| 20 | 1971, and early in their marriage, she joined King Solomon Baptist |
| 21 | Church and later joined Rose Hill Baptist Church, where she served |
| 22 | as an usher and made all members and visitors feel welcome with |
| 23 | her warm smile and delightful spirit; and |
| 24 | WHEREAS, Mrs. West continued her education after high school |
| 25 | and graduated from Southern University in 1971 with her |

undergraduate degree and Alcorn State University, in 1994, with
