HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 45

1 A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING PARENTAL RIGHTS.

2 WHEREAS, the right of parents to direct the upbringing and 3 education of their children is a fundamental right, and 4 historically, our nation has relied first and foremost upon 5 parents to meet the real and constant needs of children; and

6 WHEREAS, the interests of children are best served when 7 parents are free to make child-rearing decisions about education, 8 religion and other aspects of a child's life without government 9 interference; and

10 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court, in the case of Wisconsin v. Yoder, 406 U.S. 205 (1972), held that "This primary 11 12 role of the parents in the upbringing of their children is now 13 established beyond debate as an enduring American tradition"; and 14 WHEREAS, however, in the case of Troxel v. Granville, 530 15 U.S. 57 (2000), six (6) justices of the United States Supreme 16 Court filed opinions on the nature and enforceability of parental 17 rights under the Constitution of the United States, and the number

18 of written opinions in the Troxel v. Granville case has created 19 confusion and ambiguity about the fundamental nature of parental 20 rights in the laws and society of the several states; and 21 WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the House of Representatives 22 that we should prevent erosion of the enduring American tradition 23 of treating parental rights as fundamental rights and preserve parental rights from being infringed upon by shifting ideologies 24 25 and interpretations of the United States Supreme Court:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That it recognizes that the liberty of parents to direct the upbringing, education and care of their children, which encompasses all forms of care, is a fundamental right.

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution shall 32 be transmitted to each member of the delegation of the State of 33 Mississippi in the Congress of the United States and to members of 34 the Capitol Press Corps.
