## HOUSE BILL NO. 1049 (As Sent to Governor)

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-13-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO REVISE THE ANNUAL SALARY OF COURT REPORTERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 9-13-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 9-13-19. (1) Court reporters for circuit and chancery
- 8 courts shall be paid an annual salary payable by the
- 9 Administrative Office of Courts not to exceed Forty Thousand Five
- 10 Hundred Dollars (\$40,500.00) for court reporters with five (5)
