## HOUSE BILL NO. 2

1 2 3 4 5	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE-DIVISION OF MEDICAID FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI MEDICAID LAW AND DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF THAT LAW FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2014.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
9	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Governor's
10	Office - Division of Medicaid for the purpose of providing medical
11	assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law and defraying the
12	expenses of the administration of such law, as provided in Section
13	43-13-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year
14	beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014
15	\$ 571,549,188.00.
16	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
17	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
18	Treasury to the credit of the Medical Care Fund created by Section
19	43-13-143, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of providing

20	medical assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law for the
21	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014
22	\$ 420,052,225.00.
23	SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
24	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
25	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Governor's
26	Office - Division of Medicaid which is comprised of special source
27	funds collected by or otherwise available to the commission, for
28	the purpose of providing medical assistance under the Mississippi
29	Medicaid Law and defraying the expenses of the administration of
30	such law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending
31	June 30, 2014\$ 4,283,507,616.00.
32	Prior period recovery of funds may be maintained and expended
33	by the division when the recovery is received or finalized. Any
34	recoveries due to audits or third party recoveries may be used to
35	offset the cost of such audits and third party recoveries and as
36	such, the division may escalate Contractual Services as needed for
37	these purposes.
38	SECTION 4. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
39	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
40	Treasury to the credit of the Health Care Expendable Fund, for the
41	purpose of defraying the expenses of the Governor's
42	Office - Division of Medicaid for the fiscal year beginning July
43	1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014\$ 80,715,568.00.
44	The above funds shall be allocated as follows:

46	Eyeglasses for adults\$ 699,191.00
47	Home and Community Waiver Program\$ 1,972,132.00
48	Disabled worker buy-in to the Medicaid

52	It is the intention of the Legislature that funds may be
53	shifted among the above allocated line items where needed in the
54	discretion of the Executive Director of the Division of Medicaid.
55	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
56	this act, the following positions are authorized:
57	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
58	Permanent: Full Time
59	Part Time 2
60	Time-Limited: Full Time

62	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
63	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
64	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
65	Services" for Fiscal Year 2015 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2014
66	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
67	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2014 budget by the
68	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
69	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall

70 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 71 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 72 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure 73 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 74 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2014 appropriations for "Personal 75 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 76 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 77 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 78 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 79 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2014 "Personal Services" 80 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 81 82 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 83 84 Unless otherwise authorized in this act, no state agency 85 shall take any action to promote or otherwise award salary 86 increases through reallocation, reclassification, realignment, educational benchmark, career ladder, equity salary adjustment, or 87 88 any other means to increase salaries of employees or positions 89 unless specifically exempted by the following conditions: 90 award of teacher salary increments; the advancement of a 91 trainee/cadet to the next level of a bona fide career ladder; the award of an educational benchmark for the attainment of a 92 93 Certified Public Accountant License or higher level professional 94 certification; the immediate replacement of a departing employee

- 95 with an employee from within state service at a salary level of
- 96 the departing employee or the FY2014 promotional formula,
- 97 whichever is less; the emergency appointment of nurses,
- 98 pharmacists or other health care and child protection
- 99 professionals at a salary to be determined by the State Personnel
- 100 Board or any other requested action of the agency that has been
- 101 specifically authorized by the Legislature.
- 102 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 103 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 104 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 105 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 106 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 107 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 108 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 109 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 110 appropriated level.
- 111 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 112 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 113 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 114 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 115 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 116 Governor's Office Division of Medicaid shall maintain complete
- 117 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
- 118 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
- 119 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal

120	Year 2013. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
121	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2015 shall be
122	submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
123	and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
124	provided during the Fiscal Year 2014 budget request process with
125	the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) being separated
126	from the Medical Services Program and submitted as a separate
127	program. In addition, the performance measures reported for the
128	Medical Services Program shall include an unduplicated case count
129	of individuals served by eligibility status, and the number and
130	the costs of emergency room visits.
131	SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
132	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
133	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
134	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
135	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
136	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
137	performance measures provided below:

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 194

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purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
made without competitive bids.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated herein, an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided to implement an Adult Foster Care program for Medicaid recipients as authorized by Section 43-13-117, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 10. The division shall provide statistical and financial reports on a monthly basis to the Legislative Budget Office. These reports shall include, but are not limited to, an accounting of all funds spent and participant statistics medical program, the CHIP program, the Dialysis Transportation program, and each of the Home- and Community-Based Waiver programs, and an accounting of all funds spent in the administrative program.

The Division of Medicaid shall perform its cash flow projections on a predetermined monthly schedule and make this and any other information requested available, upon request, to the Chair of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the House Public Health and Human Services Committee, the House Medicaid Committee, the House and Senate Appropriations Committees as well as the Legislative Budget Office.

- SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 3, One Hundred Eighty-seven Million Eight Hundred
  Twenty-nine Thousand Six Hundred Two Dollars (\$187,829,602.00)
  shall be derived from the Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office.

  SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the
- Division of Medicaid shall pay a per diem rate of reimbursement of no less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) or more than Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) to providers of adult day services for each day of service provided to an eligible beneficiary. In order to receive this per diem rate of reimbursement, providers of adult day services shall participate in the Elderly and Disabled Waiver Program for Home- and Community-Based Services.
- SECTION 13. In the division's Fiscal Year 2015 budget
  submission, all Medicaid 1915 (C) Home- and Community-Based
  Waivers shall be presented as a budget program separate from the
  Medical Services Program.
- SECTION 14. The Division shall transfer One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) of State Support Funds to the Department of Rehabilitation Services for the support of the Independent Living Home- and Community-Based Waiver program and shall transfer One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) of State Support Funds to the Department of Human Services to support the Home Delivered Meals program.

245	SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
246	of this act, Two Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
247	(\$2,750,000.00) are provided for the purpose of funding a
248	temporary program to provide nonemergency transportation to
249	locations for necessary dialysis services for end-stage renal
250	disease patients who are sixty-five (65) years of age or older or
251	are disabled as determined under Section 1614(a)(3) of the federal
252	Social Security Act, as amended, whose income did not exceed one
253	hundred thirty-five percent (135%) of the nonfarm official poverty
254	level as defined by the Office of Management and Budget and whose
255	eligibility was covered under the former category of eligibility
256	known as Poverty Level Aged and Disabled (PLADS). One Hundred
257	Eighty-two Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-five Dollars (\$182,535.00)
258	of the amount provided in this section, as originally authorized
259	in HB 865 of the 2009 Regular Session, shall come from Treasury
260	Fund 3322.
261	SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 3,
262	Three Hundred Ninety-eight Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars
263	(\$398,550.00) General Funds and One Million One Hundred One
264	Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,101,450.00) Special Funds
265	are provided for five (5) additional slots in the Assisted Living
266	Waiver program for persons with Traumatic Brain Injury and in need
267	of Cognitive Rehabilitation. The Division shall develop
268	eligibility criteria for these additional slots.

269	SECTION 17. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
270	Division shall apply for enhanced federal funding for the
271	modernization of Medicaid eligibility and enrollment IT systems
272	that may become available to the Division of Medicaid. The
273	Division is authorized to escalate these funds in an amount not to
274	exceed Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00) in accordance with
275	procedures for federal fund escalations as established in Section
276	27-104-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, and expended for the purposes
277	of performing such duties as set forth by law in accordance with
278	applicable rules and regulations of the State Fiscal Officer.
279	SECTION 18. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
280	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
281	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
282	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
283	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
284	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
285	SECTION 19. This act shall take effect and be in force from
286	and after July 1, 2013.
