1	AN ACT TO CREATE THE DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES
2	ACCOUNTABILITY AND REORGANIZATION ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-11,
3	MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE FOR THE REORGANIZATION OF THE
4	DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES; TO CREATE CERTAIN OFFICES WITHIN
5	THE DEPARTMENT; TO PROVIDE QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTAIN AGENCY
6	PERSONNEL; TO EXEMPT PERSONNEL ACTIONS FOR ONE YEAR FROM THE STATE
7	PERSONNEL BOARD TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE AND TIMELY
8	REORGANIZATION; TO REQUIRE AN ANNUAL AUDIT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
9	MARINE RESOURCES; TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF
10	1972, TO ABOLISH THE ARTIFICIAL REEF PROGRAM ACCOUNT WITHIN THE
11	SEAFOOD FUND; TO CREATE A LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ON THE
12	COMMISSION OF MARINE RESOURCES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF MARINE
13	RESOURCES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 15 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-15-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 16 amended as follows:
- 17 49-15-11. (1) The Mississippi Department of Marine
- 18 Resources is hereby established and full power is vested in the
- 19 department to manage, control, supervise, enforce and direct any
- 20 matters pertaining to saltwater aquatic life and marine resources
- 21 under the jurisdiction of the commission.
- 22 (2) The Executive Director of the Department of Marine
- 23 Resources shall have the authority to internally reorganize the

24 Department of Marine Resources. 1	For a	period	of	one	(1)	year
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- 25 after * * * passage of this act, the personnel actions of the
- 26 executive director shall be exempt from State Personnel Board
- 27 rules, regulations and procedures in order to give the executive
- 28 director flexibility in making an orderly, effective and timely
- 29 reorganization of the Department of Marine Resources.
- 30 (3) The department shall be composed of the following
- 31 <u>offices:</u>
- 32 (a) Office of Coastal Resources;
- 33 (b) Office of Finance and Administration;
- 34 (c) Office of Marine Fisheries;
- 35 (d) Office of Marine Patrol; and
- 36 (e) Office of Restoration and Resiliency.
- 37 Each office shall be composed of the administrative units as
- 38 set forth in the reorganization plan developed by the executive
- 39 director.
- 40 (4) The following agency personnel shall be appointed by the
- 41 executive director:
- 42 (a) Chief Financial Officer who shall have a minimum of
- 43 a Master's Degree in Business Administration, Accounting or
- 44 related field and a minimum of five (5) years' experience in
- 45 business management or accounting practice.
- 46 (b) Chief of Marine Patrol who shall be a certified law
- 47 enforcement officer with a minimum of ten (10) years of law
- 48 enforcement experience.

50	of a Master's degree in Coastal Sciences or related field with a
51	minimum of five (5) years of experience in coastal resource
52	management or equivalent experience.
53	(5) The executive director shall have an annual audit of the
54	department performed by an independent certified public accountant
55	and shall file the audit report with the commission, the
56	Legislative Oversight Committee, the State Auditor and the
57	Legislative Budget Office.
58	(* * \star \star \bullet) Whenever the terms "Mississippi Marine
59	Conservation Commission," "Marine Conservation Commission,"
60	"Bureau of Marine Resources" and "Mississippi Marine Resources
61	Council" appear in any state law, they shall mean the "Mississippi
62	Commission on Marine Resources."
63	SECTION 2. Section 49-15-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
64	amended as follows:
65	49-15-17. (1) (a) All monies received or obtained by the
66	commission under the provisions of this chapter shall be paid over
67	by the commission to the State Treasurer and shall be deposited
68	into the fund known as the "Seafood Fund." All revenues collected
69	through the department, to include, but not limited to, commercial
70	saltwater licenses and taxes, permits, fines and penalties, and

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- 74 (b) * * * The "Artificial Reef Program Account" within
 75 the Seafood Fund is abolished. * * * Any unexpended funds
 76 remaining in the account * * * shall * * * be deposited into the
 77 Seafood Fund * * *.
- 78 There is established a special account to be known 79 as the "Coastal Preserve Account" within the Seafood Fund. 80 funds received from any public or private source for the purpose 81 of management, improvement and acquisition of coastal preserves in 82 the state and money required to be deposited pursuant to Sections 27-19-56.10 and 27-19-56.27, shall be credited to the account. 83 84 Any unexpended funds remaining in the account at the end of the 85 fiscal year shall not lapse into the Seafood Fund, but shall 86 remain in the account. The department may expend any funds in the 87 account, subject to appropriation by the Legislature, for the

management, improvement and acquisition of coastal preserves.

89 There is established a special account to be known 90 as the "Mississippi Seafood Marketing Program Account" within the Seafood Fund. Monies required to be deposited into the account 91 92 under Section 27-19-56.27 and any funds received from any public 93 or private source for the purpose of promoting the Mississippi 94 seafood industry must be credited to the account. Any unexpended 95 funds remaining in the account at the end of the fiscal year do not lapse into the Seafood Fund, but remain in the account. 96 97 department may expend any funds in the account, subject to appropriation by the Legislature, to accomplish the purposes of 98

- 99 this account including, but not limited to, providing funds for 100 cobia stock enhancement programs.
- 101 (2) The fund shall be treated as a special trust fund and 102 interest earned on the principal shall be credited to the fund.
- 103 (3) The secretary of the commission shall keep accurate
 104 reports of monies handled as a part of the permanent records of
 105 the commission, and the State Treasurer shall furnish the
 106 secretary of the commission such forms as may be needed, and the
 107 secretary shall account for such forms in his reports to the
 108 Treasurer.
- 109 SECTION 3. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of 110 the House of Representatives shall each appoint one (1) member of 111 their respective legislative houses to serve as members of the 112 Commission on Marine Resources and Department of Marine Resources Oversight Committee. The members of the committee shall be 113 114 entitled (a) to attend meetings of the Commission, (b) to receive 115 all budgets, reports, audits and all financial and other information distributed to the commissioners, (c) to meet and 116 117 confer with the commissioners and staff of the department, and (d) 118 to perform such other activities as may be necessary or proper in 119 discharging their responsibilities of oversight and liaison with 120 their respective houses of the Legislature. The members of the committee shall have no jurisdiction or vote on any matter within 121 122 the jurisdiction of the commission or the department. The members

of the Oversight Committee shall be bound by the same limitations

124	as to confidentiality of information regarding products, processes
125	or the internal affairs of private businesses, as are imposed upon
126	the commissioners and staff of the department. When the
127	Legislature is not in session, members shall be paid per diem and
128	all actual and necessary expenses, including mileage expenses,
129	from their respective contingent expense funds at the rate
130	authorized for committee meetings when the Legislature is not in
131	session; however, no per diem and expenses will be paid when the
132	Legislature is in session. The terms of the members of the
133	oversight committee shall expire at the end of their terms of
134	office.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after its passage.

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
