HOUSE BILL NO. 533 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 41-109-1 THROUGH 41-109-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE LEONARD MORRIS CHRONIC 3 KIDNEY DISEASE LEADERSHIP TASK FORCE AND PRESCRIBE ITS DUTIES; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTIONS 41-109-1 THROUGH 41-109-5, MISSISSIPPI 5 CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY THE NAME OF THE TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE 6 THAT TASK FORCE MEMBERS SHALL NOT BE ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT OF 7 EXPENSES OR TO COMPENSATION; TO AMEND SECTION 41-109-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE DATE OF REPEAL ON THOSE 8 REENACTED SECTIONS, FROM JULY 1, 2011, TO JULY 1, 2014; AND FOR 9 RELATED PURPOSES. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

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- 12 SECTION 1. Section 41-109-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- reenacted and amended as follows: 13
- 41-109-1. It is generally recognized that a significant 14
- number of the population of the State of Mississippi has a form of 15
- chronic kidney disease (CKD), including persons with seriously 16
- 17 reduced kidney function that may progress to end-stage renal
- disease (ESRD) requiring kidney dialysis or the receipt of a 18
- 19 kidney transplant. ESRD is usually the result of years of CKD
- caused by diabetes, high blood pressure or a family history of CKD 20
- as the primary contributing factors. Recognizing that the 21
- 22 treatment of CKD is a tremendous expense and that the early
- diagnosis and effective treatment of CKD can prolong lives and 23
- 24 delay the high cost of medical treatment, including dialysis
- and/or transplantation, and that there are existing, 25
- 26 cost-effective laboratory test calculations that can assist in the
- 27 early diagnosis of CKD, there is created the Leonard Morris
- Chronic Kidney Disease Leadership Task Force. 28
- SECTION 2. Section 41-109-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 29
- reenacted and amended as follows: 30

- 31 41-109-3. (1) The members of the Leonard Morris Chronic
- 32 Kidney Disease Leadership Task Force shall be appointed by the
- 33 Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Lieutenant Governor
- 34 and the State Health Officer as follows:
- 35 (a) The Speaker and the Lieutenant Governor each shall
- 36 appoint three (3) physicians from lists submitted by the
- 37 Mississippi State Medical Association and the Mississippi Medical
- 38 and Surgical Association, two (2) of whom shall be family
- 39 practitioners, two (2) of whom shall be nephrologists and two (2)
- 40 of whom shall be pathologists.
- 41 (b) The Speaker shall appoint one (1) member who
- 42 represents the state affiliate of the National Kidney Foundation
- 43 and one (1) member who represents the Department of Nephrology at
- 44 the University of Mississippi Medical Center.
- 45 (c) The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint one (1)
- 46 member who represents owners/operators of clinical laboratories in
- 47 the state and one (1) member who represents a private renal care
- 48 provider.
- (d) The State Health Officer shall appoint one (1)
- 50 member who is a dietitian licensed by the State of Mississippi.
- 51 (2) The State Health Officer or his designee shall serve as
- 52 chairperson of the task force.
- 53 (3) The State Department of Health shall provide meeting
- 54 facilities for the task force.
- 55 (4) The members of the task force shall not be entitled to
- 56 reimbursement of expenses or to compensation for service on the
- 57 <u>task force.</u>
- SECTION 3. Section 41-109-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 59 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 60 41-109-5. The Leonard Morris Chronic Kidney Disease
- 61 Leadership Task Force shall:
- 62 * * *

63	(a) Develop a plan to educate health care professionals
64	about the advantages and methods of early screening, diagnosis and
65	treatment of chronic kidney disease and its complications based on
66	the K/DOQI Clinical Practice Guidelines for Chronic Kidney Disease
67	or other medically recognized clinical practice guidelines and
68	develop a plan to educate health care professionals about the
69	advantages of end-stage renal disease (ESRD) modality education;
70	(b) Make recommendations on the implementation of a
71	cost-effective plan for that early screening, diagnosis and
72	treatment of chronic kidney disease for the state's population;
73	and
74	(c) Issue a report to the membership of the House
75	Public Health and Human Services Committee and the Senate Public
76	Health and Welfare Committee before each regular session of the
77	Mississippi Legislature.
78	SECTION 4. Section 41-109-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
79	amended as follows:
80	41-109-7. This chapter shall stand repealed on July 1, 2014 .
81	SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from
82	and after July 1, 2011.
