SENATE BILL NO. 2555

1	AN ACT TO ALLOW THE IMPORTATION OF FARM-RAISED WHITE-TAILED
2	DEER, SEMEN, OVA AND EMBRYOS INTO THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI FROM
3	HERDS THAT ARE CERTIFIED FREE OF CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE AND ARE
4	NOT LOCATED NEAR CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE ENDEMIC AREAS; TO ALLOW
5	THE ESTABLISHMENT OF DEER-BREEDING FARMS; TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-1,
6	MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; TO PROVIDE THAT CHAPTER 7 OF
7	TITLE 49. MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972. DOES NOT APPLY TO FARM-RAISED

- 8 WHITE-TAILED DEER CONTAINED IN BREEDING FACILITIES OR TO
- 9 DEER-BREEDING FARMS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 **SECTION 1.** The following words shall mean:
- 12 (a) "Commercial purpose" means the breeding, keeping,
- 13 raising, buying, selling, trading or transferring ownership of
- 14 farm-raised white-tailed deer.
- 15 (b) "Deer-breeding farm" means a permitted enclosure
- 16 used to breed or raise farm-raised white-tailed deer for a
- 17 commercial purpose.
- 18 (c) "Farm-raised white-tailed deer" means any animal of
- 19 the species and genus odocoileus virginianus which is bred, born,
- 20 raised or kept on a deer-breeding farm for a commercial purpose.
- 21 (d) "Department" means the Mississippi Department of
- 22 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks and the Mississippi Commission on
- 23 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.
- 24 **SECTION 2.** (1) The licensee of a deer-breeding farm may
- 25 purchase, sell or transfer farm-raised white-tailed deer to other
- 26 licensed deer-breeding farms and permitted high-fence wildlife
- 27 hunting enclosures and for commercial purposes.
- 28 (2) Farm-raised white-tailed deer are deemed to be the
- 29 property of the licensee of a deer-breeding farm or wildlife
- 30 hunting enclosure and not property of the state.

- 31 (3) The minimum acreage required for the establishment of a
- 32 white-tailed deer-breeding farm shall be five (5) continuous
- 33 acres. The department may approve smaller farms upon application.
- 34 **SECTION 3.** A licensee of a deer-breeding farm or permitted
- 35 white-tailed deer hunting enclosure may import farm-raised
- 36 white-tailed deer, semen, ova and embryos into the state. Deer
- 37 imported into the state must meet the following requirements:
- 38 (a) The herd of origin has participated in a chronic
- 39 wasting disease monitoring program for at least five (5) years and
- 40 is certified free of chronic wasting disease and must be at least
- 41 twenty-five (25) miles from any area that has had any history of
- 42 chronic wasting disease, and is not in an area that is currently
- 43 endemic;
- (b) Have an entry permit issued by the department's
- 45 office no more than thirty (30) days before entry into the state;
- 46 (c) Have written proof of a negative test for
- 47 brucellosis or originate from a brucellosis certified free herd,
- 48 or state, as required by federal regulations;
- (d) Have written proof of a negative test for
- 50 tuberculosis or originate from a tuberculosis accredited herd, or
- 51 state, as may be required by federal regulations;
- 52 **SECTION 4.** Section 49-7-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 53 amended as follows:
- 54 49-7-1. For the purposes of this chapter, the following
- 55 definitions and interpretations shall govern unless otherwise
- 56 provided:
- 57 (a) The following wild animals are classed as game:
- 58 bear, white-tailed deer, rabbits and squirrels.
- 59 (b) The following wild animals are classed as
- 60 fur-bearing animals: muskrats, opossums, otters, weasels, minks,
- 61 raccoons and bobcats.
- (c) The following wild animals are classed as nuisance
- 63 animals: wild hogs, nutria, beaver, fox, skunks and coyote.

- 108 (e) The following are classed as game birds: geese,
- 109 brant ducks, rails, coots, snipe, gallinules, moorhens, woodcock,
- 110 crow, mergansers, wild turkey, quail and doves.
- All other species of wild resident or migratory birds are
- 112 classed as nongame birds.
- (f) Closed season: the time during which birds,
- 114 animals or fish may not be taken.
- 115 (g) Open season: the time during which birds, animals
- 116 or fish may be lawfully taken.
- 117 (h) "Commission" means the Mississippi Commission on
- 118 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.
- 119 (i) Deer" means wild white-tailed deer and does not
- 120 include farm-raised white-tailed deer that are housed inside
- 121 permitted breeding farms.
- 122 (j) "Department" means the Mississippi Department of
- 123 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.
- 124 (k) "Executive director" means the Executive Director
- 125 of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.
- 126 **SECTION 5.** Chapter 7, Title 49, Mississippi Code of 1972,
- 127 shall not apply to farm-raised white-tailed deer on deer-breeding
- 128 farms regulated by the department.
