5 WHEREAS, the Legislature and the State of Mississippi lost a 6 wonderful friend, colleague, gentleman and enlightened jurist with 7 the death of former State Senator Ray Hilman Montgomery (79), on 8 December 14, 2014; and

9 WHEREAS, Judge Ray Montgomery was born in Forest Grove, 10 Mississippi, on January 18, 1935, to Alvin Douglas Montgomery, 11 Sr., and Otice Ozella Bilbro Montgomery. At the age of 15, Ray 12 contracted polio and was a longtime volunteer and supporter of the 13 March of Dimes and served on the National Board of Easter Seals 14 for eight years; and

15 WHEREAS, he finished high school in Canton, Mississippi, 16 attended Hinds Junior College, pursued a college degree at 17 Millsaps and furthered his education by earning a law degree from

18 Jackson School of Law. He was a member of The Mississippi Bar, a 19 Mason, Wahabi Shriner, and lifelong member of First Baptist 20 Church, Canton; and

21 WHEREAS, a true public servant, Ray was elected Tax Assessor 22 of Madison County and served 8 years in that position. He was a 23 practicing attorney in Canton, elected to the Mississippi State Senate, serving two terms, and was elected and served as County 24 25 Judge. He was elected and served as Chancery Judge until his 26 retirement. In retirement, he was appointed by the Supreme Court 27 of Mississippi as a Special Chancellor and continued to hear 28 special cases until recently; and

29 WHEREAS, while in the Senate, Ray served as Chairman of the 30 Public Property Committee and was active in Public Health and 31 Welfare certificate of need issues; and

32 WHEREAS, Ray Montgomery was preceded in death by his parents, 33 and his sister, Mary Elizabeth O'Briant. He is survived by his 34 wife of 41 years, Dorothy Gill Montgomery; brother, Alvin Douglas 35 Montgomery, Jr.; many nieces, nephews and friends; and a special 36 thank you to longtime friends Alvin and Pat Ottis; and

37 WHEREAS, Ray Montgomery was one of the most respected members 38 of the Mississippi State Senate and of The Mississippi Bar. He 39 had a commanding presence but was soft-spoken. He excelled in a 40 variety of major responsibilities and served the Senate, The 41 Mississippi Bar, his constituents, colleagues and the State of 42 Mississippi exceptionally well.
