HOUSE BILL NO. 1079 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-137, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE OFFICE OF HEALTHY SCHOOLS OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE TRAINING ON CERTAIN FOOD SERVICE PRACTICES PROVIDED BY LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS; TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT TO DETERMINE THE TIME, LOCATION AND FREQUENCY WITH WHICH THE TRAININGS ARE HELD; TO REQUIRE CERTAIN DISTRICT PERSONNEL TO ATTEND THE TRAININGS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 37-13-137, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:

37-13-137. (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt 11 regulations as provided in this section not later than March 1, 12 2008, which shall be effective for compliance by school districts 13 beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, for the Child Nutrition 14 15 School Breakfast and Lunch Programs that are not in conflict with 16 the regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture 17 (USDA). The regulations shall take into account the most recent and advanced scientific principles regarding good human health and 18 fitness, and the effect of the regulations must be that the good 19 health, well-being and fitness of Mississippi school children 20 21 shall be advanced. The regulations shall include, but not be 22 limited to, the following areas:

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(a) Healthy food and beverage choices;

(e) Minimum and maximum time allotment for students and

No. 1079 10/HR03/R1710PH PAGE 1 (DJ\LH) 30 (f) The availability of food items during the lunch and breakfast periods of the Child Nutrition School Breakfast and 31 32 Lunch Programs; and 33 Methods to increase participation in the Child (q) 34 Nutrition School Breakfast and Lunch Programs. 35 (2) The Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of Education shall provide comprehensive training for 36 37 superintendents, business managers, food service directors and food service managers of a local school district, or the designees 38 appointed by those individuals for training purposes, as required 39 40 by the department on marketing healthy foods, creating a healthy cafeteria environment, effective and efficient food service 41 42 operations, the standards and expectations of food service staff, and other topics as identified by the department. The department 43 may determine the time and location of the trainings and the 44 frequency with which they are held. Persons employed by a local 45 school district having the certification as a Food Service 46 47 Administrator III or IV shall be exempt from the training requirements of this subsection. 48 49 * * * 50 Local school districts may adopt rules and regulations (3) 51 that may be more stringent but not in conflict with those adopted 52 by the State Board of Education under this section. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 53 54 and after July 1, 2010.
