COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 25

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 29-5-2, 29-5-81 AND 29-5-161, 1 2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY AND UPDATE THE INVENTORY OF 3 STATE REAL PROPERTIES OVER WHICH THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND 4 ADMINISTRATION HAS AUTHORITY, GENERAL SUPERVISION AND OVERSIGHT; 5 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 29-5-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 9 29-5-2. The duties of the Department of Finance and 10 Administration shall be as follows: 11 (a) (i) To exercise general supervision and care over 12 and keep in good condition the following state property located in the City of Jackson: the New State Capitol Building, the Woolfolk 13 State Office Building, the Carroll Gartin Justice Building, the 14 15 Walter Sillers Office Building, the Walter Sillers Parking Garage, the War Veterans' Memorial Building, the Charlotte Capers 16 17 Building, the William F. Winter Archives and History Building, * * * the Mississippi Museum Complex, the Gulf, Mobil 18 19 and Ohio Train Depot (GM&O Depot), the Old State Capitol Building,

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20 the Governor's Mansion, the Heber Ladner Building, the Burroughs 21 Building, the Robert E. Lee Office Building, the Robert E. Lee 22 Parking Garage, * * * the former Naval Reserve Center, 515 East 23 Amite Street, 620 North Street, 660 North Street, 700 North State 24 Street, the State Records Center, the Robert G. Clark, Jr. 25 Building, the Mississippi State Fairgrounds Complex, and all other 26 properties acquired in the same transaction at the time of the 27 purchase of the Robert E. Lee Hotel property from the First 28 Federal Savings and Loan Association of Jackson, Mississippi, 29 which properties are more particularly described in a warranty 30 deed heretofore executed and delivered on April 22, 1969, and filed for record in the Office of the Chancery Clerk of the First 31 Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi, located in 32 Jackson, Mississippi, on April 25, 1969, at 9:00 a.m., and 33 34 recorded in Deed Book No. 1822, Page 136 et seq., the former 35 Central High Building, * * * and the properties described in 36 Section 1 of Chapter 542, Laws of 2009.

37 (ii) To exercise general supervision and care over
38 and keep in good condition the Dr. Eldon Langston Bolton Building
39 located in Biloxi, Mississippi.

40 (iii) To exercise general supervision and care
41 over and keep in good condition the State Service Center, located
42 at the intersection of U.S. Highway 49 and John Merl Tatum
43 Industrial Drive in Hattiesburg, Mississippi.

59 (b) To assign suitable office space for the various 60 state departments, officers and employees who are provided with an office in any of the buildings under the jurisdiction or control 61 62 of the Department of Finance and Administration. However, the 63 assignment of space in the New Capitol Building shall be 64 designated by duly passed resolution of the combined Senate Rules 65 Committee and the House Management Committee, meeting as a joint 66 committee, approved by the Lieutenant Governor and Speaker of the House of Representatives. A majority vote of the members of the 67 68 Senate Rules Committee and a majority vote of the members of the

House Management Committee shall be required on all actions taken, resolutions or reports adopted, and all other matters considered by the full combined committee on occasions when the Senate Rules Committee and the House Management Committee shall meet as a full combined committee.

74 (C) To approve or disapprove with the concurrence of 75 the Public Procurement Review Board, any lease or rental 76 agreements by any state agency or department, including any state 77 agency financed entirely by federal and special funds, for space 78 outside the buildings under the jurisdiction of the Department of Finance and Administration, including space necessary for parking 79 80 to be used by state employees who work in the Woolfolk Building, 81 the Carroll Gartin Justice Building or the Walter Sillers Office 82 In no event shall any employee, officer, department, Building. 83 federally funded agency or bureau of the state be authorized to 84 enter into a lease or rental agreement without prior approval of 85 the Department of Finance and Administration and the Public 86 Procurement Review Board.

The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to use architects, engineers, building inspectors and other personnel for the purpose of making inspections as may be deemed necessary in carrying out its duties and maintaining the facilities.

93 through the Office of General Services, by lease or sublease

98 To approve or disapprove, after consultation with (e) 99 the Chairmen of the Senate and House Public Property Committees 100 and with the concurrence of the Public Procurement Review Board, 101 any lease or rental agreement for up to two thousand (2,000) 102 square feet of space in the Robert G. Clark, Jr. Building with a private entity who will provide healthcare and wellness services 103 104 to state employees. The department must select the entity using 105 the request for proposal process. In addition to satisfying any 106 other requirement for the Public Procurement Review Board's 107 approval, the department must demonstrate that any agreement 108 entered into under this paragraph will not impair or impede the 109 function of state agencies in this location. * * *

SECTION 2. Section 29-5-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

112 29-5-81. Grounds of public buildings over which the 113 Department of Finance and Administration has jurisdiction shall 114 comprise the following:

(a) In the City of Jackson, Mississippi:

116 (i) * * * <u>The grounds surrounding all state</u>
117 <u>buildings identified in Section 29-5-2(a)(i) and all seat of</u>

118 government property;

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Bounded on the north by Stadium Drive, on the west by the property of Mississippi Hospital and Medical Service, * * <u>on the south by</u>
<u>Woodrow Wilson Avenue</u>, on the southeast by property leased by the Mississippi Federation of Women's Clubs and on the east by North State Street;

126 (***<u>iii</u>) The Mississippi State Fairgrounds 127 Complex, including, but not limited to, the Mississippi Coliseum, 128 Trademart, Kirk Fordice Equine Center, Mississippi Street Armory, 129 and all arenas, barns, buildings, campgrounds and property 130 whatsoever; such property being bounded on the north by High 131 Street, on the west by Jefferson Street, on the east by Greymont 132 Street, and on the south by Greymont Street.

133 (b) The grounds of Dr. Eldon Langston Bolton Building:
134 Located in the City of Biloxi, Mississippi.

135 (c) The grounds of State Service Center: Located at 136 the intersection of U.S. Highway 49 and John Merl Tatum Industrial 137 Drive in the City of Hattiesburg, Mississippi.

(d) Any grounds of any property purchased, constructed or otherwise acquired by the State of Mississippi for conducting state business and not specifically under the supervision and care by any other state entity, but which is reasonably assumed the department would be responsible for such, as approved by the Public Procurement Review Board, including, but not limited to:

The grounds of the Mississippi Arts and 154 Entertainment Center. 155 Section 29-5-161, Mississippi Code of 1972, is SECTION 3. 156 amended as follows: 157 29-5-161. (1) As used in this section: 158 "Smoke" or "smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, (a) 159 burning, carrying or otherwise possessing any lighted cigarette, 160 cigar, pipe or any other object or device of any form that contains lighted tobacco. 161 162 "Government building" means * * * all state (b) 163 buildings identified in Section 29-5-2(a), the State Board of 164 Health * * * Complex, the Public Employees' Retirement System 165 Building * * * and any other facility in the state that is owned 166 or leased by the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution of the state and that is used for housing state 167 168 employees during the time of performance of their regular duties

No. 25 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 16/HR31/R1187CS PAGE 7 (DJ\JAB) 169 for the state; any building owned, rented, leased, occupied or 170 operated by the state, including the legislative, executive and 171 judicial branches of state government; any county, municipality or any other political subdivision of the state; any public 172 173 authority, commission, agency or public benefit corporation; or 174 any other separate corporate instrumentality or unit of state or local government. If only part of a facility is leased by the 175 176 state or an agency, department or institution of the state, or any 177 county, municipality or other political subdivision of the state, only the leased part of the facility will be considered to be a 178 179 government building for the purposes of this definition. The term 180 "government building" shall not include any building owned or 181 leased by the state institutions of higher learning or the public 182 community and junior colleges or any space in a government building used by law enforcement officers. 183

184 (C) "University or college classroom building" means 185 any building used by the state institutions of higher learning or 186 the public community and junior colleges exclusively for student 187 instructional purposes. The term includes classrooms, 188 auditoriums, theaters, laboratories, hallways and restrooms. 189 Smoking policies applicable in the private offices of faculty and 190 staff and other "smoking permitted" space may be determined by 191 each academic and administrative department.

192 (2) No person shall smoke in any government building, except193 as follows: The State Veterans Affairs Board may designate

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196 (3) No person shall smoke in any university or college197 classroom building.

(4) The person, agency or entity having jurisdiction or supervision over a government building or university/college classroom building shall not allow smoking in the government or university/college classroom building, except in designated smoking areas as authorized in subsection (2) of this section, and shall use reasonable efforts to prevent smoking in such building, including, but not limited to, the following:

(a) Posting appropriate signs informing employees,
invitees, guests and other persons that smoking is prohibited in
the building.

(b) Securing the removal of persons who smoke in thebuilding.

210 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 211 and after its passage.
