18 WHEREAS, crediting the people of Tupelo for giving him the 19 opportunity, Mr. Bank calls volunteering an awesome privilege and 20 feels he is fortunate to help people in need; and

21 WHEREAS, moving from Jersey City, New Jersey, to Tueplo, Mr. 22 Bank served as the Chief Executive of Super Sagless for more than 23 40 years; and

24 WHEREAS, Mr. Bank's vocabulary does not include the word 25 "no," and due to his reputation of getting people to work together 26 for superior results for the good of the community, he is sought

28 WHEREAS, after his successful career with Super Sagless, Mr. 29 Bank could have easily retired, hitting the golf course or tennis 30 court, but this was not enough for him; and

31 WHEREAS, instead of relaxing after his retirement from Super 32 Sagless, Mr. Bank became the President and Chairman of the Board 33 of the Regional Rehabilitation Center in Tueplo; and

34 WHEREAS, Mr. Bank loves working at the Rehabilitation Center 35 with those who make him feel wanted and appreciated; and

36 WHEREAS, Mr. Bank has been at Regional Rehabilitation Center 37 for over four years where he recently spearheaded a successful \$2 38 million capital campaign to remodel the center; and

39 WHEREAS, the Regional Rehabilitation Center is the only 40 facility in Northeast Mississippi that provides comprehensive 41 services related to an early intervention program for infants and 42 toddlers at risk for developmental delay under one roof, 43 including services related to audiology, speech therapy, physical 44 therapy and occupational therapy; and

45 WHEREAS, beyond his service to the Regional Rehabilitation 46 Center, Mr. Bank has left his stamp on the Good Samaritan Free 47 Clinic, Itawamba Community College Foundation, Tupelo Artist 48 Guild, Cultural Alliance of Tupelo and Lee County, Sanctuary 49 Hospice House, North Mississippi Medical Center, Mississippi Arts 50 Commission and numerous other organizations; and

51 WHEREAS, those who know Mr. Bank best say that his 52 dedication to Tupelo is unmatched, and his quiet demeanor and 53 generous good will to all are obvious upon meeting him; and

54 WHEREAS, an Air Force veteran of the Korean War, Mr. Bank 55 earned degrees from Rider University in New Jersey and New York 56 University Graduate Business School, and completed the Advanced 57 Management Program at Harvard Business School; and

58 WHEREAS, as a guest lecturer, Mr. Bank not only gives his 59 time, but shares his experience with students at the University 60 of Mississippi Business School and Saltillo High School; and
