HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 53

- A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE CITY OF HATTIESBURG, MISSISSIPPI,
- 2 ON THE OCCASION OF CELEBRATING ITS 125th ANNIVERSARY AS AN
- 3 INCORPORATED MUNICIPALITY IN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI SINCE ITS
- 4 FOUNDING IN 1882.
- 5 WHEREAS, the City of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, founded in
- 6 1882 by pioneer lumberman and civil engineer, Captain William H.
- 7 Hardy, originally called Twin Forks and later Gordonville, and
- 8 given its final name in honor of his wife, Hattie, celebrates the
- 9 125th anniversary of its founding this year in 2009; and
- 10 WHEREAS, incorporated in 1884, two years after its founding,
- 11 with a population of only 400 citizens, Hattiesburg's population
- 12 saw its first surge as a center of the lumber and railroad
- 13 industries when the Southern Railway System was built from
- 14 Meridian through Hattiesburg to New Orleans, and also upon the
- 15 completion of the Gulf and Ship Island Railroad from Gulfport to
- 16 Jackson, now part of the Illinois Central System; and
- WHEREAS, Hattiesburg gained its nickname, the "Hub City," in
- 18 1912, as a result of a contest in a local newspaper, premised on
- 19 the fact that the city was the intersection of a number of
- 20 important rail lines, and later also becoming the intersection of
- 21 state highways, U.S. Highway 49, U.S. Highway 98 and U.S. Highway
- 22 11, and later Interstate 59, being centrally located less than 100
- 23 miles from the state capital of Jackson as well as the Mississippi
- 24 Gulf Coast, Meridian, Natchez, New Orleans and Mobile, Alabama;
- 25 and
- 26 WHEREAS, throughout the 20th Century, Hattiesburg, situated
- 27 in both Forrest and Lamar Counties, benefited from the founding of

- 28 Camp Shelby, a national military mobilization training center; two
- 29 major hospitals, Forrest General Hospital and Wesley Medical
- 30 Center; and two colleges, the University of Southern Mississippi
- 31 and William Carey University; and
- 32 WHEREAS, having developed into a center for arts and cultural
- 33 development, the "Hub City" has a regional trade area comprised of
- 34 more than 300,000 and is one of the fastest growing areas of the
- 35 state, ranking third in sales tax revenue and as the fourth
- 36 largest city in the state with a population of nearly 50,000
- 37 persons; and
- 38 WHEREAS, the history of Hattiesburg recounts the prolific
- 39 struggles and triumphs of the city's African-American community,
- 40 as it was a pivotal point of activity during Freedom Summer in
- 41 1964 during the Civil Rights Movement; and
- WHEREAS, the city boasts a unique and profoundly rich history
- 43 complete with the marvels of war, religion, athletics, performing
- 44 arts and government, including being historically claimed as the
- 45 very heart of the birth of the blues as well as rock and roll in
- 46 Mississippi; and
- WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 48 recognize and commend the heritage and history of the state's
- 49 villages, towns, cities and counties, such as Hattiesburg,
- 50 Mississippi, whose abundance of riches have contributed to the
- 51 unique and valuable qualities that make the State of Mississippi
- 52 unquestionably the greatest state in the nation:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 54 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 55 commend the City of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, on the occasion of
- 56 celebrating its 125th anniversary as an incorporated municipality
- 57 in the State of Mississippi since its founding in 1882 and extend
- 58 heartiest wishes for continued success.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
furnished to the Mayor and City Council of Hattiesburg and to the
members of the Capitol Press Corps.
