HOUSE BILL NO. 449

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT SCHOOL DISTRICT PERSONNEL FROM ENGAGING IN

POLITICAL ACTIVITY WHILE IN PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES; TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF DISTRICT TIME, PROPERTY, EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES OR PERSONNEL TO PRODUCE, DISTRIBUTE, 5 DISSEMINATE, CIRCULATE OR COMMUNICATE ANY MATERIAL OR INFORMATION 6 IN SUPPORT OR OPPOSITION OF POLITICAL ACTIVITY; TO PROHIBIT 7 SOLICITING OR ATTEMPTS TO SOLICIT FUNDS FROM SCHOOL DISTRICT PERSONNEL ON BEHALF OF A POLITICAL ACTIVITY; TO PROHIBIT POLITICAL 8 ACTIVITY ON SCHOOL PROPERTY; TO PROVIDE THAT ANY LIMITATION 9 10 IMPOSED ON DISTRICT PERSONNEL ENGAGING IN POLITICAL ACTIVITY SHALL 11 NOT BE APPLICABLE TO SUCH PERSON ON THEIR PERSONAL TIME; TO 12 REQUIRE SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENTS AND SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS TO REMAIN 13 NEUTRAL BY NOT ENGAGING IN POLITICAL ACTIVITIES ON SCHOOL PROPERTY AND BY NOT PUBLICLY SUPPORTING OR OPPOSING ANY POLITICAL PARTY; TO 14 15 PRESCRIBE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED 16 PURPOSES. 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 18 SECTION 1. As used in this act, the following terms shall 19 have their meanings ascribed in this section, unless the context 20 clearly requires otherwise: 21 (a) "Political activity" includes any and all efforts of individuals, individually or in concert with others, which are 22 23 done for the purpose of supporting or opposing any political

party, philosophy or issue in an election or done to affect the

- 25 outcome thereof, campaigning on behalf of a specific candidate or
- 26 issue or lobbying the Legislature for policy change.
- 27 (b) "School facilities" means any buildings and
- 28 grounds, owned, operated, controlled or maintained by the school
- 29 board, including, but not limited to, schools, ancillary
- 30 facilities, athletic facilities, and office complexes.
- 31 (c) "Political events" include any and all meetings,
- 32 fund raisers, gatherings, or other such events organized or
- 33 conducted for the purpose of supporting or opposing any candidate
- 34 for public office, any issue which is or may be scheduled to
- 35 appear on an election ballot, or any political party or
- 36 organization.
- 37 **SECTION 2.** (1) Each school board member, superintendent,
- 38 administrator, officer or employee retains all rights and
- 39 obligations of citizenship provided in the Constitution and Laws
- 40 of the State of Mississippi and the Constitution of the United
- 41 States. However, no school board member, superintendent,
- 42 administrator, officer or employee shall:
- 43 (a) Use school district time, property, equipment,
- 44 supplies or personnel to produce, distribute, disseminate,
- 45 circulate or communicate any material or information in support or
- 46 opposition of any political party, philosophy or issue in an
- 47 election or done to affect the outcome thereof, campaigning on
- 48 behalf of a specific candidate or issue or lobbying the
- 49 Legislature for policy change. For purpose of this paragraph,

- 50 "time" means the regularly scheduled hours of operation designated
- 51 by the school board for the performance of official duties and
- 52 responsibilities associated with the position for which an
- 53 individual is employed;
- 54 (b) Use his or her official position in any way to
- 55 influence or attempt to influence, district personnel to support
- or oppose any political party, philosophy or issue in an election
- 57 or done to affect the outcome thereof, campaigning on behalf of a
- 58 specific candidate or issue or lobbying the Legislature for policy
- 59 change. Such prohibition shall include, but not be limited to,
- 60 any form of advocacy or opposition in a classroom or school
- 61 setting or other school related employment relationship;
- 62 (c) Participate in any political activity while in the
- 63 performance of his or her official duty;
- (d) Attempt, either directly or indirectly, to coerce
- 65 political activity or political support from any other school
- 66 district personnel; or
- 67 (e) Solicit or attempt to solicit funds from school
- 68 district personnel on behalf of a candidate, party or issue, or
- 69 any campaign or lobbying effort. Nothing contained in this
- 70 section shall be interpreted to prohibit an employee from
- 71 suggesting to another employee, outside of normal work hours in a
- 72 noncoercive manner, that he or she may voluntarily contribute to a
- 73 fund which is administered by a party, committee, organization

- 74 agency, person, labor union or other employee organization for
- 75 political purposes.
- 76 The following forms of political activity shall be
- 77 prohibited at all times on school property:
- 78 Distribution of campaign material, including cards, (a)
- 79 brochures, and other items defined by law as political
- 80 advertising, to students or employees;
- 81 Political signs, whether placed on or in the
- building, or elsewhere on school property. "Political signs" as 82
- used in this section shall not include advertising on items of 83
- 84 clothing, bumper stickers, sunshades or other signs permanently
- 85 affixed to a vehicle and which are legal for roadway traffic; and
- 86 Solicitation, in any manner, of students or
- 87 employees to become engaged in political activity.
- 88 SECTION 3. (1) Each employee of a public school district
- 89 shall have the right to actively participate in political
- 90 activities on behalf of any candidate, party, or issue during the
- time he or she is not scheduled to be on duty. That time shall 91
- 92 include authorized personal or vacation leave. However, the
- 93 employee may not, at any time:
- Solicit or attempt to solicit funds as prohibited 94
- 95 by Section 2(1)(e);
- 96 Attempt to coerce other employees as prohibited by
- 97 Section 2(1)(d); or

- 98 (c) Misuse school district time, property, equipment,
- 99 supplies or personnel to produce, distribute, disseminate,
- 100 circulate or communicate any material or information, or misuse
- 101 his or her official position, as prohibited by Section 2(1)(a) and
- 102 (b).
- 103 (2) The school superintendent and school board members
- 104 holding office shall remain neutral by not engaging in political
- 105 activities on school property and by not publicly supporting or
- 106 opposing any political party, philosophy or issue in an election
- 107 or done to affect the outcome thereof, campaigning on behalf of a
- 108 specific candidate or issue, or lobbying the Legislature for
- 109 policy change, other than his or her own campaign.
- SECTION 4. (1) Any person who violates this act, shall be
- 111 quilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be fined up to
- 112 Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).
- 113 (2) Upon a second or subsequent conviction of any person for
- 114 a violation of any provision of this act, the offense being
- 115 committed within a period of two (2) years, such person shall be
- 116 guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be fined up to
- 117 Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and revocation of professional
- 118 license and certification by the State Board of Education.
- 119 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 120 and after July 1, 2015.
