COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1125

1 2 3 4	AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI AUTISM ADVISORY COMMITTEE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP AND TERMS OF MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE; TO SET FORTH THE DUTIES OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	WHEREAS, autism is a complex developmental disability that
6	typically appears during the first three (3) years of life and is
7	part of a group of disorders known as Autism Spectrum Disorders
8	(ASD); and
9	WHEREAS, as of the effective date of this act, at least one
10	(1) in one hundred (100) individuals in the United States is
11	diagnosed with autism, making it more common than the occurrences
12	in our population of pediatric cancer, diabetes and AIDS combined;
13	and
14	WHEREAS, autism impairs a person's ability to communicate and
15	relate to others; is associated with rigid routines and repetitive
16	behaviors, such as obsessively arranging objects or following very
17	specific routines; is four (4) times more likely to strike boys
18	than girls; and occurs in all racial, ethnic and social groups;
19	and
20	WHEREAS, symptoms of the disability can range from very mild
21	to quite severe, and autistic behaviors not only make life
22	difficult for those individuals who suffer from the disability,
23	but also make life hard for their families, health care providers
24	and teachers; and
25	WHEREAS, families coping with this devastating illness are

adequately educate and treat their children; and

struggling with the state's education and medical systems to

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- WHEREAS, there is no known means to prevent the disability;
- 29 there are indications that early intervention in an appropriate
- 30 educational setting for at least two (2) years during the
- 31 preschool years can result in significant improvements for many
- 32 young children with the disorder; and
- 33 WHEREAS, statistically, there is an extreme under
- 34 identification of children with autism; and
- 35 WHEREAS, employment opportunities for individuals with ASD
- 36 need to be identified; and
- 37 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature recognizes that
- 38 strategies for how to best identify, treat, educate, accommodate
- 39 and employ individuals with autism and assist their families are
- 40 urgently needed in our state; NOW, THEREFORE,
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 42 **SECTION 1.** The Mississippi Autism Advisory Committee is
- 43 created to study, make recommendations and develop a strategic
- 44 plan on how best to educate and train students with autism or ASD
- 45 to maximize their potential productivity with the workforce. The
- 46 committee shall meet at least six (6) times annually, and shall
- 47 develop an annual plan. The report and plan of the committee,
- 48 which shall be due annually on July 1, 2011, to the Mississippi
- 49 Legislature, shall detail the progress and problems in creating
- 50 meaningful progress in the areas of mental health, education,
- 51 medical and employment for individuals with autism or ASD and
- 52 their families.
- 53 **SECTION 2.** Members of the advisory committee shall be
- 54 composed of the following:
- 55 (a) Five (5) persons who are the parents of children
- 56 with autism or ASD, with one (1) such person to be appointed by
- 57 the Governor, two (2) to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor,
- and two (2) to be appointed by the Speaker of the House;

- 59 (b) One (1) person who is a member of the governing
- 60 body of a school district, to be appointed by the State
- 61 Superintendent of Public Education;
- 62 (c) The State Superintendent of Public Education or the
- 63 Associate Superintendent of the Office of Special Education;
- (d) One (1) person who is the director of special
- 65 education services in a school district, to be appointed by the
- 66 State Superintendent of Public Education;
- 67 (e) Two (2) members of the Mississippi Special
- 68 Education Advisory Committee, to be selected by the committee;
- (f) Two (2) educators or behavioral specialists who
- 70 work directly with students with ASD, to be appointed by the State
- 71 Superintendent of Public Education;
- 72 (g) Two (2) Mississippi licensed psychologists who
- 73 perform evaluation or consultation with Mississippi schools, to be
- 74 appointed by the Mississippi Association of Psychology in the
- 75 Schools;
- 76 (h) The project director of the Mississippi Parent
- 77 Training and Information Center;
- 78 (i) Two (2) persons who are representatives of autism
- 79 advocacy groups or professionals who work with the advocacy groups
- 80 and provide services to individuals with autism or ASD, to be
- 81 appointed by the Executive Director of the Department of Mental
- 82 Health;
- (j) One (1) person who is a representative of the State
- 84 Department of Mental Health, to be appointed by the executive
- 85 director of the department;
- 86 (k) One (1) person who is a representative of a private
- 87 mental health facility who provides services to youth with ASD, to
- 88 be appointed by the Executive Director of the State Department of
- 89 Mental Health;
- 90 (1) One (1) person who is a representative of the

91 University of Mississippi Medical Center and who provides medical

- 92 or other services to individuals with autism or ASD, to be
- 93 appointed by the Vice Chancellor of the University of Mississippi
- 94 Medical Center;
- 95 (m) Two (2) persons who are working in private industry
- 96 whose business has the potential to employ individuals with
- 97 autism, to be appointed by the Governor;
- 98 (n) One (1) person who is a Transition Specialist, to
- 99 be appointed by the State Superintendent of Public Education;
- 100 (o) One (1) representative of the T.K. Martin Center,
- 101 to be appointed by the Director of the T.K. Martin Center;
- 102 (p) One (1) representative of the Mississippi
- 103 Department of Rehabilitation Services;
- 104 (q) Two (2) persons who are licensed therapists, to be
- 105 appointed by the President of the Mississippi Speech Language and
- 106 Hearing Association;
- 107 (r) One (1) person who is a representative of the
- 108 Mississippi Department of Insurance, to be appointed by the
- 109 commissioner; and
- (s) One (1) person who is a representative of the
- 111 Mississippi Department of Human Services, to be appointed by the
- 112 director of the department.
- 113 **SECTION 3.** (1) The advisory committee shall:
- 114 (a) Review the recommendations of the Caring for
- 115 Individuals with Autism Task Force of 2007;
- 116 (b) Evaluate, study and identify any and all current
- 117 relevant information and make legislative recommendations
- 118 regarding the development and implementation of a continuum of
- 119 educational and medical services for individuals with autism or
- 120 ASD; and
- 121 (c) File a report with those standing committees of the
- 122 Mississippi Legislature and present the report to those state

- 123 agencies having jurisdiction over specific recommendations of the
- 124 task force, not later than July 1 of each year.

125	(2) The advisory committee shall hold its first meeting not
126	later than April 1, 2011, with the date, time and location of the
127	meeting to be designated by the Executive Director of the
128	Department of Mental Health. At that first meeting, the advisory
129	committee shall elect from among its membership a chairman, vice
130	chairman and any other officers determined to be necessary, and

- 131 shall set the date, time and location of its next meeting.
- 132 (3) The terms of advisory committee members shall run for 133 two (2) years, concurrent with the term of members of the 134 Mississippi Congressional Delegation elected to the United States
- 136 (4) The State Department of Mental Health shall provide the 137 staff and other support necessary for the Mississippi Autism 138 Advisory Committee to perform its duties.
- 139 (5) Members of the advisory committee shall serve without 140 compensation in the form of a per diem or any other expense for 141 service on the committee.
- SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
