HOUSE BILL NO. 828

AN ACT TO CREATE AN INTERAGENCY FARM TO SCHOOL COUNCIL TO
FACILITATE THE PROCUREMENT AND USE OF LOCALLY GROWN AND LOCALLY RAISED
AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS IN SCHOOL MEALS IN ORDER TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF
FOOD SERVED IN SCHOOLS AND TO SUPPORT THE STATE ECONOMY BY GENERATING
NEW INCOME FOR MISSISSIPPI FARMERS; TO DESCRIBE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE
COUNCIL; TO SET FORTH THE DUTIES AND PURPOSES OF THE COUNCIL; AND FOR
RELATED PURPOSES.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is created an Interagency Council on Farm
- 10 to School, to identify models and methods of promoting farm to school
- 11 programs in the state in order to improve the availability of healthy,
- 12 fresh foods in schools and to promote the economic development of
- 13 Mississippi farmers and food producers.
- 14 (2) The council shall be composed of the following members:
- 15 (a) One (1) person who represents the State Department of
- 16 Education, appointed by the State Superintendent of Public Education;
- 17 (b) One (1) person who represents the Mississippi Department
- 18 of Agriculture and Commerce, appointed by the Commissioner of
- 19 Agriculture and Commerce;
- 20 (c) One (1) person who represents the State Department of
- 21 Health, appointed by the State Health Officer;
- 22 (d) One (1) person who represents the Mississippi State
- 23 University Extension Program;
- (e) One (1) person who represents the Alcorn State
- 25 University Extension Program;
- 26 (f) One (1) person who represents food service directors in
- 27 Mississippi public schools, appointed by the State Superintendent of
- 28 Public Education;

- 29 (g) One (1) person who represents school health and
- 30 nutrition education providers in Mississippi, appointed by the State
- 31 Superintendent of Public Education;
- 32 (h) One (1) person who represents a nonprofit organization
- 33 in Mississippi working to promote Farm to School programs, appointed by
- 34 the Governor;
- 35 (i) One (1) person who represents a statewide nonprofit
- 36 organization working to improve food policies in Mississippi, appointed
- 37 by the Lieutenant Governor;
- 38 (j) One(1) person who represents Mississippi farmers'
- 39 markets, appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce;
- 40 (k) One (1) person who represents farmers that grow food
- 41 products in Mississippi, appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture
- 42 and Commerce;
- (1) One (1) person who represents fruit and vegetable
- 44 growers in Mississippi, appointed by the Mississippi Fruit and Vegetable
- 45 Growers Association;
- 46 (m) One (1) person who represents poultry producers in
- 47 Mississippi, appointed by the President of the Mississippi Poultry
- 48 Association;
- 49 (n) One (1) person who represents catfish or other seafood
- 50 purveyors in Mississippi, appointed by the Commissioner of the
- 51 Department of Agriculture and Commerce;
- 52 (o) One (1) person who represents the Mississippi Farm
- 53 Bureau Federation; and
- 54 (p) One (1) person who represents Mississippi parents,
- 55 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

- 56 (3) In appointing members of the council, the appointing
- 57 authority shall ensure that the members reflect the diversity of this
- 58 state, with members representing rural areas, urban areas and different
- 59 geographical regions of the state.
- 60 (4) The council is charged with facilitating the creation and
- 61 growth of farm to school programs in communities throughout the State of

- 62 Mississippi through studying, recommending and administering best
- 63 practices for creating farm to school programs. This can be
- 64 accomplished with actions including but not limited to:
- 65 (a) Creating and administering an assessment or survey
- designed to evaluate what specific programs or efforts would be the most
- 67 effective in increasing the number of farm to school programs in the
- 68 State of Mississippi;
- (b) Helping to develop and expand local pilot farm to school
- 70 programs in Mississippi;
- 71 (c) Notifying and assisting interested schools, farms, and
- 72 community organizations in applying for funding sources and grants
- 73 related to supporting and decreasing the cost of purchasing locally
- 74 grown and locally raised agricultural products to serve in school meals;
- 75 (d) Assisting Mississippi farmers in marketing and building
- 76 commercial relationships with food service directors in schools;
- 77 (e) Developing or administering training programs for
- 78 Mississippi farmers related to marketing crops, food safety, processing
- 79 crops, business management, liability and risk management, and any other
- 80 topics deemed appropriate by the council;
- 81 (f) Working with the Mississippi Department of Education
- 82 Office of Child Nutrition to assist school food service directors in
- 83 creating and amending school procedures, procurement forms, proper
- 84 handling, preparing and storing procedures in order to facilitate the
- 85 purchase of locally grown and locally raised agricultural products to be
- 86 served in school meals;
- 87 (g) Developing or assisting an organization in developing a
- 88 website that lists schools and farmers interested in participating in
- $89\,$ farm to school programs, promotes farm to school events and programs
- 90 throughout the state and promotes communication and sales between
- 91 Mississippi farmers and schools; and
- 92 (h) Encouraging schools, community organizations,
- 93 restaurants, grocery retail stores and other local organizations and
- 94 businesses to purchase more locally grown and locally raised

- 95 agricultural products to serve or sell through their businesses in order
- 96 to support and increase local farmers' capacity to grow and produce food
- 97 for commercial purposes.
- 98 (5) The council should hold its first meeting no later than
- 99 August 1, 2012, with the date, time and location of this first meeting
- 100 to be determined jointly by the members serving on the council. At the
- 101 first meeting, the council shall elect a chairman, vice chairman, and
- 102 any other officers deemed necessary, from its members. The council
- 103 shall meet periodically but no less than four (4) times per year.
- 104 (6) Members of the council shall serve without compensation or
- 105 reimbursement for their expenses related to participating in the
- 106 council, and the council shall function without appropriations or state
- 107 funds. However, the council can accept funds that may be offered as
- 108 financial grants from public or private sources. The Mississippi State
- 109 Legislature and any department, division, board, bureau, commission or
- 110 agency of the state, or of any political subdivision thereof, shall
- 111 provide, at the request of the chair of the council, such facilities,
- 112 assistance and data as will enable the council to carry out its duties.
- 113 (7) The council shall report its progress and findings to the
- 114 Education Committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate, the
- 115 Agriculture Committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate,
- 116 the Public Health and Human Services Committee of the House of
- 117 Representatives, the Public Health and Welfare Committee of the Senate,
- 118 or any successor committees, on or before June 1, 2013, and once
- annually in each following year in which the council is convened.
- 120 (8) The provisions of this section shall stand repealed from and
- 121 after July 1, 2015.
- 122 **SECTION 2.** For purposes of this act, the following terms shall
- 123 have the meanings herein ascribed unless the context clearly indicates
- 124 otherwise:
- 125 (a) "Council" means the Interagency Farm to School Council
- 126 created in Section 1 of this act.

127	(b) "Farm to school program" means any commercial
128	relationship where a school purchases locally grown or locally raised
129	agricultural products to serve in school meals and can include
130	educational programs for students on local agriculture and nutrition;
131	(c) "Locally grown or locally raised agricultural products"
132	means any food products grown on Mississippi farms or gardens, and
133	includes, but is not limited to fruits, vegetables, and nuts grown in
134	Mississippi, meat, poultry, eggs, dairy, fish, seafood and other aquatic
135	products produced in Mississippi, and products processed into
136	value-added products that are grown or produced in Mississippi;
137	(d) "School" means any K-12 accredited public or private
138	institution for learning and also includes public and private
139	preschools.
140	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and
141	after its passage.
