HOUSE BILL NO. 1417

1 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO 2 ANNUALLY DETERMINE A UNIFORM PERCENTAGE OF ADEQUATE EDUCATION 3 PROGRAM FUNDS WHICH MUST BE ALLOCATED TO DIRECT CLASSROOM 4 INSTRUCTION IN ALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO 5 CALCULATE THE UNIFORM PERCENTAGE USING DATA FROM THE FIVE HIGHEST 6 PERFORMING SCHOOL DISTRICTS UNDER THE STATE ASSESSMENT PROGRAM; TO 7 DEFINE THE TERM "DIRECT CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION"; AND FOR RELATED 8 PURPOSES. 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. (1) Before May 1 of each year, the State 11 Department of Education shall determine the uniform percentage of adequate education program funds, as defined under Section 12 37-151-5(q), which must be allocated by each school district to 13 14 direct classroom instruction in the next succeeding fiscal year. For purposes of this calculation, the State Department of 15 16 Education must utilize the most current financial data available from the five (5) school districts that are identified by the 17 18 department, using the most current state assessment results under 19 the state accreditation system, as being the highest performing 20 districts. - 22 used in calculating the percentage of funds in each of the
- 23 selected districts which is allocated to direct classroom
- 24 instruction. The ratio of adequate education program funds
- 25 allocated to direct classroom instruction to the total adequate
- 26 education program allotment must be calculated for each school
- 27 district selected under this subsection. The department then
- 28 shall calculate the average of the ratios in the five (5) selected
- 29 school districts, which average establishes the uniform percentage
- 30 of adequate education program funds which must be allocated to
- 31 direct classroom instruction in all school districts in the next
- 32 fiscal year.
- 33 (2) For purposes of this section, the term "direct classroom
- 34 instruction" means the classroom level of instruction and
- 35 specifically includes the following:
- 36 (a) Salaries of classroom teachers who spend no less
- 37 than sixty percent (60%) of each school day in scheduled classroom
- 38 instruction;
- 39 (b) Salaries of the assistant teachers working under
- 40 the teachers described under paragraph (a) of this subsection; and
- 41 (c) Instructional supplies used in the classroom by a
- 42 teacher described under paragraph (a) of this subsection and any
- 43 assistant teacher assigned to that classroom, including computers
- 44 and technology.
- 45 (3) For purposes of this section, the term "direct classroom
- 46 instruction" specifically excludes the following:

47	(a) Instructional staff support services, such as
48	professional development and instruction and curriculum
49	development;
50	(b) Library and media services;

51 (c) Student support services, including counseling, 52 school nurses, health and psychological services, attendance

services, school and school district administration, food

- 32 school hurses, health and psychological services, attendance
- 54 services, transportation and operations and physical plant
- 55 maintenance; and

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- 56 (d) School security.
- 57 (4) A school district, in its discretion, may allocate a
 58 percentage of adequate education program funds to direct classroom
 59 instruction which is greater than the percentage established as
 60 the uniform percentage under subsection (1) of this section.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2014.
