HOUSE BILL NO. 387

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-103-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE ELIGIBILITY FOR IN-STATE TUITION FOR CERTAIN STUDENTS 3 WITHOUT DOCUMENTED IMMIGRATION STATUS AND PERSONS HOLDING A STUDENT OR OTHER TEMPORARY VISA TO ATTEND STATE-SUPPORTED INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AND COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES; 5 6 TO REOUIRE THOSE PERSONS TO MEET CERTAIN CRITERIA BEFORE BECOMING 7 ELIGIBLE FOR IN-STATE TUITION; TO PROVIDE THAT THIS ACT SHALL NOT 8 BE CONSTRUED AS CONFERRING DOMICILIARY STATUS ON THOSE PERSONS OR 9 AS THE PROCEDURE BY WHICH THOSE PERSONS MAY ESTABLISH DOMICILE; TO PROVIDE THAT STUDENTS PROVIDED ELIGIBILITY UNDER THIS ACT FOR 10 IN-STATE TUITION SHALL BE ENTITLED TO THE SAME RIGHTS AND BENEFITS 11 12 AS OTHER ELIGIBLE STUDENTS; TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-103-7 AND

- 37-103-23, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY WITH THE 13
- PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14
- 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 37-103-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 16
- 17 amended as follows:
- 37-103-25. (1) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions 18
- 19 of Higher Learning and the boards of trustees of the community
- 20 colleges and junior colleges are authorized to prescribe the
- amount of tuition and fees to be paid by students attending the 21
- 22 several state-supported institutions of higher learning and
- 23 community * * * and junior colleges of the State of Mississippi.
- 24 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the
- total tuition to be paid by residents of other states shall not be 25
- 26 less than the average cost per student from appropriated funds.
- 27 However, the tuition to be paid by a resident of another state
- shall be equal to the tuition amount established under subsection 28
- 29 (1) of this section if:
- 30 (a) The nonresident student was born in the State of
- 31 Mississippi but subsequently relocated and resided outside the

- 34 (b) The nonresident student is a veteran who served in
- 35 the Armed Forces of the United States;
- 36 (c) The nonresident student is domiciled in Mississippi
- 37 no later than six (6) months after the nonresident student's
- 38 separation from service, as evidenced by a Report of Separation
- 39 from Military Service or other military discharge document, for
- 40 the purpose of enrolling in a state institution of higher learning
- 41 or a community or junior college; or
- 42 (d) The nonresident student is an evacuee of an area
- 43 affected by Hurricane Katrina or Hurricane Rita. This waiver
- 44 shall be applicable to the 2005-2006 school year only.
- 45 (3) Any student without documented immigration status or who
- 46 holds a student or other temporary visa may establish eligibility
- 47 to pay tuition equal to the amount established under subsection
- 48 (1) of this section by a showing of clear and convincing evidence
- 49 that he or she:
- 50 (a) Has resided in the state for a continuous period of
- 51 not less than five (5) years;
- 52 (b) Has received a high school diploma from a public or
- 53 private school in the state or has received a General Educational
- 54 <u>Development (GED) certificate in Mississippi;</u>
- (c) Is enrolled as a student in a state institution of
- 56 higher learning or a community or junior college;
- 57 (d) Has submitted evidence that he or she, or in the
- 58 case of being a dependent student that at least one (1) parent,
- 59 guardian or person standing in loco parentis, has filed, unless
- 60 exempted by state law, Mississippi state income taxes for one (1)
- or more years before the date of enrollment; and
- (e) (i) Has filed an affidavit with the state
- 63 institution of higher learning or a community or junior college in

- 64 which he or she is enrolled affirming that he or she is not
- 65 currently in removal proceedings; and
- 66 (ii) Has affirmed to the state institution of
- 67 higher learning or a community or junior college that he or she
- 68 will file a petition to become a permanent resident of the United
- 69 States with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services
- 70 within ninety (90) days of the date in which he or she becomes
- 71 eligible to seek permanent residency.
- 72 The provisions of this subsection shall not be construed as
- 73 conferring domiciliary status on those persons or as the procedure
- 74 by which those persons may establish domicile for the purpose of
- 75 <u>obtaining eligibility for in-state tuition.</u>
- 76 (4) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, persons
- 77 who meet the requirements for in-state tuition under subsections
- 78 (2) or (3) of this section shall be entitled to the same rights
- 79 and benefits as other eligible students, including eligibility for
- 80 state financial aid.
- SECTION 2. Section 37-103-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 82 amended as follows:
- 83 37-103-7. For purposes of determining whether a person pays
- 84 out-of-state or in-state tuition for attendance at universities
- 85 and community and junior colleges, the residence of a person less
- 86 than twenty-one (21) years of age is that of the father, the
- 87 mother or a general guardian duly appointed by a proper court in
- 88 Mississippi. If a court has granted custody of the minor to one
- 89 (1) parent, the residence of the minor is that of the parent who
- 90 was granted custody by the court. If both parents are dead, the
- 91 residence of the minor is that of the last surviving parent at the
- 92 time of that parent's death, unless the minor lives with a general
- 93 guardian duly appointed by a proper court of Mississippi, in which
- 94 case his residence becomes that of the guardian. A student
- 95 residing within the State of Mississippi who, upon registration at
- 96 a Mississippi institution of higher learning or community college,

- 97 presents a transcript demonstrating graduation from a Mississippi
- 98 secondary school and who has been a secondary school student in
- 99 Mississippi for not less than the final four (4) years of
- 100 secondary school attendance shall not be required to pay
- 101 out-of-state tuition. A student granted an exception under and
- 102 meeting the requirements of Section 37-103-25 shall not be
- 103 required to pay out-of-state tuition. This section shall not
- 104 apply to the residence of a person as it relates to residency for
- 105 voter registration or voting.
- 106 **SECTION 3.** Section 37-103-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 107 amended as follows:
- 108 37-103-23. Except as otherwise provided in Section
- 109 37-103-25(3), all aliens are classified as nonresidents for
- 110 purposes of determining tuition rates for attending the several
- 111 state-supported institutions of higher learning and community and
- 112 junior colleges of the State of Mississippi.
- 113 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 114 and after July 1, 2011.
