HOUSE BILL NO. 198

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-3-54.1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE OFFENSE AND THE PENALTIES FOR HUMAN TRAFFICKING; AND 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. Section 97-3-54.1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 7 $97 - 3 - 54 \cdot 1 \cdot (1)$ (a) A person who recruits, entices, harbors, transports, provides or obtains by any means, or attempts 8 9 to recruit, entice, harbor, transport, provide or obtain by any means, another person, intending or knowing that the person will 10 11 be subjected to forced labor or services, shall be guilty of the crime of human-trafficking. 12 13 (b) A person who knowingly subjects, or attempts to 14 subject, another person to forced labor or services shall be 15 quilty of the crime of procuring involuntary servitude. 16 (C) (i) A person who knowingly subjects, or attempts to subject, or who recruits, entices, harbors, transports, 17 18 provides or obtains by any means, or attempts to recruit, entice, H. No. 198 ~ OFFICIAL ~ G1/2 19 harbor, transport, provide or obtain by any means, * * * another 20 person, knowing that the * * * person will engage in commercial sexual activity, sexually explicit performance, or the production 21 22 of sexually oriented material, or causes or attempts to 23 cause * * * the person to engage in commercial sexual activity, 24 sexually explicit performance, or the production of sexually oriented material, shall be guilty of procuring sexual 25 26 servitude * * * and shall be punished by commitment to the 27 custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than thirty 28 (30) years.

29 <u>(ii) A person who violates the provisions of</u>
30 <u>subparagraph (i) of this paragraph and the violation involves a</u>
31 <u>minor as the victim shall be guilty of procuring sexual servitude</u>
32 <u>of a minor and shall be punished by commitment to the custody of</u>
33 <u>the Department of Corrections for not more than fifty (50) years.</u>

34 (2) A person who is convicted of an offense set forth in 35 subsection (1)(a) or (b) of this section, or who benefits, whether 36 financially or by receiving anything of value, from participation 37 in a venture that has engaged in an act described in this section, 38 shall be committed to the custody of the Department of Corrections 39 for not more than * * * twenty-five (25) years and a fine of up to 40 Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00).

41 (3) A business entity that knowingly aids or participates in 42 human trafficking shall be subject to the permanent loss of any

43 license or certificate to conduct business in the state.

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44 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 45 and after July 1, 2013.

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
