## HOUSE BILL NO. 1099

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI SKILL STANDARDS BOARD AS AN 2 ADVISORY BOARD TO THE GOVERNOR, THE LEGISLATURE AND THE STATE 3 WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF A STATEWIDE SYSTEM OF INDUSTRY-DEFINED, INDUSTRY-RECOGNIZED SKILL STANDARDS 4 5 AND CREDENTIALS FOR CERTAIN SKILLED OCCUPATIONS; TO PROVIDE FOR 6 THE COMPOSITION OF THE BOARD; TO PROVIDE THE DUTIES OF THE BOARD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 9 SECTION 1. (1) The Mississippi Skill Standards Board is 10 created as an advisory board to the Governor, the Legislature and the state workforce development system on the development of a 11 statewide system of industry-defined, industry-recognized skill 12 standards and credentials for all major skilled occupations that: 13 Provide strong employment and earnings 14 (a) 15 opportunities in the state; and 16 (b) Are nationally recognized; and 17 (c) Require less than a baccalaureate degree. The board is composed of thirteen (13) members appointed 18 (2) by the Governor. The term of each board member shall run 19 concurrently with the term of the Governor. The board consists of 20 21 the following members: Eight (8) members representing business, two (2) of 22 (a) whom must be from business entities that employ fewer than fifty 23 24 (50) employees and one (1) each from the four-sector clusters as defined by the Mississippi Technology Alliance; 25 26 (b) Two (2) members representing workers; 27 One (1) member representing secondary education; (C) One (1) member representing two-year public 28 (d) 29 post-secondary education; and G1/2 H. 30 (e) One (1) member representing four-year public 31 post-secondary education.

32 (3) The Governor shall appoint the presiding officer of the33 board from the members representing business.

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(4) The Skill Standards Board shall:

35 (a) Validate nationally established skill standards to
 36 guide curriculum development, training, assessment and
 37 certification of workforce skills;

38 (b) Convene industry groups to develop skill standards
39 and certification procedures for industries and occupations in
40 which standards have not been established or adopted and recognize
41 the skill standards and certification procedures;

42 (c) Review standards developed by other states and
43 nations and enter into agreements for mutual recognition of
44 credentials to enhance portability of skills;

(d) Promote, in collaboration with the secondary and
post-secondary entities, the use of standards and credentials
among employers; and

48 (e) Develop a memorandum of understanding by and
49 between the workforce and education entities for the effective
50 development, implementation, operations and outcomes of the skills
51 standards effort.

52 (5) The board shall meet at the call of the presiding 53 officer as often as necessary to accomplish its work, and the 54 board shall meet a minimum of once each quarter in a fiscal year.

(6) A member of the board is not entitled to compensation for service on the board but is entitled to reimbursement for reasonable expenses incurred in performing board duties.

58 (7) The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall59 provide staff support for the board as necessary.

(8) The Skill Standards Board shall report periodically to
 61 the Governor and shall provide annual reports to the Governor, the
 62 Legislature and the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.
