COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1079

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-137, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE OFFICE OF HEALTHY SCHOOLS OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE TRAINING ON CERTAIN FOOD SERVICE PRACTICES PROVIDED BY LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS; TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT TO DETERMINE THE TIME, LOCATION AND FREQUENCY WITH WHICH THE TRAININGS ARE HELD; TO REQUIRE CERTAIN DISTRICT PERSONNEL TO ATTEND THE TRAININGS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
9	SECTION 1. Section 37-13-137, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
10	amended as follows:
11	37-13-137. (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt
12	regulations as provided in this section not later than March 1,
13	2008, which shall be effective for compliance by school districts
14	beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, for the Child Nutrition
15	School Breakfast and Lunch Programs that are not in conflict with
16	the regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture
17	(USDA). The regulations shall take into account the most recent
18	and advanced scientific principles regarding good human health and
19	fitness, and the effect of the regulations must be that the good
20	health, well-being and fitness of Mississippi school children
21	shall be advanced. The regulations shall include, but not be
22	limited to, the following areas:
23	(a) Healthy food and beverage choices;
24	(b) Healthy food preparation;
25	(c) Marketing of healthy food choices to students and
26	staff;
27	(d) Food preparation ingredients and products;
28	(e) Minimum and maximum time allotment for students and

staff lunch and breakfast periods;

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30 The availability of food items during the lunch and 31 breakfast periods of the Child Nutrition School Breakfast and 32 Lunch Programs; and 33 Methods to increase participation in the Child 34 Nutrition School Breakfast and Lunch Programs. (2) 35 The Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of Education shall provide comprehensive training for 36 37 superintendents, business managers, food service directors and 38 food service managers of a local school district, or the designees appointed by those individuals for training purposes, as required 39 40 by the department on marketing healthy foods, creating a healthy cafeteria environment, effective and efficient food service 41 42 operations, the standards and expectations of food service staff, and other topics as identified by the department. The department 43 may determine the time and location of the trainings and the 44 frequency with which they are held. Persons employed by a local 45 school district having the certification as a Food Service 46 Administrator III or IV shall be exempt from the training 47 requirements of this subsection. 48 49 To assist the State Board of Education in developing the regulations required by this section, the State Superintendent of 50 51 Public Education shall appoint an advisory committee comprised of 52 the following members: one (1) representative of the Office of Child Nutrition in the State Department of Education; one (1) 53 54 member of the State Board of Education; one (1) licensed dietitian; one (1) licensed physician; one (1) local public school 55 superintendent; one (1) school food service director from each of 56 57 the four (4) congressional districts; one (1) principal of a local public elementary or middle school; one (1) principal of a local 58 59 public high school; the president of the Mississippi School 60 Nutrition Association or his designee; one (1) member of the 61 Senate, who shall serve in an advisory capacity only; and one (1) 62 member of the House of Representatives, who shall serve in an

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advisory capacity only. All members of the advisory committee
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    must be residents of the state and active practitioners in their
    respective fields. The State Superintendent shall appoint the
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    members of the advisory committee not later than April 30, 2007,
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    and shall designate the member who will be the chairman of the
    committee. The advisory committee shall hold its first meeting
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    not later than June 1, 2007, and shall meet at such other times as
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    necessary. The advisory committee shall make its recommendations
    to the State Board of Education on the regulations required by
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    this section not later than October 15, 2007.
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         To effectuate the purposes of this section, upon the request
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    of the chairman of the advisory committee, any department,
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    division, board, bureau, commission or agency of the state or of
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    any political subdivision of the state shall provide to the
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    committee such facilities, assistance and data that will enable
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    the committee to properly carry out its functions under this
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    section.
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         Members of the advisory committee who are not public
    employees who live in the Jackson, Mississippi, metropolitan area
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    or a member of the Legislature shall receive per diem at the rate
    authorized by Section 25-3-69 for attending meetings of the
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    committee, and shall be reimbursed in accordance with Section
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    25-3-41 for mileage and actual expenses incurred in the
    performance of their duties. The legislative members of the
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    committee shall be paid from the contingent expense fund of the
    house of which he or she is a member in the same manner as
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    provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is not in
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    session; however, no per diem or expense for attending meetings of
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    the committee may be paid while the Legislature is in session.

    unless previously authorized by vote, at a meeting of the
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    committee, which action must be recorded in the official minutes
                     Nonlegislative members will be paid from funds
