REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

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MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1049: Court reporters; increase salary for those in circuit, chancery and county courts.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 SECTION 1. Section 9-13-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
6 amended as follows:

7 9-13-19. (1) Court reporters for circuit and chancery 8 courts shall be paid an annual salary payable by the 9 Administrative Office of Courts not to exceed Forty Thousand Five 10 Hundred Dollars (\$40,500.00) for court reporters with five (5) 11 years' experience or less; not to exceed Forty-three Thousand Five 12 Hundred Dollars (\$43,500.00) for court reporters who have more 13 than five (5) years' experience but less than ten (10) years; and 14 not to exceed Forty-six Thousand Dollars (\$46,000.00) for court 15 reporters who have ten (10) years or more experience.
