## SENATE BILL NO. 2413

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-171, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS TO IMPLEMENT "PERSONAL 3 RESPONSIBILITY" EDUCATION INTO THE MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM BY JUNE 30, 2017, TO PRESCRIBE STANDARDS FOR THE 5 APPROVED PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY CURRICULUM AND TO EXTEND THE 6 AUTOMATIC REPEALER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 SECTION 1. Section 37-13-171, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 9 10 37-13-171. (1) The local school board of every public school district shall adopt a policy to implement \* \* \* 11 abstinence-only or abstinence-plus "personal responsibility" 12 13 education into its middle and high school curriculum by June 30, \* \*  $\frac{2012}{2017}$ , which instruction in those subjects shall be 14 implemented not later than the start of the \* \*  $\frac{*}{2012-2013}$ 15 2017-2018 school year or the local school board shall adopt the 16 program which has been developed by the Mississippi Department of 17 18 Human Services and the Mississippi Department of Health. Personal 19 responsibility education shall occur at least once in Grades 6 through 8 and at least once in Grades 9 through 12. Districts may 20

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21	choose a different curriculum for middle and high school if
22	applicable. The State Department of Education shall * * * approve
23	each district's curriculum for sex-related education and publish a
24	list of approved curriculum that is age, grade and developmentally
25	appropriate. Curriculum selected must have been deemed evidence
26	based and medically accurate by the Mississippi State Department
27	of Health. The State Department of Education shall establish a
28	protocol to be used by districts to provide continuity in teaching
29	the approved curriculum in a manner that is age, grade and
30	developmentally appropriate.
31	(2) * * * Abstinence-only education shall remain the state
32	standard for any sex-related education taught in the public
33	schools. For purposes of this section, abstinence-only education
34	includes any type of instruction or program which, at an
35	appropriate age and grade: Personal responsibility education
36	curriculum must include information that abstinence from sexual
37	activity is the only one hundred percent (100%) effective way to
38	prevent unintended pregnancy.

- 39 \* \* \* (a) Teaches the social, psychological and health
- 40 gains to be realized by abstaining from sexual activity, and the
- 41 likely negative psychological and physical effects of not
- 42 abstaining;
- 43 (b) Teaches the harmful consequences to the child, the
- 44 child's parents and society that bearing children out of wedlock
- 45 is likely to produce, including the health, educational, financial

46	and other difficulties the child and his or her parents are likely
47	to face, as well as the inappropriateness of the social and
48	economic burden placed on others;
49	(c) Teaches that unwanted sexual advances are
50	irresponsible and teaches how to reject sexual advances and how
51	alcohol and drug use increases vulnerability to sexual advances;
52	(d) Teaches that abstinence from sexual activity before
53	marriage, and fidelity within marriage, is the only certain way to
54	avoid out-of-wedlock pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases and
55	related health problems. The instruction or program may include a
56	discussion on condoms or contraceptives, but only if that
57	discussion includes a factual presentation of the risks and
58	failure rates of those contraceptives. In no case shall the
59	instruction or program include any demonstration of how condoms or
60	other contraceptives are applied;
61	(e) Teaches the current state law related to sexual
62	conduct, including forcible rape, statutory rape, paternity
63	establishment, child support and homosexual activity; and
64	(f) Teaches that a mutually faithful, monogamous
65	relationship in the context of marriage is the only appropriate
66	setting for sexual intercourse.
67	(3) A program or instruction on sex-related education need
68	not include every component listed in subsection (2) of this
69	section for abstinence-only education. However, no program or
70	instruction under an abstinence-only curriculum may include

71 anything that contradicts the excluded components. For purposes 72 of this section, abstinence-plus education includes every 73 component listed under subsection (2) of this section that is age 74 and grade appropriate, in addition to any other programmatic or 75 instructional component approved by the department, which shall 76 not include instruction and demonstrations on the application and 77 use of condoms. Abstinence-plus education may discuss other 78 contraceptives, the nature, causes and effects of sexually 79 transmitted diseases, or the prevention of sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV/AIDS, along with a factual presentation of 80 the risks and failure rates. 81 82 - (4) Any course containing sex-related education offered in 83 the public schools shall include instruction in either abstinence-only or abstinence-plus education. 84

- 65 (5) Local school districts, in their discretion, may host

  86 programs designed to teach parents how to discuss abstinence with

  87 their children.
- (\* \* \*63) There shall be no effort in \* \* \* either an

  89 abstinence-only or an abstinence-plus any curriculum to teach that

  90 abortion can be used to prevent the birth of a baby.
- 91 (\* \* \*74) At all times when sex-related education is 92 discussed or taught, boys and girls shall be separated according 93 to gender into different classrooms, sex-related education 94 instruction may not be conducted when boys and girls are in the 95 company of any students of the opposite gender.

96	(5) The term "evidence based" means a curriculum must be
97	proven to reduce behavioral risk factors associated with teenage
98	pregnancy among teens age nineteen (19) and younger and be
99	evaluated using an experimental or quasi-experimental design, with
100	results published in peer reviewed, scientific journals.
101	(6) The State Department of Education shall provide the list
102	of approved curriculum to the local school boards, publish the
103	list on its website, and ensure school districts implement a
104	curriculum from the list. The State Department of Education, in
105	collaboration with the State Department of Health, will review and
106	update the list of approved curriculum at least every five (5)
107	years.
108	(7) The State Department of Education shall submit an annual
109	report to the House and Senate Education Committees that includes
110	information for each school district regarding the curriculum
111	adopted, the grades that received the instruction, the number of
112	students who were taught personal responsibility education by
113	grade level, and the total number of students in each grade.
114	School districts shall provide the necessary information to the
115	Department of Education no later than July 1 of every year.
116	(8) Each school shall provide a written consent form to the
117	parent/guardian of every student eligible to participate in
118	personal responsibility education at school registration yearly.
119	The consent form shall:

120	(a) Inform the parent/guardian of the curriculum used
121	by the school for the grade in which their child will be entering;
122	(b) Inform the parent/guardian that copies of the
123	curriculum are available for their review;
124	(c) Ask the parent/guardian if they choose for their
125	child to participate;
126	(d) Require a signature from the parent/guardian.

129	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
