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256 SECTION 2. Section 41-29-313, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 257 amended as follows:

258 41-29-313. (1) (a) Except as authorized in this 259 section \* \* \*, it is unlawful for any person to knowingly or 260 intentionally:

261 (i) Purchase, possess, transfer, manufacture, 262 attempt to manufacture or distribute any two (2) or more of the 263 listed precursor chemicals or drugs in any amount with the intent to unlawfully manufacture a controlled substance; 264

265 (ii) Purchase, possess, transfer, manufacture, 266 attempt to manufacture or distribute any two (2) or more of the 267 listed precursor chemicals or drugs in any amount, knowing, or 268 under circumstances where one reasonably should know, that the 269 listed precursor chemical or drug will be used to unlawfully 270 manufacture a controlled substance;

The term "precursor drug or chemical" means a drug 271 (b) or chemical that, in addition to legitimate uses, may be used in 272 273 manufacturing a controlled substance in violation of this chapter. 274 The term includes any salt, optical isomer or salt of an optical 275 isomer, whenever the existence of a salt, optical isomer or salt 276 of optical isomer is possible within the specific chemical 277 designation. The chemicals or drugs listed in this section are included by whatever official, common, usual, chemical or trade 278 name designated. A "precursor drug or chemical" includes, but is 279 280 not limited to, the following:

281 (i) Ether; 282 (ii) Anhydrous ammonia; 283 (iii) Ammonium nitrate; 284 (iv) Pseudoephedrine; 285 (v) Ephedrine; 286 287 288

307 (c) Any person who violates this subsection (1), upon
308 conviction, is guilty of a felony and may be imprisoned for a
309 period not to exceed thirty (30) years and shall be fined not less
310 than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) nor more than One Million
311 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), or both fine and imprisonment.

(2) (a) It is unlawful for any person to knowingly or intentionally steal or unlawfully take or carry away any amount of anhydrous ammonia or to break, cut, or in any manner damage the valve or locking mechanism on an anhydrous ammonia tank with the intent to steal or unlawfully take or carry away anhydrous ammonia.

318 (b) (i) It is unlawful for any person to purchase,
319 possess, transfer or distribute any amount of anhydrous ammonia
320 knowing, or under circumstances where one reasonably should know,

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321 that the anhydrous ammonia will be used to unlawfully manufacture 322 a controlled substance.

(ii) The possession of any amount of anhydrous ammonia in a container unauthorized for containment of anhydrous ammonia pursuant to Section 75-57-9 shall be prima facie evidence of intent to use the anhydrous ammonia to unlawfully manufacture a controlled substance.

(c) (i) It is unlawful for any person to purchase, possess, transfer or distribute two hundred fifty (250) dosage units or fifteen (15) grams in weight (dosage unit and weight as defined in Section 41-29-139) of pseudoephedrine or ephedrine, knowing, or under circumstances where one reasonably should know, that the pseudoephedrine or ephedrine will be used to unlawfully manufacture a controlled substance.

335 (ii) Except as provided in this subparagraph, 336 possession of one or more products containing more than twenty-four (24) grams of ephedrine or pseudoephedrine shall 337 338 constitute a rebuttable presumption of intent to use the product 339 as a precursor to methamphetamine or another controlled substance. 340 The rebuttable presumption established by this subparagraph shall 341 not apply to the following persons who are lawfully possessing the 342 identified drug products in the course of legitimate business: 343 1. A retail distributor of the drug products described in this subparagraph possessing a valid business license 344 345 or wholesaler; 346 2. A wholesale drug distributor, or its 347 agents, licensed by the Mississippi State Board of Pharmacy; 348 3. A manufacturer of drug products described 349 in this subparagraph, or its agents, licensed by the Mississippi 350 State Board of Pharmacy; 4. A pharmacist licensed by the Mississippi 351

352 State Board of Pharmacy; or

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354 possessing the drug products described in this subparagraph (ii)
355 in the course of carrying out his profession.

(d) Any person who violates this subsection (2), upon conviction, is guilty of a felony and may be imprisoned for a period not to exceed five (5) years and shall be fined not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both fine and imprisonment.

361 (3) Nothing in this section shall preclude any farmer from
362 storing or using any of the listed precursor drugs or chemicals
363 listed in this section in the normal pursuit of farming
364 operations.

365 (4) Nothing in this section shall preclude any wholesaler,
 366 retailer or pharmacist from possessing or selling the listed
 367 precursor drugs or chemicals in the normal pursuit of business.

368 (5) Any person who violates the provisions of this section 369 with children under the age of eighteen (18) years present may be 370 subject to a term of imprisonment or a fine, or both, of twice 371 that provided in this section.

(6) Any person who violates the provisions of this section when the offense occurs in any hotel or apartment building or complex may be subject to a term of imprisonment or a fine, or both, of twice that provided in this section. For the purposes of this subsection (6), the following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them:

(a) "Hotel" means a hotel, inn, motel, tourist court,
apartment house, rooming house or any other place where sleeping
accommodations are furnished or offered for pay if four (4) or
more rooms are available for transient guests.

(b) "Apartment building" means any building having four
(4) or more dwelling units, including, without limitation, a
condominium building.

No. 512 10/HR40/R712PH PAGE 12 (CJR\BD) 385 (7) Any person who violates the provisions of this section 386 who has in his possession any firearm, either at the time of the 387 commission of the offense or at the time any arrest is made, may 388 be subject to a term of imprisonment or a fine, or both, of twice 389 that provided in this section.

(8) Any person who violates the provisions of this section 390 391 upon any premises upon which any booby trap has been installed or rigged may be subject to a term of imprisonment or a fine, or 392 393 both, of twice that provided in this section. For the purposes of 394 this subsection, the term "booby trap" means any concealed or 395 camouflaged device designed to cause bodily injury when triggered 396 by any action of a person making contact with the device. The 397 term includes guns, ammunition or explosive devices attached to 398 trip wires or other triggering mechanisms, sharpened stakes, nails, spikes, electrical devices, lines or wires with hooks 399 400 attached, and devices designed for the production of toxic fumes 401 or gases.

402 SECTION 3. Section 41-29-317, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 403 amended as follows:

404 41-29-317. (1) The Bureau of Narcotics may develop and 405 maintain a program to inform retailers about the methamphetamine 406 problem in the state and devise procedures and forms for retailers 407 to use in reporting to the Bureau of Narcotics suspicious 408 purchases, thefts or other transactions involving any products 409 under the retailer's control which contain a regulated precursor 410 under the provisions of Section 41-29-313 \* \* \*.

411 (2) Reporting by retailers as required by this section shall412 be voluntary.

(3) Retailers reporting information to the Bureau of Narcotics in good faith pursuant to this section shall be immune from civil and criminal liability for a violation of Section 416 41-29-313 \* \* \*.

420 **SECTION 5.** This act does not apply to wholesale drug 421 distributors licensed and regulated by the Mississippi Board of 422 Pharmacy and registered with and regulated by the United States 423 Drug Enforcement Administration and exempts them from storage, 424 reporting, record keeping or physical security control 425 requirements for controlled substances containing any material, 426 compound, mixture or preparation which contains any quantity of 427 ephedrine or pseudoephedrine.

428 **SECTION** <u>6.</u> This act shall take effect and be in force from 429 and after July 1, 2010.
