COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 130

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE AUTHORITY FOR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF SCHOOL-AGE 3 CHILDREN TO OBTAIN CERTIFICATES OF EXEMPTION FROM VACCINATIONS FOR MEDICAL REASONS IN ORDER FOR THE CHILD TO ATTEND SCHOOL; TO 5 PROVIDE THAT IN ORDER TO CLAIM AN EXEMPTION FROM A REQUIRED 6 VACCINATION FOR MEDICAL REASONS, THE CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN 7 MUST PRESENT A CERTIFICATE FROM THE CHILD'S PHYSICIAN STATING THAT 8 THE REQUIRED VACCINE IS MEDICALLY CONTRAINDICATED OR POSES A 9 SIGNIFICANT RISK TO OR WOULD BE INJURIOUS TO THE HEALTH AND WELL-BEING OF THE CHILD OR ANY MEMBER OF THE CHILD'S HOUSEHOLD; TO 10 11 PROVIDE THAT EXEMPTIONS FROM VACCINATIONS FOR MEDICAL REASONS WILL 12 BE VALID FOR ONE YEAR; TO PROVIDE THAT THE OPINION OF THE 13 PHYSICIAN WHO SIGNED THE CERTIFICATE IS FINAL AND THE SCHOOL TO WHICH THE CERTIFICATE IS PRESENTED MUST ACCEPT THE CERTIFICATE; 14 15 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 16 17 **SECTION 1.** Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 18 19 41-23-37. (1) Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer 20 shall specify such immunization practices as may be considered 21 best for the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing 22 shall be promulgated annually or more often, if necessary. 23 (2) Except as provided * * * in this section, it shall be

unlawful for any child to attend any school, kindergarten or

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- 25 similar type facility intended for the instruction of children
- 26 (hereinafter called "schools"), either public or private, with the
- 27 exception of any legitimate home instruction program_{\underline{I}} as defined
- 28 in Section 37-13-91 * * * for ten (10) or * * * fewer children who
- 29 are related within the third degree computed according to the
- 30 civil law to the operator, unless they * * * have a certificate of
- 31 <u>vaccination or have submitted to the school a certificate of</u>
- 32 exemption from vaccination.
- 33 (3) (a) A certificate of exemption from vaccination for
- 34 medical reasons that meets the requirements of this subsection may
- 35 be * * * presented to the school on behalf of a child * * * by the
- 36 child's parent or guardian.
- 37 (b) To claim an exemption from a required vaccination
- 38 for medical reasons, the parent or guardian of the child must
- 39 present a certificate signed by the child's physician (M.D. or
- 40 D.O.), who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine in
- 41 Mississippi or an adjacent state and who has examined the child,
- 42 in which it is stated that, in the physician's medical judgment
- 43 and opinion, the required vaccine is medically contraindicated or
- 44 poses a significant risk to or would be injurious to the health
- 45 and well-being of the child or any member of the child's
- 46 household. Unless it is written in the certificate that a
- 47 lifelong condition exists, the certificate of exemption is valid
- 48 for one (1) year from the date signed by the physician.

49	(c) If a certificate of exemption from vaccination
50	meets the requirements of this subsection, the opinion of the
51	physician who signed the certificate is final and may be not
52	contradicted or rejected by the local health officer or the State
53	Department of Health, and the school to which the certificate is
54	presented must accept the certificate.
55	(4) Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local
56	health officers or physicians on forms specified by the
57	Mississippi State Board of Health. These forms shall be the only
58	acceptable means for showing compliance with * * * the
59	immunization requirements of this section, and the responsible
60	school officials shall file the form with the child's record.
61	(5) If a child * * * offers to enroll at a school without
62	having completed the required vaccinations or submitting a

- 61 (5) If a child * * * offers to enroll at a school without
 62 having completed the required vaccinations or submitting a
 63 certificate of exemption from vaccination, the local health
 64 officer may grant a period of time up to ninety (90) days for
 65 * * that completion when, in the opinion of the health officer,
 66 such delay will not cause undue risk to the child, the school or
 67 the community. No child without a certificate of exemption from
 68 vaccination shall be enrolled without having had at least one (1)
 69 dose of each specified vaccine.
- 10 (6) Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall term of school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in charge of each school shall report to the county or local health officer, on forms provided by the Mississippi State Board of

- 74 Health, the number of children enrolled by age or grade or both,
- 75 the number fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing
- 76 vaccination requirements, and the number exempt from vaccination
- 77 by reason * * * of a certificate of exemption.
- 78 (7) Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening
- 79 of the fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge
- 80 of each school shall certify to the local or county health officer
- 81 that all children enrolled are in compliance with the immunization
- 82 requirements of this section or have submitted a certificate of
- 83 exemption from vaccination.
- 84 (8) For the purpose of assisting in supervising the
- 85 immunization status of the children the local health officer, or
- 86 his designee, may inspect the children's records or be furnished
- 87 certificates of * * vaccination compliance by the school.
- 88 (9) It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge
- 89 of each school to enforce the requirements for immunization and
- 90 exemption from vaccination. Any child not in compliance at the
- 91 end of ninety (90) days from the opening of the fall term must be
- 92 suspended until in compliance, unless the health officer * * \star
- 93 attributes the delay to lack of supply of vaccine or some other
- 94 such factor clearly making compliance impossible.
- 95 (10) Failure to enforce provisions of this * * * section
- 96 shall constitute a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, be punishable
- 97 by fine or imprisonment or both.

98	(11) The State Department of Health shall publish on its
99	website and make available to each local health officer in each
100	school district a list identifying the vaccinations required of
101	students for attendance, in addition those vaccinations the
102	department recommends for proper immunization.
103	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
104	and after July 1, 2015.
