HOUSE BILL NO. 1177 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO CREATE THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE AND PARAPROFESSIONAL EDUCATION AND MENTAL HEALTH STUDY COMMITTEE TO STUDY AND MAKE ANNUAL RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE LEGISLATURE REGARDING THE NEED FOR ASSISTANCE IN SHAPING 5 PUBLIC POLICY TO IMPROVE STUDENT OUTCOMES AND EDUCATIONAL 6 OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS WITH SERIOUS EMOTIONAL, BEHAVIORAL DISORDERS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE TASK FORCE; TO SET 7 FORTH THE DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE; TO AMEND SECTION 1, CHAPTER 8 484, LAWS OF 2010, TO REVISE THE COMPOSITION OF THE TASK FORCE TO 9 STUDY STRATEGIES FOR SOLVING THE CURRENT TEACHER SHORTAGE IN 10 MISSISSIPPI AND TO EXTEND THE DATE OF ITS DISSOLUTION UNTIL THE 11 FILING OF ITS LEGISLATIVE REPORT IN 2013; TO SET FORTH THE DUTIES 12 OF THE STUDY COMMITTEE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 13 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** (1) There is created the Joint Legislative and

- Paraprofessional Education and Mental Health Study Committee to 16
- study and make annual recommendations to the Mississippi 17
- Legislature and to assist in shaping public policy to improve 18
- 19 student outcomes and educational opportunities for students with
- 20 serious emotional, behavioral disorders in regular and special
- education in the State of Mississippi. The study group shall be 21
- 22 composed of the following members:
- 23 (a) One (1) person who is a member of the governing
- body of a school district, to be appointed by the State 24
- 25 Superintendent of Public Education;
- (b) One (1) person who is a representative of the State 26
- 27 Department of Education, to be appointed by the State
- 28 Superintendent of Public Education (no designee);
- 29 (c) One (1) person who is the Director of Special
- 30 Education services in a school district, to be appointed
- 31 by the State Superintendent of Public Education;

- 32 (d) One (1) person who is a representative of the State
- 33 Department of Mental Health, to be appointed by the executive
- 34 director of the department;
- 35 (e) One (1) regular education teacher to be appointed
- 36 by the State Superintendent of Public Education;
- 37 (f) One (1) special education teacher to be appointed
- 38 by the State Superintendent of Public Education;
- 39 (g) The Executive Director of Mississippi Families as
- 40 Allies for Children's Mental Health;
- 41 (h) One (1) person each who is a representative of
- 42 Parent and Training Institute, Mississippi Disability Rights,
- 43 Southern Echo, Mississippi Center for Justice and National
- 44 Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), to be appointed by the
- 45 executive directors of each respective organization;
- 46 (i) One (1) person who is a representative of the
- 47 Department of Rehabilitation Services appointed by the
- 48 executive director of the department;
- (j) One (1) person who is a representative of the
- 50 Department of Human Services appointed by the executive director
- 51 of the department;
- 52 (k) One (1) person who is a representative of a local
- 53 school district Positive Behavioral Intervention Support (PBIS)
- 54 model to be appointed by the State Superintendent of Public
- 55 Education;
- (1) One (1) person who is an employee-representative of
- 57 the Mississippi Association of Community Mental Health Centers to
- 58 be appointed by the Governor;
- 59 (m) One (1) person who is a nonemployee representative
- of the Mississippi Association of Community Mental Health Centers
- 61 to be appointed by the Governor;
- 62 (n) The Chairman of the House Public Health and Human

- 63 Services Committee and the Chairman of the Senate Public Health
- 64 and Welfare Committee, who will be cochairmen of the joint study
- 65 committee; and
- (o) The Chairmen of the House and Senate Education
- 67 Committees, who will be cochairmen of the joint study committee.
- 68 (2) Members of the study group shall work together to insure
- 69 that family members are representative of the regions of the state
- 70 and the various types of relevant issues in both special education
- 71 and regular education specific issues.
- 72 (3) The study committee is tasked with the following
- 73 responsibilities:
- 74 (a) Collecting and analyzing data on out-of-school
- 75 suspensions;
- 76 (b) Collecting and analyzing data on alternative school
- 77 placement;
- 78 (c) Collecting and analyzing data on the use of
- 79 corporal punishment;
- 80 (d) Reviewing the use of Medicaid payments for mental
- 81 health services in schools;
- 82 (e) Establishing a clear defined process for requesting
- 83 mental health services;
- 84 (f) Reviewing mental health training provided for
- 85 school personnel, beyond classroom management, interventions and
- 86 preventions;
- 87 (g) Promoting professional development training on
- 88 disabilities and specific disorders; and
- (h) Evaluating why dropout rates for children and youth
- 90 with mental health issues are higher than the average rate.
- 91 (4) Appointments to the task force shall be made within
- 92 thirty (30) days after the effective date of this act. The task
- 93 force shall hold its first meeting not later than August 15, 2011,
- 94 with the date, time and location of the meeting to be designated
- 95 by the Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health.

96	(5) Members of the task force shall serve without
97	compensation for their services, but may be reimbursed for
98	necessary expense in attending to the actual business of the task
99	force from any available funds, as provided by law. Legislative
100	members shall be reimbursed from the contingent expense fund of
101	their respective house, but only with the specific approval of the
102	Rules Committee of the respective house. The task force, by
103	approval of a majority of its membership, may accept funds that
104	may be donated or provided in the form of grants from public or
105	private sources.

- 106 (6) Any department, agency or court of this state, at the
 107 request of the chairman of the task force, shall provide staff and
 108 other support necessary for the task force to perform its duties.
- 109 (7) The study committee shall report to the Governor and the
 110 Legislature by not later than January 1, 2013, at which time the
 111 study committee shall be dissolved.
- SECTION 2. Section 1 of Chapter 484, Laws of 2010, is amended as follows:
- Section 1. (1) The Task Force to Study Strategies for

 Solving the Current Teacher Shortage in Mississippi is created to

 study and make recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature

 regarding teacher attrition, retention and growth in our state.

- 120 (a) Teacher salaries;
- 121 (b) Future educators;
- 122 (c) Working conditions of educators;
- 123 (d) Relevant professional development for educators;
- 124 (e) Adequate and equitable resources and support for
- 125 educators;
- 126 (f) Safety and respect in the schools;
- 127 (g) Parental and community involvement in the schools;

128 (h) The teacher salary scale under the Missis	sippi
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- 129 Adequate Education Program;
- (i) Step increases and annual increments under the
- 131 teacher salary scale;
- 132 (j) Merit pay for teachers;
- 133 (k) Teacher pay for failing schools;
- (1) Local supplements to teacher salaries;
- 135 (m) Nonadequate education program funded teachers; and
- 136 (n) Adequate and equitable resources and support for
- 137 teacher salaries.
- 138 (2) Members of the task force shall be composed of the
- 139 following:
- 140 (a) The State Superintendent of Public Education, or
- 141 his designee;
- (b) One (1) person appointed by the Governor;
- 143 (c) The Chairmen of the Senate and House Education
- 144 Committees;
- 145 (d) The Chairmen of the Senate and House Universities
- 146 and Colleges Committees;
- 147 (e) The Chairmen of the Senate and House Appropriations
- 148 Committees;
- (f) Three (3) classroom teachers appointed by the State
- 150 Board of Education, one (1) to be an elementary teacher, one (1)
- 151 to be a middle school teacher and one (1) to be a high school
- 152 teacher;
- (g) One (1) assistant teacher appointed by the
- 154 Mississippi Association of Educators;
- (h) One (1) principal appointed by the State Board of
- 156 Education;
- (i) One (1) local school superintendent appointed by
- 158 the Mississippi Association of School Superintendents; * * *
- 159 (j) Two (2) deans of the College of Education of a

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- 161 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning;
- 162 (k) The Commissioner of Higher Education, or his
- 163 designee; and
- 164 (1) The Executive Director of the State Board for
- 165 Community and Junior Colleges, or his designee.
- Appointments to the task force shall be made within thirty
- 167 (30) days after the effective date of this act. The task force
- 168 shall hold its first meeting not later than August 1, 2011, with
- 169 the date, time and location of the meeting to be designated by the
- 170 State Superintendent of Education. At the first meeting the task
- 171 force shall elect from among its membership a chairman, vice
- 172 chairman and any other officers determined to be necessary, who
- 173 shall organize the task force for business and determine the date
- 174 and locations of subsequent meetings.
- Members of the task force shall serve without compensation
- 176 for their services, but may be reimbursed for necessary expense in
- 177 attending to the actual business of the task force from any
- 178 available funds, as provided by law. Legislative members shall be
- 179 reimbursed from the contingent expense fund of their respective
- 180 house, but only with the specific approval of the Rules Committee
- 181 of the respective house. The task force, by approval of a
- 182 majority of its membership, may accept funds that may be donated
- 183 or provided in the form of grants from public or private sources.
- 184 (3) Any department, agency or court of this state, at the
- 185 request of the chairman of the task force, shall provide staff and
- 186 other support necessary for the task force to perform its duties.
- 187 (4) Upon presentation of its report to the Governor and the
- 188 2013 Regular Session of the Legislature, the task force shall be
- 189 dissolved.
- 190 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 191 and after July 1, 2011.
