## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2462

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 57-89-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE DEFINITION OF THE TERMS "MOTION PICTURE" AND "MOTION PICTURE PRODUCTION COMPANY" UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI MOTION PICTURE INCENTIVE ACT TO INCLUDE COMPUTER OR VIDEO GAMES; TO AMEND SECTION 5 57-89-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE TO \$5,000,000.00 6 THE AMOUNT OF PAYROLL THAT MAY BE APPLIED TO THE MISSISSIPPI 7 MOTION PICTURE INCENTIVE ACT REBATE; TO AUTHORIZE A MOTION PICTURE PRODUCTION COMPANY TO RECEIVE A REBATE EQUAL TO 5% OF THE 8 9 PAYROLL PAID FOR ANY EMPLOYEE WHO IS A VETERAN OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES; TO INCREASE THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF REBATES THAT 10 11 A MOTION PICTURE PRODUCTION COMPANY MAY RECEIVE FOR A MOTION 12 PICTURE PROJECT UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI MOTION PICTURE INCENTIVE ACT 13 TO \$10,000,000.00; TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE SHALL NOT APPROVE A REBATE UNDER CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE MISSISSIPPI 14 15 MOTION PICTURE INCENTIVE ACT AFTER JULY 1, 2016; AND FOR RELATED 16 PURPOSES.

- 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 18 SECTION 1. Section 57-89-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 19 amended as follows:
- 20 57-89-3. As used in this chapter, the following terms shall
- have the meanings ascribed in this section unless the context 21
- 22 clearly indicates otherwise:
- 23 (a) "Base investment" means the actual investment made
- 24 and expended in Mississippi by a motion picture production company
- 25 in connection with the production of a state-certified production

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- 26 in the state. The term "base investment" includes amounts
- 27 expended in Mississippi by a motion picture production company as
- 28 per diem and housing allowances in connection with the production
- 29 of a state-certified production in the state. The term "base
- 30 investment" shall not include payroll.
- 31 (b) "Employee" means an individual directly involved in
- 32 the physical production and/or post-production of a motion picture
- 33 produced in the state and who is employed by a:
- 34 (i) Motion picture production company that is
- 35 directly involved in the physical production and/or
- 36 post-production of a motion picture in the state;
- 37 (ii) Personal service corporation retained by a
- 38 motion picture production company to provide persons used directly
- 39 in the physical production and/or post-production of a motion
- 40 picture in the state; or
- 41 (iii) Payroll service or loan-out company that is
- 42 retained by a motion picture production company to provide
- 43 employees who work directly in the physical production and/or
- 44 post-production of a motion picture in the state.
- 45 (c) "Motion picture" means a nationally distributed
- 46 feature-length film, video, DVD, television program or
- 47 series, \* \* \* commercial, or computer or video game made in
- 48 Mississippi, in whole or in part, for theatrical or DVD release or
- 49 television viewing or as a television pilot or viewing through
- 50 streaming video or Internet delivery, or for playing on a video

- 51 game console, personal computer or handheld device. The term
- 52 "motion picture" shall not include the production of television
- 53 coverage of news and athletic events, or a film, video, DVD,
- 54 television program, series, or commercial that contains any
- 55 material or performance defined in Section 97-29-103.
- 56 (d) "Motion picture production company" means a company
- 57 engaged in the business of producing nationally distributed motion
- 58 pictures, videos, DVDs, television programs or series, \* \* \*
- 59 commercials, or computer or video games intended for a theatrical
- 60 release \* \* \*, for television viewing or for playing on a video
- 61 game console, personal computer or handheld device. The term
- 62 "motion picture production company" includes a company engaged in
- 63 the business of making such productions through the use of
- 64 animation, interactive media, preproduction and post-production 3D
- 65 applications, video game cinematics, virtual production, visual
- 66 effects, and motion capture within the fields of feature film,
- 67 television, commercials and games. The term "motion picture
- 68 production company" shall not mean or include any company owned,
- 69 affiliated, or controlled, in whole or in part, by any company or
- 70 person which is in default on a loan made by the state or a loan
- 71 guaranteed by the state, or any company or person who has ever
- 72 declared bankruptcy under which an obligation of the company or
- 73 person to pay or repay public funds or monies was discharged as a
- 74 part of such bankruptcy.

- 75 (e) "Payroll" means salary, wages or other compensation
- 76 including related benefits paid to employees upon which
- 77 Mississippi income tax is due and has been withheld.
- 78 (f) "Resident" or "resident of Mississippi" means a
- 79 natural person, and for the purpose of determining eligibility for
- 80 the rebate provided by Section 57-89-7, any person domiciled in
- 81 the State of Mississippi and any other person who maintains a
- 82 permanent place of abode within the state and spends in the
- 83 aggregate more than six (6) months of each year within the state.
- (g) "State" means the State of Mississippi.
- 85 (h) "State-certified production" means a motion picture
- 86 approved by the Mississippi Development Authority produced by a
- 87 motion picture production company in the state. An application
- 88 for approval as a state-certified production must be submitted to
- 89 the Mississippi Development Authority before production of the
- 90 project begins.
- 91 **SECTION 2.** Section 57-89-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 92 amended as follows:
- 93 57-89-7. (1) (a) A motion picture production company that
- 94 expends at least Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) in base
- 95 investment or payroll, or both, in the state shall be entitled to
- 96 a rebate of a portion of the base investment made by the motion
- 97 picture production company. Subject to the provisions of this
- 98 section, the amount of the rebate shall be equal to twenty-five

- 99 percent (25%) of the base investment made by the motion picture 100 production company.
- 101 (b) In addition to the rebates authorized under
- 102 paragraphs (a)  $\star$   $\star$ , (c) and (d) of this subsection, a motion
- 103 picture production company may receive a rebate equal to
- 104 twenty-five percent (25%) of payroll paid for any employee who is
- 105 not a resident and whose wages are subject to the Mississippi
- 106 Income Tax Withholding Law of 1968. However, if the payroll paid
- for an employee exceeds \* \* Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00,
- 108 then the rebate is authorized only for the first \* \* \* Five
- 109 Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) of such payroll.
- 110 (c) In addition to the rebates authorized under
- 111 paragraphs (a)  $\star$   $\star$ , (b) and (d) of this subsection, a motion
- 112 picture production company may receive a rebate equal to thirty
- 113 percent (30%) of payroll paid for any employee who is a resident
- 114 and whose wages are subject to the Mississippi Income Tax
- 115 Withholding Law of 1968. However, if the payroll paid for an
- 116 employee exceeds \* \* \* Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00), then
- 117 the rebate is authorized only for the first \* \* \* Five Million
- 118 Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) of such payroll.
- 119 (d) In addition to the rebates authorized in paragraphs
- 120 (a), (b) and (c) of this subsection, a motion picture production
- 121 company may receive an additional rebate equal to five percent
- 122 (5%) of the payroll paid for any employee who is an honorably
- 123 discharged veteran of the United States Armed Forces and whose

- 124 wages are subject to the Mississippi Income Tax Withholding Law of
- 125 1968.
- 126 (\* \* \*e) If a motion picture has physical production
- 127 activities and/or post-production activities both inside and
- 128 outside the state, then the motion picture production company
- 129 shall be required to provide an itemized accounting for each
- 130 employee regarding such activities inside and outside the state
- 131 for the purposes of proration of eligible payroll based on the
- 132 percentage of activities performed in the state.
- 133 (\* \* \*f) The total amount of rebates authorized for a
- 134 motion picture project shall not exceed \* \* \* Ten Million Dollars
- 135 (\$10,000,000.00) in the aggregate.
- 136 (\* \* \*g) The total amount of rebates authorized in any
- 137 fiscal year shall not exceed Twenty Million Dollars
- 138 (\$20,000,000.00) in the aggregate.
- 139 (2) A motion picture production company desiring a rebate
- 140 under this section must submit a rebate request to the Department
- 141 of Revenue upon completion of the project. The request must
- 142 include a detailed accounting of the base investment made by the
- 143 motion picture production company and any other information
- 144 required by the Department of Revenue. Rebates made by the
- 145 Department of Revenue under this section shall be made from
- 146 current income tax collections. The Department of Revenue shall
- 147 not approve any application for a rebate under subsection (1)(b)
- 148 of this section after July 1, \* \* \* 2016.

(3) The Department of Revenue shall have all powers
necessary to implement and administer the provisions of this
section, and the Department of Revenue shall promulgate rules and
regulations, in accordance with the Mississippi Administrative
Procedures Law, necessary for the implementation of this section.
SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after its passage.

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
