## **Replace By Substitute COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO**

## House Bill No. 1691

## **BY: Committee**

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
10	\$ 8,841,112.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14	Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source
15	funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for
16	the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008
18	\$ 52,681,603.00.
19	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
20	above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state
21	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to
22	the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
23	July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008 \$ 5,750,000.00.

- The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the 24
- 25 amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it
- 26 sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and
- 27 other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside
- 28 from such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
- 29 provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
- as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and 30
- any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of 31
- 1972. 32
- 33 Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be
- 34 expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
- 35 authorized by law. The department shall make a detailed report to
- the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage 36
- 37 funds by September 1 for the preceding fiscal year.
- SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 38
- 39 Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the
- 40 amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred
- Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the 41
- 42 Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75
- 43 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of
- 44 defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2008.
- 45 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 46 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
- 47 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
- 48 Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty
- Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, 49
- 50 protection, conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and
- wildlife of this state. 51
- 52 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 53 Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amount set forth below shall
- 54 be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
- 55 expenditure:

78	Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation
79	Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase
80	equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation
81	Plan or One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or Three Percent (3%)
82	whichever is greater, to be awarded on July 1, 2007.
83	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
84	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
85	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
86	Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008
87	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions

- are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the 88 89 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 90 91 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 92 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 93 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 94 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal 95 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 96 97 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 98 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 99 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" 100 101 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 102 103 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 104 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 105 106 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 107 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 108 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 109 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 110 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 111 112 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 113 appropriated level. 114 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 115
- used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 118 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 119 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification,

- realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 120 121 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 122 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 123 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 124 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an 125 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 126 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement 127 of a departing employee with an individual from within state 128 129 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 130 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, 131 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be 132 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise authorized in this act. 133 SECTION 6. Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be 134 135 furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Five Hundred
- 136 Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per annum. 137 Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of 138 Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one county to another 139 on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on

out-of-county duty shall not be applicable.

141 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 142 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the 143 144 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 145 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2007. It is further the intention of 146 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 147 148 2009 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 149 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2008 budget request 150 151 process.

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152	SECTION 8. In compliance with the "Missis	sippi Performance
153	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it	is the intent of
154	the Legislature that the funds provided herein	shall be utilized

L89	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the
L90	following amount shall come from the Department of Wildlife,
L91	Fisheries and Parks Special Pearl River Timber Fund No. 3465, for
L92	the purpose of making improvements to the Pearl River Wildlife
L93	Management Area \$ 150,000.00.
L94	SECTION 10. The board of supervisors of any county or any
L95	group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and
L96	empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and
L97	with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the
L98	purpose of creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and
L99	fish habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within
200	such county or in an adjoining county; and each county is
201	empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not
202	exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the
203	general county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall
204	reimburse to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the
205	actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by
206	the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental
207	thereto. Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and
802	empowered, in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary
209	to carry out the purposes of this act with any other county, the
210	United States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be
211	necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for
212	such purposes.
213	SECTION 11. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee
214	or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use
215	of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of

- 216 Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for
- 217 any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of
- 218 Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.
- It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles
- 220 authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply
- 221 with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 222 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 223 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
- 224 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not
- 225 to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), that may become
- 226 available to the department in accordance with the rules and
- 227 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.
- 228 **SECTION 13.** In order to be in compliance with Sections
- 229 63-1-74 through 63-1-79, funds are herein provided and may be
- 230 expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay
- 231 the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees
- 232 and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the
- 233 course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold
- 234 a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.
- 235 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 236 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
- 237 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi
- 238 Development Authority in the amount of Four Million Dollars
- 239 (\$4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi
- 240 Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used to defray the cost of
- 241 constructing a North Mississippi Fish Hatchery.
- 242 **SECTION 15.** The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
- 243 Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of
- 244 One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) and to enter into
- 245 an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
- 246 for a biology specialist and related supportive cost.

- 247 The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to
- 248 escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and
- 249 Parks for this purpose.
- 250 **SECTION 16.** The department is authorized to spend up to
- 251 twenty-five percent (25%) of revenue in the State Park Timber
- 252 Endowment Fund, as needed, to operate and maintain the state
- 253 parks.
- 254 **SECTION 17.** As funds become available to the department, an
- 255 amount equal to One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 256 (\$1,500,000.00) may be used for completion of the North
- 257 Mississippi Fish Hatchery and any repair of levies or dams as
- 258 deemed necessary by the department.
- 259 **SECTION 18.** It is the intention of the Legislature that no
- 260 more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) be spent
- 261 from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the purchase of motor vehicles.
- 262 **SECTION 19.** With the funds appropriated herein, it is the
- 263 intention of the Legislature that a reasonable number of
- 264 Conservation Officers, Conservation Officer Supervisors, District
- 265 Managers, Area Managers, and Lake Managers shall be employed
- 266 and/or detailed to both temporary and permanent job assignments in
- 267 areas other than their county of residence.
- 268 **SECTION 20.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 269 Commission of the Mississippi Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall
- 270 have the authority to close, transfer, lease or sell properties
- 271 under the department's jurisdiction.
- 272 **SECTION 21.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 273 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 274 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 275 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 276 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 277 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

- the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.
- 280 **SECTION 22.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 281 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
- 282 authority to receive and transfer from any source funds available,
- 283 not to exceed One Million Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
- 284 (\$1,350,000.00), in accordance with rules and regulations of the
- 285 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent
- 286 with the escalation of federal funds, for the purpose of
- 287 transferring funds to Alcorn State Agricultural Programs for
- 288 providing a Goat/Swine processing facility .
- 289 **SECTION 23.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 290 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 291 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 292 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 293 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 294 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 295 **SECTION 24.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 296 and after July 1, 2007.
