close, transfer, lease or sell properties
- 252 under the department's jurisdiction funds should go to the agency.
- 253 **SECTION 21.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 254 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 255 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 256 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 257 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 258 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 259 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 260 made without competitive bids.
- 261 **SECTION 22.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 262 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
- 263 authority to receive and transfer from any source funds available,
- 264 not to exceed One Million Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
- 265 (\$1,350,000.00), in accordance with rules and regulations of the
- 266 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent
- 267 with the escalation of federal funds, for the purpose of
- 268 transferring funds to Alcorn State Agricultural Programs for
- 269 providing a Goat/Swine processing facility .
- 270 **SECTION 23.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 271 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 272 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 273 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

274 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the

275 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

276 SECTION 24. This act shall take effect and be in force from

277 and after July 1, 2007.
