SENATE BILL NO. 2221

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-106-29 AND 37-106-31, MISSISSIPPI 1 2 CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE TUITION AMOUNTS AVAILABLE UNDER THE 3 MISSISSIPPI RESIDENT TUITION ASSISTANCE GRANT (M.T.A.G.) PROGRAM AND THE MISSISSIPPI EMINENT SCHOLARS GRANT PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE 4 THAT QUALIFIED STUDENTS WHO HAVE GRADUATED FROM A MISSISSIPPI 5 6 COMMUNITY/JUNIOR COLLEGE SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR A GRANT EOUAL TO 100% OF THE COST OF TUITION AND FEES FOR THE STUDENT'S JUNIOR YEAR 7 AT A MISSISSIPPI UNIVERSITY OR PRIVATE COLLEGE; TO CLARIFY THAT 8 9 STUDENTS COMPLETING ACCREDITED HOMESCHOOL PROGRAMS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR A MISSISSIPPI RESIDENT TUITION ASSISTANCE 10 GRANT OR A MISSISSIPPI EMINENT SCHOLARS GRANT; AND FOR RELATED 11 12 PURPOSES.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. Section 37-106-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

16 37-106-29. (1) There is established the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program for college or 17 18 university freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors to be administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial 19 Assistance Board established under Section 37-106-9, Mississippi 20 21 Code of 1972, which shall set the dates and deadlines for applying for an award under this section. The board shall establish such 22 23 rules and regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry out the purposes and intent of this section. 24

(2) The college or university shall approve grants to
full-time freshmen, sophomore, junior and senior Mississippi
residents who meet the general requirements for student
eligibility as provided in subsection (4) of this section.

(3) Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants shall be for Mississippi students from any Mississippi family whose prior year adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to

qualify for full Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal 32 33 aid. Those Mississippi students receiving less than the full Pell Grant award, as determined by the institution, shall receive a 34 35 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant in an amount not to 36 exceed the maximum Pell Grant allowable for that individual 37 student. The award shall be applied to tuition, rooms and meals, books, materials and fees not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars 38 39 (\$2,000.00) for junior and senior students attending state 40 institutions of higher learning in Mississippi or four-year regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit colleges and 41 42 universities in Mississippi, and One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for freshmen and sophomores attending state institutions of higher 43 44 learning or public community or junior colleges in Mississippi, or regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit two-year or 45 four-year colleges in Mississippi, which will be prorated per 46 term, semester or quarter of the academic year for costs of 47 attendance, calculated according to the formula specified in 48 49 subsection (8) of this section. Provided, however, that any 50 eligible student who has graduated from a public community or 51 junior college in Mississippi shall qualify for a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant equal to one hundred percent 52 53 (100%) of the cost of tuition, rooms, meals, books, materials and 54 fees at any Mississippi institution of higher learning listed below in (4)(d), to only be used for two (2) semesters of the 55 56 student's junior year attendance at such institution. No student may receive a grant in excess of the cost of tuition, rooms, 57 58 meals, books, materials and fees at the applicable college or 59 university. 60 The general requirements for initial eligibility of (4)

61 students for Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants 62 consist of the following:

Member of a Mississippi family whose prior year 63 (a) 64 adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to qualify for Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal aid. 65 66 Acceptance for enrollment at any state institution (b) 67 of higher learning or public community or junior college located 68 in Mississippi, or any regionally accredited, state-approved, 69 nonprofit four- or two-year college or university located in 70 Mississippi as listed in subsection (d) of this Section 37-106-29(4), within one (1) year of graduation from high school 71 72 or an accredited home education program with: (i) a minimum grade 73 point average of 2.5 calculated on a 4.0 scale after seven (7) 74 semesters certified by the high school counselor or other authorized school official on the application and graduation from 75 76 high school verified by the institution before disbursement of 77 award and has scored fifteen (15) on the American College Test Program (ACT); or (ii) has attended an accredited home education 78 79 program during grade levels 9 through 12, and has scored fifteen 80 (15) on the American College Testing Program; or (iii) satisfactory completion of the General Educational Development 81 82 Test (GED) or have successfully completed the International 83 Baccalaureate Program and has scored fifteen (15) on the American 84 College Testing Program; provided, however, that any student 85 entering a vocational or technical program of study, or who has satisfactorily completed the General Education Development Test 86 87 and attends a community or junior college will not be required to have a test score under the American College Testing Program 88 except those students enrolled in courses of academic study. Any 89 90 student currently enrolled in any qualified institution shall have 91 to only meet the same requirements as students who are applying for a renewal award. 92

93 (c) Resident status for purposes of receiving grants
94 under this section shall be determined in the same manner as
95 resident status for tuition purposes as set forth in Sections

96 37-103-1 through 37-103-29, with the exception of <u>Section</u> 97 37-103-17.

(d) Must attend one (1) of the following institutions 98 99 of higher learning within one (1) year of graduation from high 100 school or an accredited homeschool program: Alcorn State University, Delta State University, Jackson State University, 101 102 Mississippi State University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley State University, University of Mississippi, 103 104 University of Southern Mississippi, Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College, East Central Community College, 105 106 East Mississippi Community College, Hinds Community College, 107 Holmes Community College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College, Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta 108 109 Community College, Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, 110 Northeast Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi 111 Community College, Pearl River Community College, Southwest Mississippi Community College, Belhaven College, Blue Mountain 112 113 College, Millsaps College, Mississippi College, Rust College, Tougaloo College, William Carey College, Mary Holmes College, 114 115 Magnolia Bible College, Wood College and Wesley College.

116 By accepting a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance (5) 117 Grant, the student is attesting to the accuracy, completeness and 118 correctness of information provided to demonstrate the student's eligibility. Falsification of such information shall result in 119 120 the denial of any pending grant and revocation of any award 121 currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be 122 made. Any student knowingly making false statements in order to 123 receive a grant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable, upon 124 conviction thereof, by a fine of up to Ten Thousand Dollars 125 (\$10,000.00), a prison sentence of up to one (1) year in the county jail, or both, and shall be required to return all 126 127 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants wrongfully

128 obtained.

(6) Eligibility for renewal of Mississippi Resident Tuition
Assistance Grants shall be evaluated at the end of each semester,
or term, of each academic year. As a condition for renewal, a
student shall:

(a) Make steady academic progress toward a certificate
or degree, as outlined in the school Satisfactory Academic
Progress Standards and certified by the institution's registrar.

Maintain continuous enrollment for not less than 136 (b) 137 two (2) semesters or three (3) quarters in each successive academic year, unless granted an exception for cause by the 138 139 administering agency; examples of cause may include student 140 participation in a cooperative program, internship program or 141 foreign study program. If a student fails to maintain continuous 142 enrollment, and is not granted an exception for cause by the 143 administering agency, the student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following 144 semester or trimester or term of the regular academic year. 145

(c) Have a cumulative grade point average of at least
2.0 calculated on a 4.0 scale at the end of each semester or
trimester or term.

(7) Each student, each year, must complete a Free
Application for Federal Student Aid form or a Statement of
Certification as designed by the administering board to determine
his/her eligibility for a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance
Grant.

154 (8) The amount of the Mississippi Resident Tuition (a) 155 Assistance Grant awarded to any one (1) student, up to the maximum 156 amount provided in subsection (3) of this section, shall be the difference of the student's cost of attendance at his accredited 157 college of choice and the amount of federal aid such student may 158 159 receive, not to supplant but to supplement the amount of any 160 federal aid awarded to the student. Cost of attendance is the

161 tuition and fees of the applicable institution plus an allowance 162 for room and meals and books and materials.

(b) Payment of the Mississippi Resident Tuition
Assistance Grant shall be made payable to the recipient and the
educational institution and mailed directly to the institution, to
be applied first to tuition.

167 (c) Any college or university that receives Mississippi 168 Resident Tuition Assistance Grant funds shall include a statement 169 on the student's tuition/fee bill that these scholarship funds are 170 provided by the Mississippi Legislature.

171 (9) In order for an institution to remain eligible for its 172 students to participate in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 173 Assistance Grant Program, the institution shall comply with the 174 following requirements:

(a) A complete and accurate roster of the eligibility
status of each awarded student shall be made to the board for each
term, semester or quarter of the academic year the student
receives a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant.

179 The institution is required to make refunds to the (b) 180 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Fund for any funds 181 which have not been disbursed to the recipient, in the case of 182 students who have received a grant but who terminate enrollment 183 during the academic term, semester or quarter of the academic year if an institution's refund policies permit a student to receive a 184 185 refund in such instance. The recipient shall be responsible for the refund of any funds which have been disbursed by the 186 institution in such instance. 187

(c) If a student drops below full-time status but does
not terminate all enrollment during the term, semester or quarter
of the academic year no refund will be required for that term.
However, that student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi
Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following term,
semester or quarter of the regular academic year.

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194 The board may conduct its own annual audits of any (d) 195 institution participating in the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an 196 197 institution's eligibility to receive future monies under the 198 program if it finds that the institution has not complied with the 199 provisions of this section. In determining a student's initial 200 eligibility, the number of prior semesters enrolled will not be 201 counted against the student.

(10) No student may receive a Mississippi Resident Tuition
Assistance Grant for more than the equivalent semesters or
quarters required to complete one (1) baccalaureate degree or one
(1) certificate or associate degree program per institution.

(11) Subject to the availability of funds specifically
appropriated therefor, it is the intent of the Legislature to
fully fund grant awards to eligible students. If funds are
insufficient to fully fund grant awards to eligible students,
grant awards shall be prorated among all eligible students. No
student shall receive any combination of student financial aid in
excess of the cost of attendance as defined in subsection (8)(a).

213 (12) No student receiving a Mississippi Eminent Scholars 214 Grant as provided in Section 37-106-31 shall be eligible to receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant pursuant 215 to Section 37-106-29 unless he is eligible for such award after 216 the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant has been considered by the 217 218 board when conducting an assessment of the financial resources 219 available to the student. In no case shall any student receive any combination of student financial aid that would exceed the 220 221 cost of attendance, as defined in subsection (8)(a).

For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean, but not be limited to, all postsecondary vocational programs in eligible institutions as identified in subsection (4)(d) of this section.

226 SECTION 2. Section 37-106-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 227 amended as follows:

228 37-106-31. (1) There is created a Mississippi Eminent 229 Scholars Fund, to be administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary 230 Education Financial Assistance Board established under Section 231 37-106-9. The board shall set the date that will serve as the 232 deadline for applying for an award under this section and award 233 scholarships to each Mississippi student who:

234 (i) Is recognized by the merit or achievement (a) programs of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation or the 235 236 National Achievement Scholarship as a semifinalist or finalist, 237 and has obtained a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 238 calculated on a 4.0 scale in high school subjects acceptable for 239 credit toward a diploma, after seven (7) semesters certified by 240 the high school counselor or other authorized school official on 241 the application and graduation from high school verified by the institution before disbursement of award; or 242

243 (ii) Has scored twenty-nine (29) on the American 244 College Testing Program or its equivalent and has obtained a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 calculated on a 4.0 245 246 scale after seven (7) semesters certified by the high school 247 counselor or other authorized school official on the application and graduation from high school verified by the institution before 248 disbursement of award, or the equivalent in high school subjects 249 250 acceptable for credit toward a diploma; or

(iii) Has attended <u>an accredited</u> home education program during grade levels 9 through 12 and has scored twenty-nine (29) on the American College Testing Program or its equivalent; and

(iv) Has been certified by the college or
university to the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial
Assistance Board as a Mississippi Eminent Scholar.

(b) Meets the general requirements for studenteligibility, except as otherwise provided in this section.

(c) Dependents of Mississippi residents who are on military or public service assignments away from Mississippi when such dependents live with such Mississippi residents and receive high school diplomas from non-Mississippi schools shall be exempted.

(d) Files, before the deadline, an application for an
award during his last year in high school, or before the
expiration of the third school year succeeding the year of his
high school graduation.

(e) Attends, on a full-time basis, any state
institution of higher learning or public community or junior
college, or any regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit
four- or two-year college or university located in the State of
Mississippi as listed in subsection (4) (d) of Section 37-106-29.

(f) Enrolls for the first time as a college student in Mississippi. Any student who earns postsecondary academic credit prior to or during the summer immediately subsequent to receiving a high school diploma, who is dually enrolled in secondary and postsecondary educational institutions, or who is enrolled in the early admission program of a postsecondary institution shall be exempt from this requirement.

(g) Is a resident of the State of Mississippi.
Residency status for purposes of receiving grants under this
section shall be determined in the same manner as resident status
for tuition purposes as set forth in Sections 37-103-1 through
37-103-29, with the exception of Section 37-103-17.

(2) (a) Students who apply for awards but do not accept
their initial awards may reapply to receive awards during
subsequent application periods occurring before the expiration of
the third school year succeeding the year of their high school
graduation. Similarly, students who receive initial awards and

who later do not accept renewal awards may reapply to receive 291 292 awards during subsequent application periods occurring before the expiration of the third school year succeeding the year of their 293 294 high school graduation. The institution shall accept 295 reinstatement applications according to dates set by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board and 296 297 shall determine the eligibility of such applicants in the same manner as first-time applicants, except that students who apply 298 pursuant to this paragraph shall be required to have maintained 299 the equivalent of a 3.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 300 301 scale for all college work attempted. The board shall not make 302 awards to reinstatement applicants who submit applications that 303 are received after the deadline set by the Mississippi 304 Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board.

305 (b) The board shall create a renewal application for 306 each student who received the award for one or more terms during 307 the immediately preceding academic year.

308 (3) (a) The annual award to a student shall be up to Three 309 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00) for tuition, fees, 310 rooms, meals, books and materials. Provided, however, that any 311 eligible recipient who graduates from a community or junior 312 college in Mississippi shall qualify for a Mississippi Eminent 313 Scholars Grant equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of tuition, fees, rooms, meals, books and materials at a Mississippi 314 315 institution of higher learning listed in Section 37-106-29(4)(d), 316 to only be used for two (2) semesters of the recipient's junior 317 year attendance at such institution. No recipient may receive a 318 grant in excess of the cost of tuition, rooms, meals, books, 319 materials and fees at the applicable college or university. 320 Payment of the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant shall be made payable to the recipient and the educational institution and 321 322 mailed directly to the institution, to be applied first to 323 tuition. Any college or university that receives Eminent Scholars S. B. No. 2221

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324 Grant funds shall include a statement on the student's tuition/fee

325 bill stating that these scholarship funds are provided by the

326 <u>Mississippi Legislature.</u>

Within six (6) weeks of the end of regular 327 (b) 328 registration, inclusive of a drop-add period, institutions shall certify to the board the eligibility status of each awarded 329 330 student. The eligibility status of each student to receive a disbursement shall be determined by each institution as of this 331 332 date. Institutions shall not be required to reevaluate a student's eligibility status after this date for purposes of 333 334 amending eligibility determinations previously made. However, an 335 institution shall be requested to make refunds for students who 336 receive award disbursements and terminate enrollment for any 337 reason during the academic term when an institution's refund 338 policies permit a student to receive a refund under the 339 circumstances.

340 (c) Institutions shall certify to the board the amount 341 of funds disbursed to each student and shall remit to the board 342 any undisbursed advances within sixty (60) days of the end of 343 regular registration.

344 (4) A recipient shall maintain the equivalent of a 3.5 345 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale, or shall maintain 346 an approved equivalent student progress evaluation plan, on at least twelve (12) hours per quarter, trimester or semester in 347 348 order to be eligible for a continuation of the award. No student 349 may receive a Mississippi Eminent Scholars Fund award for more 350 than the equivalent semesters or quarters required to complete one 351 (1) degree or certificate program per institution. The award may 352 be renewed annually upon certification of eligibility by the 353 eligible institutions that the recipient meets the necessary qualifications. If any recipient transfers from one university, 354 355 community college or junior college to another, his award will be 356 transferable, provided he is otherwise eligible for the award. Ιf

357 a student fails to maintain continuous enrollment, and is not 358 granted an exception for cause by the administering agency, the 359 student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi Eminent Scholars 360 Grant during the following semester or trimester or term of the 361 regular academic year.

(5) The board may conduct its own annual audits of any
institution participating in the Mississippi Eminent Scholars
Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an institution's
eligibility to receive future monies under the program if it finds
that the institution has not complied with the provisions of this
section.

368 (6) For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean,
369 but not be limited to, all postsecondary vocational programs in
370 eligible institutions as identified in subsection (4)(d) of
371 Section 37-106-29.

372 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 373 and after July 1, 2010.
