## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 563

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE INTENT OF THE 2 LEGISLATURE THAT MISSISSIPPI SHALL COMMIT TO BECOME AN "EMPLOYMENT 3 FIRST" STATE RELATIVE TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. 4 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature recognizes that Mississippians with disabilities have the ability and desire to 5 seek employment in integrated settings, to be compensated fairly 6 through competitive wages, and to achieve economic 7 8 self-sufficiency as equal members of the workforce; and 9 WHEREAS, Mississippians with disabilities have a right to the opportunity for competitive employment; and in order to achieve 10 11 meaningful and competitive employment for persons with disabilities, employment opportunities in fully integrated work 12 13 settings shall be the first and priority option explored in the 14 service planning for working-age persons with disabilities. Henceforth, Mississippi will be known as an "Employment First" 15 16 state; and WHEREAS, "disability" is defined, with respect to an 17 18 individual, as a physical or mental impairment that substantially

21 WHEREAS, "competitive employment" means work in the 22 competitive labor market that is performed on a full-time or 23 part-time basis in an integrated setting and for which a person 24 with a disability is compensated at or above the minimum wage, but 25 not less than the customary wage and level of benefits paid by the 26 employer for the same or similar work performed by persons without 27 disabilities; and

28 WHEREAS, "integrated setting" means with respect to an 29 employment outcome, a setting typically found in the community in 30 which persons with disabilities interact with persons without 31 disabilities, other than persons without disabilities who are 32 providing services to those persons with disabilities, to the same 33 extent that persons without disabilities in comparable positions 34 interact with other persons; and

35 WHEREAS, Mississippians with disabilities are a largely 36 untapped resource for employers and the hiring of Mississippians 37 with disabilities represents a viable business solution to meet 38 the needs of employers while providing opportunities for 39 individuals with disabilities to use their strengths and their 40 skills toward the economic good of the state:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That

43 the State of Mississippi shall commit to become an "Employment 44 First" State as follows:

(a) State agencies that provide services and support to
persons with disabilities shall coordinate efforts and collaborate
within and among such agencies to ensure that state programs,
policies, procedures and funding support competitive employment in
integrated settings for persons with disabilities who are of
working age.

(b) All state agencies shall, whenever feasible, share data and information across systems in order to track progress toward full implementation of "Employment First" and shall adopt measurable goals and objectives to promote assessment of progress in implementing this resolution.

56 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution shall be 57 transmitted to the Governor and the State Personnel Board for 58 distribution to state agencies and be made available to the 59 Capitol Press Corps.
