HOUSE BILL NO. 863

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-153, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1
- 2 TO CREATE AN ADDITIONAL CATERGORY OF RESIDENT LIFETIME SPORTSMAN
- 3 LICENSE; TO PROVIDE THAT THIS SECTION SHALL STAND REPEALED JULY 1,
- 2013; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-7-153, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 49-7-153. (1) Any resident may purchase a lifetime
- 9 sportsman hunting and fishing license by filing an application in
- 10 the office of the department. The license shall qualify the
- licensee to take all fish, game and fowl, except waterfowl, 11
- including deer and turkey, in the manner provided by law. The 12
- 13 license shall also permit the licensee to hunt with primitive
- weapons and bow and arrow, and to fish in the public waters of the 14
- state, including the taking of crabs, oysters, shrimp and any 15
- saltwater fish authorized to be taken under a recreational 16
- 17 license.
- The department may issue a resident lifetime sportsman 18
- license at a fee to be determined by the commission at an amount 19
- 20 not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for a person
- thirteen (13) years of age or older, not less than Five Hundred 21
- 22 Dollars (\$500.00) for a person from six (6) to twelve (12) years
- 23 of age, and not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for a
- person from birth to six (6) years of age. All lifetime licenses 24
- 25 shall be issued from the office of the department. Each
- application for a lifetime license must be accompanied by a 26
- 27 certified copy of the birth certificate of the individual to be

- 28 named as the license holder, if the individual is twelve (12)
- 29 years of age or under.
- 30 (3) The commission shall establish proof of residency
- 31 requirements for the purchase of a lifetime license, and shall
- 32 also establish such restrictions on and regulations for lifetime
- 33 licenses as it deems necessary and proper. Except for applicants
- 34 who are younger than eighteen (18) months of age, an applicant for
- 35 a resident lifetime license must have been domiciled in this state
- 36 for eighteen (18) consecutive months immediately preceding the
- 37 date of his application for a license. The burden of proving
- 38 domicile shall be on the applicant.
- 39 (4) The department may issue a native son or daughter
- 40 nonresident lifetime sportsman hunting and fishing license. The
- 41 commission shall establish the fee, but the fee shall not be less
- 42 than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). The applicant
- 43 must provide a certified copy of the original birth certificate
- 44 showing that the applicant was born in Mississippi and/or if the
- 45 parents' address was in Mississippi at the time of birth as shown
- 46 on the birth certificate or other documents and/or official
- 47 documents reflect that one of said parents was on active military
- 48 service outside the State of Mississippi at the time of said
- 49 birth. Further, if the birth certificate of each parent reflects
- 50 that each parent was born in the State of Mississippi, then any
- 51 child born outside the State of Mississippi of those parents may
- 52 be issued a nonresident lifetime sportsman license for the above
- 53 set out fee.
- 54 (5) Any materially false statement contained in an
- 55 application for a lifetime license renders void the license issued
- 56 pursuant to that application, and subjects the applicant to
- 57 criminal prosecution under Section 49-7-45.
- 58 (6) Nothing in this section exempts an applicant for a
- 59 lifetime license from meeting other qualifications or requirements

- otherwise established by law for the privilege of hunting or
- 61 fishing.
- 62 (7) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2015.
- 63 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 64 and after July 1, 2012.
