- 480 with a Certified Public Accountant to calculate components of the
- 481 Mississippi Adequate Education Program to include the base student
- 482 cost, school district allocations, total program cost, add-on
- 483 programs, and any other required components of Section 37-151-7,
- 484 Mississippi Code of 1972. The contractor shall be responsible for
- 485 calculating the estimates of these components due to the
- 486 Legislative Budget Office and the Governor by August 1 and the
- 487 final estimates due to the Legislative Budget Office and the

- 491 **SECTION 37.** Any school district receiving funds for the Save
