Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1696

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be			
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State			
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of

11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be			
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special			
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department			
14	of Health which is comprised of special source funds collected by			
15	or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of			
16	defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year			
17	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008			
18	\$ 240,417,992.00.			
19	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of			
20	Sections 1 and 2, Five Million Four Hundred Four Thousand Two			
21	Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$5,404,270.00) shall be derived from the			
22	State General Fund and Nine Million Seven Hundred Eight Thousand			
23	Three Hundred Thirty-seven Dollars (\$9,708,337.00) shall be			
24	derived from the Health Care Expendable Fund, created in Section			
25	43-13-407, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the support and			
26	maintenance of the State Department of Health. The funds provided			
27	in this section shall be allocated as follows:

36 The State Department of Health may transfer a portion of 37 Trauma Care System funds to the Division of Medicaid for the 38 development and implementation of an enhanced reimbursement fee 39 program related to trauma care and services, used to match federal 40 funds, under a cooperative agreement between the State Department 41 of Health and the Division of Medicaid.

It is the intention of the Legislature that if House Bill 1132, 2007 Regular Session, is enacted the Department of Health shall transfer Two Million Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,550,000.00) to the designated support agency for the school nurse program.

47 It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the Five 48 Million Three Hundred Twenty-six Thousand Nine Hundred One Dollars 49 (\$5,326,901.00) authorized herein for the Trauma Care System shall be expended to the benefit of any hospital located outside the 50 boundaries of the State of Mississippi, unless otherwise excepted 51 in this paragraph. Further, unless otherwise excepted in this 52 53 paragraph, no such out-of-state hospital shall be authorized to 54 receive such funds until such time as the amount appropriated for 55 such purpose shall reach an amount of Eight Million Dollars 56 (\$8,000,000.00) or more. Funds shall be expended by the Mississippi Department of Health for distribution to the Regional 57 58 Medical Center at Memphis, located in Memphis, Tennessee, for their participation in the Trauma Care System. 59

60 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 61 Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall 62 be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of 63 expenditure:

101 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 102 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal 103 104 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 105 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 106 107 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" 108 109 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 110 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 111 112 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

113 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 114 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 115 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 116 117 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 118 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 119 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 120 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 121 appropriated level.

122 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 123 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 124 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 125 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

126 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 127 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 128 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 129 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 130 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 131 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an 132 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 133 134 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 135 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement

B. 1696 PAGE 4 of a departing employee with an individual from within state service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise authorized in this act.

SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 142 143 State Department of Health shall maintain complete accounting and 144 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 145 146 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2007. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 147 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2009 shall be submitted to 148 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 149 150 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2008 budget request process. 151

SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

194	SECTION 7. It is the intent of the Legislature that	t the	
195	Mississippi Department of Health shall have authority to escalate		
196	the various budgets in both funds and positions, with the approval		
197	of the State Fiscal Officer, from any special funds collected or		
198	available, in the current fiscal year or any prior fiscal year,		
199	not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00), to the agency		
200	for expenditure. Upon such approval, the Mississippi Department		
201	of Health may expend such funds in the manner authorized by law.		
202	The Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of		
203	Health shall submit to the Department of Finance and		
204	Administration a certified statement providing a detailed		
205	explanation for any escalation, including a justification for the

B. 1696 PAGE 6 establishment of any new positions or reclassification of existing positions and the existence of any required matching funds for those positions, and an assessment of the impact on the agency's General Fund Budget for the three (3) fiscal years following the fiscal year in which the escalation is requested.

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that with the funds provided herein, the State Department of Health may provide and administer without charge, Hepatitis B vaccinations to Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel who are in need of such vaccinations through job related exposure.

216 SECTION 9. In addition to all other sums heretofore appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 217 218 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Local Governments and Rural Water 219 220 Systems Emergency Loan Fund, and the Local Governments and Rural Water System Improvements Revolving Loan Fund as authorized in 221 222 Chapter 521, Laws of 1995, to the State Department of Health for 223 the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Local Governments and Rural Water Systems Improvements Board, for the fiscal year 224 225 beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008..... 226\$ 28,000,000.00.

227 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One 228 Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall come from the Department of 229 Human Services, Child Care Development Fund or other appropriate 230 special funds for the purpose of child care licensure. These 231 funds are to be transferred to the State Department of Health no later than July 31, 2007. The State Department of Health shall 232 233 make a complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the 234 Department of Human Services.

SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Health shall expend not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of the funds appropriated in Section and allocated in Section 4 for providing the oil known as "Lorenzo's Oil" for the treatment of the genetic disorder adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD), to children and Mississippi residents over the age of twenty-one (21) who have the genetic disorder adrenoleukodystrophy and for whom Medicaid does not reimburse the cost of providing the oil. The department may also provide needed pathology and biannual MRI exams.

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Seven Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$725,000.00) are provided for the purpose of purchasing AIDS drugs and other necessary AIDS related medical services.

249 SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) shall be provided to the 250 251 Southern AIDS Commission, Inc., for the purpose of providing 252 technical assistance, and providing for the expansion of education 253 on causes and prevention of HIV/AIDS, and providing delivery services to persons infected with HIV. The Southern AIDS 254 255 Commission, Inc. shall report by February 1, 2008, to the Board of Health and the Chairmen of the House and Senate Public Health 256 257 Committees the status of the project and all services provided.

258 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 259 and allocated in Section 3, the amounts of One Hundred Ten 260 Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-seven Dollars (\$110,977.00) shall be 261 allocated to the T.K. Martin Center at Mississippi State 262 University and One Hundred Ten Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-seven Dollars (\$110,977.00) shall be allocated to the Regional 263 264 Rehabilitation Center in Tupelo for the Early Intervention 265 Program.

266 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds appropriated herein, Fifty Thousand 267 Dollars (\$50,000.00) is provided for the Breast and Cervical 268 Cancer Program.

SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the State Department of Health may authorize increases in major objects of expenditure in total amounts not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the appropriated amount of each major object of expenditure, provided that other major objects of expenditure are decreased by a corresponding dollar amount. However, no transfers shall be authorized which increase 276 the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and Fringe 277 Benefits."

278 SECTION 17. In addition to all other funds heretofore 279 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 280 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Burn Care Fund which is 281 comprised of special source funds collected by or otherwise 282 283 available to the department, for the purpose of funding the 284 development of a plan for delivery of services and of providing 285 reimbursement for uncompensated medical care to Mississippi burn 286 victims through the trauma care system, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008..... 287

288 \$3,000,000.00.

289 The State Department of Health shall issue any certificates 290 of need necessary to any person proposing the construction of, addition of, or conversion of any beds or the expansion of any 291 292 health care facility for use exclusively for the treatment of burn 293 victims, and such beds shall be classified and limited to use for 294 such treatment of burn victims and may not be converted to any 295 other use and are not to be classified or included in the acute 296 care bed inventory of the state for health planning purposes. Any 297 such beds shall participate in the statewide trauma care system as 298 provided by Section 41-59-5 and be entitled to an allocation of 299 funds from the Mississippi Burn Care Fund as established by 300 Section 7-9-70. For purposes of this subsection, the provisions 301 of Section 41-7-193(1) requiring substantial compliance with the 302 projection of need as reported in the current State Health Plan 303 are waived.

304 SECTION 18. It is the intention of the Legislature that 305 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 306 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 307 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 308 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 309 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 310 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 311 made without competitive bids.

312 SECTION 19. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 313 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 314 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 315 316 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 317 318 SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from 319 and after July 1, 2007.
