HOUSE BILL NO. 130

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO AUTHORIZE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF SCHOOL-AGE CHILDREN TO OBTAIN 3 CERTIFICATES OF EXEMPTION FROM VACCINATIONS FOR MEDICAL REASONS OR 4 FOR CONSCIENTIOUS BELIEFS IN ORDER FOR THE CHILD TO ATTEND SCHOOL; 5 TO PROVIDE THAT IN ORDER TO CLAIM AN EXEMPTION FROM A REQUIRED 6 VACCINATION FOR MEDICAL REASONS, THE CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST PRESENT A STATEMENT FROM THE CHILD'S PHYSICIAN STATING THAT 7 THE REQUIRED VACCINE IS MEDICALLY CONTRAINDICATED OR POSES A 8 9 SIGNIFICANT RISK TO THE HEALTH AND WELL-BEING OF THE CHILD OR ANY 10 MEMBER OF THE CHILD'S HOUSEHOLD; TO PROVIDE THAT IN ORDER TO 11 OBTAIN AN EXEMPTION FROM A REQUIRED VACCINATION FOR CONSCIENTIOUS 12 BELIEFS, THE CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST COMPLETE AN AFFIDAVIT 13 ON AN EXEMPTION FORM PROVIDED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; TO PROVIDE THAT THE EXEMPTION FORM FOR CONSCIENTIOUS BELIEFS MUST 14 15 CONTAIN A STATEMENT INDICATING THAT THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN 16 UNDERSTANDS THE BENEFITS AND RISKS OF VACCINATIONS AND THE 17 BENEFITS AND RISKS OF NOT BEING VACCINATED, AND MUST CONTAIN A 18 SECTION WHERE THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN CAN LIST THE SPECIFIC VACCINATION OR VACCINATIONS FOR WHICH THE EXEMPTION APPLIES; TO 19 20 PROVIDE THAT EXEMPTIONS FROM VACCINATIONS FOR MEDICAL REASONS OR 21 FOR CONSCIENTIOUS BELIEFS WILL BE VALID FOR ONE YEAR; AND FOR 22 RELATED PURPOSES.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

24 SECTION 1. Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

25 amended as follows:

41-23-37. (1) Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer
shall specify such immunization practices as may be considered

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28 best for the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing 29 shall be promulgated annually or more often, if necessary. (2) Except as provided **\* \* \*** in this section, it shall be 30 unlawful for any child to attend any school, kindergarten or 31 32 similar type facility intended for the instruction of children 33 (hereinafter called "schools"), either public or private, with the exception of any legitimate home instruction program, as defined 34 35 in Section 37-13-91 \* \* \* for ten (10) or \* \* \* fewer children who 36 are related within the third degree computed according to the civil law to the operator, unless they \* \* \* have a certificate of 37 38 vaccination or have submitted to the school a certificate of 39 exemption from vaccination. 40 (3) (a) A certificate of exemption from vaccination for 41 medical reasons may be offered to the school on behalf of a child 42 \* \* \* by the child's parent or guardian. 43 (b) To claim an exemption from a required vaccination for medical reasons, the parent or guardian of the child must 44 45 present a statement signed by the child's physician (M.D. or 46 D.O.), who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine in 47 the United States and who has examined the child, in which it is 48 stated that, in the physician's opinion, the required vaccine is 49 medically contraindicated or poses a significant risk to the 50 health and well-being of the child or any member of the child's 51 household. Unless it is written in the statement that a lifelong

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52 condition exists, the exemption statement is valid for one (1)

53 year from the date signed by the physician.

54 (4) (a) A certificate of exemption from vaccination for
55 <u>conscientious beliefs may be offered to the school on behalf of a</u>
56 child by the child's parent or guardian.

57 (b) To claim an exemption from a required vaccination 58 for conscientious beliefs, the parent or a guardian of the child 59 must complete an affidavit on an exemption form provided by the 60 State Department of Health. The affidavit must be signed by the 61 parent or guardian and the affidavit must be notarized.

62 (c) A blank exemption form for conscientious beliefs 63 may be obtained by the parent or guardian by submitting a written 64 request for the exemption form to the State Department of Health 65 or the county health department or by downloading the exemption 66 form from the website of the State Department of Health.

67 (d) The exemption form for conscientious beliefs must
68 contain a statement indicating that the parent or guardian
69 understands the benefits and risks of vaccinations and the
70 benefits and risks of not being vaccinated. In addition, it must

71 contain a section where the parent or guardian can list the

72 specific vaccination or vaccinations for which the exemption

73 applies. The completed and notarized exemption form shall expire

74 one (1) year from the date signed by the parent or guardian. The

75 parent or guardian must submit a new form every school calendar

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## 76 year for which they are claiming an exemption from vaccination 77 requirements for conscientious beliefs.

78 (5) Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local 79 health officers or physicians on forms specified by the 80 Mississippi State Board of Health. These forms shall be the only 81 acceptable means for showing compliance with \* \* \* the immunization requirements of this section, and the responsible 82 83 school officials shall file the form with the child's record. 84 If a child **\* \* \*** offers to enroll at a school without (6) 85 having completed the required vaccinations or submitting a certificate of exemption from vaccination, the local health 86 87 officer may grant a period of time up to ninety (90) days for 88 \* \* \* that completion when, in the opinion of the health officer, such delay will not cause undue risk to the child, the school or 89 the community. No child without a certificate of exemption from 90 91 vaccination shall be enrolled without having had at least one (1) 92 dose of each specified vaccine.

Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall 93 (7) 94 term of school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in 95 charge of each school shall report to the county or local health 96 officer, on forms provided by the Mississippi State Board of 97 Health, the number of children enrolled by age or grade or both, the number fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing 98 99 vaccination requirements, and the number exempt from vaccination by reason \* \* \* of a certificate of exemption. 100

No. 130 15/HR31/R699 PAGE 4 (RF\JAB) 101 <u>(8)</u> Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening 102 of the fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge 103 of each school shall certify to the local or county health officer 104 that all children enrolled are in compliance with <u>the</u> immunization 105 requirements of this section.

106 (9) For the purpose of assisting in supervising the 107 immunization status of the children the local health officer, or 108 his designee, may inspect the children's records or be furnished 109 certificates of **\* \* \*** vaccination compliance by the school.

110 <u>(10)</u> It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge 111 of each school to enforce the requirements for immunization <u>and</u> 112 <u>exemption from vaccination</u>. Any child not in compliance at the 113 end of ninety (90) days from the opening of the fall term must be 114 suspended until in compliance, unless the health officer **\* \* \*** 115 attribute<u>s</u> the delay to lack of supply of vaccine or some other 116 such factor clearly making compliance impossible.

117 <u>(11)</u> Failure to enforce provisions of this \* \* \* <u>section</u>
118 shall constitute a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, be punishable
119 by fine or imprisonment or both.

120 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 121 and after July 1, 2015.

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
