

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 515 516 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 517 518 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 519 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 520 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 521 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 522 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 523 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
