## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

## Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State

10	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of

Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation Plan or One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or Three Percent (3%) whichever is greater, to be awarded on July 1, 2007.

37 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 38 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 39 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008 40 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 41 42 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the 43 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 44 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 45 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 46 47 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 48 49 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal 50 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 51 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 52 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 53 54 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services"

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appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

59 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 60 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 61 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 62 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 63 The 64 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 65 66 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the appropriated level. 67

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

72 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 73 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 74 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 75 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 76 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 77 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 78 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an 79 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 80 81 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement of a departing employee with an individual from within state 82 83 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 84 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, 85 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be

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86 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise 87 authorized in this act.

SECTION 3. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 88 89 State Fire Academy shall maintain complete accounting and 90 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 91 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 92 2007. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 93 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2009 shall be submitted to 94 95 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 96 during the Fiscal Year 2008 budget request process. 97

98 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 99 State Fire Academy shall have the authority to escalate and expend 100 funds, not to exceed One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 101 (\$150,000.00), from any source that may become available to the 102 agency in accordance with the rules and regulations of the 103 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent 104 with the escalation of federal funds.

SECTION 5. Of the funds provided under the provisions of this act, Fifty-one Thousand One Hundred Ninety-six Dollars (\$51,196.00) is provided to reclassify nine (9) positions and Three Thousand One Hundred One Dollar (\$3,101.00) is provided to reallocate one (1) position.

110 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 111 112 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 113 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 114 115 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 116 117 made without competitive bids.

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118 SECTION 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 119 120 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 121 122 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 123 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from 124 125 and after July 1, 2007.
