HOUSE BILL NO. 582

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-21-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE BASE SALARIES OF ASSISTANT TEACHERS BY THE AMOUNT OF ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS BEGINNING WITH THE 2015-2016 SCHOOL YEAR, TO A TOTAL OF THIRTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS IN ADDITION TO THE ONE PERCENT INCREASE TO THE BASE SALARY ESTABLISHED FOR ASSISTANT TEACHERS FOR EACH ONE PERCENT THAT THE SINE DIE GENERAL FUND REVENUE ESTIMATE GROWTH EXCEEDS FIVE PERCENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 37-21-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 12 37-21-7. (1) This section shall be referred to as the
- 13 "Mississippi Elementary Schools Assistant Teacher Program," the
- 14 purpose of which shall be to provide an early childhood education
- 15 program that assists in the instruction of basic skills. The
- 16 State Board of Education is authorized, empowered and directed to
- 17 implement a statewide system of assistant teachers in kindergarten
- 18 classes and in the first, second and third grades. The assistant
- 19 teacher shall assist pupils in actual instruction under the strict
- 20 supervision of a licensed teacher.

- 21 (2) Except as otherwise authorized under subsection
- 22 (7), each school district shall employ the total number of
- 23 assistant teachers funded under subsection (6) of this section.
- The superintendent of each district shall assign the assistant 24
- 25 teachers to the kindergarten, first-, second- and third-grade
- 26 classes in the district in a manner that will promote the maximum
- 27 efficiency, as determined by the superintendent, in the
- instruction of skills such as verbal and linguistic skills, 28
- 29 logical and mathematical skills, and social skills.
- 30 If a licensed teacher to whom an assistant teacher (b)
- 31 has been assigned is required to be absent from the classroom, the
- 32 assistant teacher may assume responsibility for the classroom in
- 33 lieu of a substitute teacher. However, no assistant teacher shall
- assume sole responsibility of the classroom for more than three 34
- (3) consecutive school days. Further, in no event shall any 35
- 36 assistant teacher be assigned to serve as a substitute teacher for
- 37 any teacher other than the licensed teacher to whom that assistant
- teacher has been assigned. 38
- 39 Assistant teachers shall have, at a minimum, a high
- 40 school diploma or a High School Equivalency Diploma equivalent,
- 41 and shall show demonstratable proficiency in reading and writing
- 42 The State Department of Education shall develop a testing
- procedure for assistant teacher applicants to be used in all 43
- 44 school districts in the state.

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- 46 shall:
- 47 (i) Submit a plan on the implementation of a
- 48 reading improvement program to the State Department of Education;
- 49 and
- 50 (ii) Develop a plan of educational accountability
- 51 and assessment of performance, including pretests and posttests,
- 52 for reading in Grades 1 through 6.
- 53 (b) Additionally, each school district shall:
- (i) Provide annually a mandatory preservice
- 55 orientation session, using an existing in-school service day, for
- 56 administrators and teachers on the effective use of assistant
- 57 teachers as part of a team in the classroom setting and on the
- 58 role of assistant teachers, with emphasis on program goals;
- (ii) Hold periodic workshops for administrators
- 60 and teachers on the effective use and supervision of assistant
- 61 teachers;
- 62 (iii) Provide training annually on specific
- 63 instructional skills for assistant teachers;
- 64 (iv) Annually evaluate their program in accordance
- 65 with their educational accountability and assessment of
- 66 performance plan; and
- (v) Designate the necessary personnel to supervise
- 68 and report on their program.
- 69 (5) The State Department of Education shall:

70	(a) Develop and assist in the implementation of a
71	statewide uniform training module, subject to the availability of
72	funds specifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature, which
73	shall be used in all school districts for training administrators,
74	teachers and assistant teachers. The module shall provide for the
75	consolidated training of each assistant teacher and teacher to
76	whom the assistant teacher is assigned, working together as a
77	team, and shall require further periodic training for
78	administrators, teachers and assistant teachers regarding the role
79	of assistant teachers;

- 80 (b) Annually evaluate the program on the district and state level. Subject to the availability of funds specifically 81 82 appropriated therefor by the Legislature, the department shall 83 develop: (i) uniform evaluation reports, to be performed by the principal or assistant principal, to collect data for the annual 84 85 overall program evaluation conducted by the department; or (ii) a 86 program evaluation model that, at a minimum, addresses process 87 evaluation; and
 - (c) Promulgate rules, regulations and such other standards deemed necessary to effectuate the purposes of this section. Noncompliance with the provisions of this section and any rules, regulations or standards adopted by the department may result in a violation of compulsory accreditation standards as established by the State Board of Education and the Commission on School Accreditation.

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95	(6) In addition to other funds allotted under the Minimum
96	Education or Adequate Education Program, each school district
97	shall be allotted sufficient funding for the purpose of employing
98	assistant teachers. No assistant teacher shall be paid less than
99	the amount he or she received in the prior school year. No school
100	district shall receive any funds under this section for any school
101	year during which the aggregate amount of the local contribution
102	to the salaries of assistant teachers by the district shall have
103	been reduced below such amount for the previous year.
104	For the * * * $\underline{2015-2016}$ school year and school years
105	thereafter, the minimum salary for assistant teachers shall
106	be * * * Thirteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$13,500.00).
107	In addition, for each one percent (1%) that the Sine Die
108	General Fund Revenue Estimate Growth exceeds five percent (5%) in
109	fiscal year * * * $\frac{2015}{}$, as certified by the Legislative Budget
110	Office to the State Board of Education and subject to the specific
111	appropriation therefor by the Legislature, the State Board of
112	Education shall revise the salary scale in the appropriate year to
113	provide an additional one percent (1%) across the board increase
114	in the base salaries for assistant teachers. The State Board of
115	Education shall revise the salaries prescribed above for assistant
116	teachers to conform to any adjustments made in prior fiscal years
117	due to revenue growth over and above five percent (5%). The
118	assistant teachers shall not be restricted to working only in the

- grades for which the funds were allotted, but may be assigned to other classes as provided in subsection (2)(a) of this section.
- 121 (7) (a) As an alternative to employing assistant teachers,
- 122 any school district may use the allotment provided under
- 123 subsection (6) of this section for the purpose of employing
- 124 licensed teachers for kindergarten, first-, second- and
- 125 third-grade classes; however, no school district shall be
- 126 authorized to use the allotment for assistant teachers for the
- 127 purpose of employing licensed teachers unless the district has
- 128 established that the employment of licensed teachers using such
- 129 funds will reduce the teacher: student ratio in the kindergarten,
- 130 first-, second- and third-grade classes. All state funds for
- 131 assistant teachers shall be applied to reducing teacher:student
- 132 ratio in Grades K-3.
- 133 It is the intent of the Legislature that no school district
- 134 shall dismiss any assistant teacher for the purpose of using the
- 135 assistant teacher allotment to employ licensed teachers. School
- 136 districts may rely only upon normal attrition to reduce the number
- 137 of assistant teachers employed in that district.
- 138 (b) Districts meeting the highest levels of
- 139 accreditation standards, as defined by the State Board of
- 140 Education, shall be exempted from the provisions of subsection (4)
- 141 of this section.
- 142 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 143 and after July 1, 2015.
