## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 215

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-25-18, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT PHYSICIANS WHO ARE CURRENTLY SERVING ON ACTIVE DUTY IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES OR IN THE NATIONAL GUARD OR A RESERVE COMPONENT OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED 5 STATES OR WHO ARE WORKING AS PHYSICIANS FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS MAY RECEIVE A SPECIAL VOLUNTEER MEDICAL LICENSE 7 UNDER WHICH THEY MAY DONATE THEIR SERVICES FOR THE TREATMENT OF 8 NEEDY PERSONS OR PERSONS IN MEDICALLY UNDERSERVED AREAS OF THE 9 STATE; TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL LICENSURE TO ISSUE 10 A SPECIAL VOLUNTEER LICENSE FOR PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS WHO WISH TO DONATE THEIR EXPERTISE FOR THE CARE AND TREATMENT OF INDIGENT AND 11 12 NEEDY PERSONS OR PERSONS IN MEDICALLY UNDERSERVED AREAS OF THE 13 STATE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 15 SECTION 1. Section 73-25-18, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 16 17 73-25-18. (1) (a) There is established a special volunteer 18 medical license for physicians who are retired from active 19 practice, or are currently serving on active duty in the Armed 20 Forces of the United States or in the National Guard or a reserve 21 component of the Armed Forces of the United States, or are working 22 as physicians for the Department of Veterans Affairs, and wish to

donate their expertise for the medical care and treatment of

- 24 indigent and needy persons or persons in medically underserved
- 25 areas of the state. The special volunteer medical license shall
- 26 be issued by the State Board of Medical Licensure to eligible
- 27 physicians without the payment of any application fee, examination
- 28 fee, license fee or renewal fee, shall be issued for a fiscal year
- 29 or part thereof, and shall be renewable annually upon approval of
- 30 the board.
- 31 ( \* \* \*b) A physician must meet the following
- 32 requirements to be eligible for a special volunteer medical
- 33 license:
- 34 (\* \* \*i) Completion of a special volunteer
- 35 medical license application, including documentation of the
- 36 physician's medical school or osteopathic school graduation and
- 37 practice history;
- 38 (\* \* \*ii) Documentation that the physician has
- 39 been previously issued an unrestricted license to practice
- 40 medicine in Mississippi or in another state of the United States
- 41 and that he or she has never been the subject of any medical
- 42 disciplinary action in any jurisdiction;
- 43 (\* \* \*iii) Acknowledgement and documentation that
- 44 the physician's practice under the special volunteer medical
- 45 license will be exclusively and totally devoted to providing
- 46 medical care to needy and indigent persons in Mississippi or
- 47 persons in medically underserved areas in Mississippi; and

48	( $\star$ $\star$ $\underline{iv}$ ) Acknowledgement and documentation that
49	the physician will not receive any payment or compensation, either
50	direct or indirect, or have the expectation of any payment or
51	compensation, for any medical services rendered under the special
52	volunteer medical license.
53	(2) <u>(a)</u> There is established a special volunteer license
54	for physician assistants who are retired from active practice, or
55	are currently serving on active duty in the Armed Forces of the
56	United States or in the National Guard or a reserve component of
57	the Armed Forces of the United States, or are working as physician
58	assistants for the Department of Veterans Affairs, and wish to
59	donate their expertise for the care and treatment of indigent and
60	needy persons or persons in medically underserved areas of the
61	state. The special volunteer physician assistant license shall be
62	issued by the State Board of Medical Licensure to eligible
63	physician assistants without the payment of any application fee,
64	examination fee, license fee or renewal fee, shall be issued for a
65	fiscal year or part thereof, and shall be renewable annually upon
66	approval of the board.
67	(b) A physician assistant must meet the following
68	requirements to be eligible for a special volunteer physician
69	assistant license:
70	(i) Completion of an application for a special

volunteer physician assistant license, including documentation of

72	the physician assistant's educational qualifications and practice
73	history;
74	(ii) Documentation that the physician assistant
75	has been previously issued an unrestricted physician assistant
76	license in Mississippi or in another state of the United States
77	and that he or she has never been the subject of any disciplinary
78	action in any jurisdiction;
79	(iii) Acknowledgement and documentation that the
80	physician assistant's practice under the special volunteer
81	physician assistant license will be exclusively and totally
82	devoted to providing care to needy and indigent persons in
83	Mississippi or persons in medically underserved areas in
84	Mississippi; and
85	(iv) Acknowledgement and documentation that the
86	physician assistant will not receive any payment or compensation,
87	either direct or indirect, or have the expectation of any payment
88	or compensation, for any services rendered under the special
89	volunteer physician assistant license.
90	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
91	and after July 1, 2015.
