- 10 97-37-39. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell
- 11 any center-fire pistol or rifle cartridge that does not bear on
- 12 the casing thereof a serial number or other unique identifying
- 13 mark.
- 14 (2) (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell any
- 15 center-fire pistol or rifle cartridge without making a record of
- 16 the serial numbers or other unique identifying mark of the
- 17 cartridges sold.
- 18 (b) Records required under this section shall be

- 19 retained by the seller for not less than five (5) years from the
- 20 date of sale.

21	(3) A person who violates this section, upon conviction,
22	shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars
23	(\$5,000.00) or imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
21	Corrections for a term not to exceed fixe (5) wears or both fine

- 24 Corrections for a term not to exceed five (5) years, or both fine
- 25 and imprisonment.
- 26 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 27 and after October 1, 2014.
