HOUSE BILL NO. 749 (As Passed the House)

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE "STATEWIDE LAW ENFORCEMENT STRIKE TEAM" 2 ACT; TO PROVIDE DEFINITIONS FOR SUCH ACT; TO CREATE WITHIN THE 3 OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL A STATEWIDE LAW ENFORCEMENT STRIKE 4 TEAM DIVISION; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PURPOSE OF SUCH DIVISION IS TO 5 ASSIST MUNICIPAL, COUNTY AND STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT WITH THE 6 APPREHENSION OF CRIMINALS, THE SEIZURE OF EVIDENCE AND THE 7 EXECUTION OF WARRANTS AND OTHER ACTIONS, UPON REQUEST BY LAW ENFORCEMENT; TO REQUIRE THAT STRIKE TEAMS BE DESIGNATED TO AREAS 8 9 IN NORTH, CENTRAL AND SOUTH MISSISSIPPI; TO PROVIDE THAT THE 10 ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL HAVE EXCLUSIVE OVERSIGHT OF THE STRIKE 11 TEAMS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE GOVERNOR AND THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL 12 JOINTLY CHOOSE THE COMMANDERS OF EACH STRIKE TEAM; TO REQUIRE THE 13 ATTORNEY GENERAL TO CREATE RULES AND REGULATIONS UNDER THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT TO CARRY OUT CERTAIN DUTIES OF THIS 14 15 ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

17 SECTION 1. This act shall be known and cited as the

18 "Statewide Law Enforcement Strike Team" Act.

19 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this act, the following words

20 shall have the following meaning, unless the context requires

21 otherwise:

22 (a) "Attorney General" means the Mississippi Office of

23 the Attorney General.

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(b) "Commander" means each of the three (3) people
jointly appointed by the Governor and the Attorney General to
manage the north, central and south strike teams.

27 (c) "Division" means the Statewide Law Enforcement28 Strike Team Division.

(d) "Strike team" means each of the twelve (12) or
fifteen (15) members of municipal, county and state law
enforcement chosen by the Attorney General to be members of the
state wide law enforcement strike teams created under the
provisions of this act.

34 SECTION 3. (1) There is created within the Office of the Attorney General, a Statewide Law Enforcement Strike Team Division 35 36 whose primary purpose is to assist municipal, county and state law enforcement with the apprehension of criminals, the seizure of 37 38 evidence, the execution of warrants and other actions, upon 39 request by such law enforcement. Except as otherwise provided in 40 this act, the Attorney General shall have exclusive oversight of the division. 41

42 (2) There shall be no more than three (3) "strike teams" 43 throughout the state, which shall be located in the northern, 44 central and southern areas of the state. One (1) team shall be 45 located in each of the three (3) Supreme Court districts. These 46 areas shall be referred to as "strike zones." The Attorney 47 General shall designate the geographic boundaries of the "strike 48 zones." Each "strike team" shall be composed of twelve (12) or

H. B. No. 749 14/HR40/R1222PH PAGE 2 (GT\BD) 49 fifteen (15) members, with the number of members being divided 50 equally, with four (4) or five (5) members representing municipal, 51 county and state law enforcement.

52 Each of the three (3) "strike teams" shall have a (3)53 separate commander. Each commander shall be chosen jointly by the 54 Office of the Governor and the Attorney General, and shall serve at the will and pleasure of the Governor and the Attorney General. 55 56 (4) The Attorney General shall establish a budget that (a) 57 will include monies for compensation of all commanders, 58 participants of the strike teams and staff employed to support 59 such teams, equipment, training and reimbursement of members of 60 the strike teams.

(b) The Attorney General shall approve the purchase of necessary gear to clearly identify members of the "strike teams" from local law enforcement officers. The Attorney General shall reimburse any municipality, county or state law enforcement agency or division that provides training to members of its law enforcement for the purpose of participating on a strike team.

67 (c) The overtime compensation for any member of the
68 strike team shall be limited to Fifteen Thousand Dollars
69 (\$15,000.00) per person, per state fiscal year.

70 (5) The Attorney General shall promulgate rules and71 regulations under the Administrative Procedures Act to:

72 (i) To receive and assess requests for assistance73 from municipal, county and state law enforcement;

No. 749 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 14/HR40/R1222PH PAGE 3 (GT\BD) 74 (ii) To choose the members of the strike team from 75 municipal, county and state law enforcement; 76 To determine how area law enforcement (iii) 77 academies can be used for the operation of strike teams; 78 To determine how the Mississippi Wireless (iv) 79 Integrated Network (MSWIN) radio system can be used to effectively 80 communicate between strike teams, participating law enforcement and the division commander; 81 82 To create standards, policies and procedures (V) 83 for execution by the strike team, which include goals, strategies, 84 duration of deployment; 85 To refer major cases for federal prosecution. (vi) 86 (6) Participating municipal, county, and state law 87 enforcement agencies shall enter into appropriate interlocal 88 agreements, which shall be approved by the Attorney General 89 prusuant to Section 17-13-1 et seq. 90 The Office of the Attorney General shall reimburse (7)participating municipal, county, and state law enforcement with 91 92 monies appropriated from the Legislature to the Attorney General 93 specifically for purposes of carrying out the provisions of this 94 act, which shall include, but not be limited to, salaries, 95 equipment, training and reimbursements. 96 (8) The Attorney General shall defend any participating

97 municipal, county or state law enforcement officer of a strike 98 team, and the municipality, county or agency that employs such

103 (9) The court that has original jurisdiction for prosecution 104 of a case arising from a strike team action shall be in the county 105 in which the alleged crime occurs.

106 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Any municipal, county or state law enforcement 107 agency or division that has members of its law enforcement on the 108 "strike team" are hereby authorized to provide motor vehicles, 109 weapons, bullet resistant vests, and other items which may be 110 requested by the Attorney General to fulfill the purposes of this 111 act.

112 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 113 and after July 1, 2014, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2014.
