> HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 7

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING FEBRUARY 8, 1954, AS THE 1 2 ANNIVERSARY OF THE ADDITION OF THE WORDS, "UNDER GOD," TO THE 3 UNITED STATES PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE. 4 WHEREAS, on February 8, 1954, Senator Homer Ferguson of 5 Michigan introduced a bill to amend the United States Pledge of Allegiance by adding the words, "under God," to the text of the 6 7 pledge; and 8 WHEREAS, February 8, 1954, was chosen as the date to introduce the bill by Senator Ferguson because it was the 9 five-year anniversary of the imprisonment of Cardinal Joseph 10 Mindszenty of Hungary, who was imprisoned and tortured by Nazis 11 and Communists for his sermons exposing the goal of both parties 12 13 to eradicate all religion; and 14 WHEREAS, six speeches were delivered in Congress, by members of both political parties, honoring Cardinal Mindszenty and 15 16 emphasizing the threat posed to America by Communism; and WHEREAS, upon introduction of the bill, Senator Ferguson 17 18 commented, "I believe this modification of the pledge is important 19 because it highlights one of the real fundamental differences between the free world and the Communist world, namely, belief in 20 21 God, "furthering that with, "Our nation is founded on a fundamental belief in God, and the first and most important reason 22 23 for the existence of our Government is to protect the God-given rights of our citizens."; and 24 WHEREAS, the vote to add "under God" to the United States 25 Pledge of Allegiance was a unanimous vote; and 26

27 WHEREAS, on February 7, 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower 28 became convinced that adding the words, "under God," to the United 29 States Pledge of Allegiance would be the right thing to do after 30 hearing Reverend George Docherty preach that the words were 31 appropriate to be added to the United States Pledge of Allegiance 32 because freedom to Americans was defined by a "fundamental belief 33 in God"; and

34 WHEREAS, the first time the United States Pledge of 35 Allegiance was recited was on Flag Day, June 14, 1954; and 36 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize 37 and honor such an important date which strengthens the ties of 38 history that bind us to our Christian heritage:

39 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
40 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
41 THEREIN, That we do hereby recognize February 8, 1954, as the
42 anniversary of the addition of the words, "under God," to the
43 United States Pledge of Allegiance.
