## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 572

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS,
- 2 THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE MISSISSIPPI
- 3 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO SUPPORT FULL RESTORATION OF DAILY TRAIN
- 4 SERVICE ON THE MISSISSIPPI GULF COAST.
- 5 WHEREAS, Congress and President Bush approved legislation
- 6 calling for \$13.1 Billion in passenger-rail spending in the next
- 7 five years; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Amtrak's Sunset Limited could be on track for full
- 9 restoration of service in South Mississippi with this new law that
- 10 gives Amtrak \$1 Million to study reinstating the service, which
- 11 was cancelled after Hurricane Katrina; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the provision requires Amtrak to report to the U.S.
- 13 House and Senate Committees that oversee it in nine months and the
- 14 law stipulates that "the plan shall include a projected timeline
- 15 for restoring such service, the costs associated with restoring
- 16 such service, and any proposals for legislation necessary to
- 17 support such restoration of service"; and
- 18 WHEREAS, this law says that "in developing the plan, Amtrak
- 19 shall consult with representatives from the States of Louisiana,
- 20 Alabama, Mississippi and Florida, railroad carriers whose tracks
- 21 may be used for such service, rail passengers, rail labor and
- 22 other entities as appropriate"; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Amtrak will work through the Departments of
- 24 Transportation in Florida, Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana to
- 25 try to develop a rail plan and public meetings designed to get
- 26 feedback from potential riders would be coordinated through the
- 27 Mississippi Department of Transportation; and

- 28 WHEREAS, the key will be finding a way to offer a service
- 29 that attracts more riders and Amtrak wants to offer train service
- 30 that can keep to a schedule because the old Sunset Limited route
- 31 was habitually late and offering multiple trains from Orlando to
- 32 New Orleans might make it easier to keep the routes on time and
- 33 attract more ridership; and
- 34 WHEREAS, in areas with daily service, Amtrak trains and
- 35 infrastructure carry commuters to and from work in congested
- 36 metropolitan areas providing a reliable rail option, reducing
- 37 congestion on roads and in the skies; and
- 38 WHEREAS, for many Mississippi Gulf Coast residents, Amtrak
- 39 represents the only major intercity transportation link to the
- 40 rest of the country and without the Sunset Limited east of New
- 41 Orleans that link is broken; and
- WHEREAS, passenger rail provides a more fuel-efficient
- 43 transportation system, thereby providing cleaner transportation
- 44 alternatives and energy security; and
- WHEREAS, passenger railroads emit only 0.2% of the travel
- 46 industry's total greenhouse gases; and
- WHEREAS, according to figures from the Tourism Division of
- 48 the Mississippi Development Authority, 22 million tourists visited
- 49 Mississippi in 2007 and spent a total of \$5.7 Billion. Total tax
- 50 revenue from the tourism industry for 2007 was \$417 Million.
- 51 Tourism was responsible for more than 85,000 direct jobs with a
- 52 payroll of \$1.7 Billion, enough to make it Mississippi's sixth
- 53 largest employer; and
- 54 WHEREAS, our Bay St. Louis railroad station is a source of
- 55 civil pride, a gateway to our community and a tool for economic
- 56 growth; and
- 57 WHEREAS, daily passenger train service would be the next
- 58 logical step in the revitalization and reconstruction of the
- 59 Mississippi Gulf Coast:

60	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
61	MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
62	we hereby (a) recognize the contribution daily passenger train
63	service would make to the redevelopment of the Mississippi Gulf
64	Coast; (b) urge the United States Congress, the Executive Director
65	of the Department of Transportation and the Director of the
66	Division of Tourism of the Mississippi Development Authority to
67	support full restoration of service, daily of the Sunset Limited
68	on the Mississippi Gulf Coast; and (c) request that our
69	Mississippi congressional delegation in Washington, D.C., the
70	Mississippi Development Authority and the Mississippi Department
71	of Transportation keep the Mississippi Legislature fully informed
72	as to any and all developments by Amtrak regarding restoration of
73	the Sunset Limited to the Gulf Coast, rail studies, plans and
74	public meetings designed to get feedback from potential riders.
75	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be transmitted
76	to the Governor, the Executive Director of the Mississippi
77	Department of Transportation, the Director of the Mississippi
78	Development Authority and to members of Mississippi's
79	congressional delegation, and be made available to the Capitol
80	Press Corps.
