1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 0 1 1 1 2 1 3 4 4 1 1 1 2 1 1 1 1 1 1 2 1 1 1 1 1 1 1	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE MISSISSIPPI RURAL HOSPITAL TRANSITION AND IMPROVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM UNDER THE DIRECTION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING GRANTS TO MISSISSIPPI RURAL HOSPITALS TO INCENTIVIZE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PLANS AND METHODOLOGIES THAT WILL INCREASE ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE IN THE COMMUNITY AND RURAL HOSPITAL SUSTAINABILITY; TO PRESCRIBE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM AND PROVIDE RESTRICTIONS ON THE USE OF GRANT MONIES RECEIVED BY RURAL HOSPITALS UNDER THE PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN ADVISORY COUNCIL TO REVIEW AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT ON THE PROGRAM AND AWARDS OF GRANTS; TO CREATE A SPECIAL FUND IN THE STATE TREASURY TO BE KNOWN AS THE MISSISSIPPI RURAL HOSPITAL TRANSITION AND IMPROVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM FUND. FROM WHICH GRANTS AND EXPENDITURES AUTHORIZED IN

L7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
L 8	SECTION 1. For purposes of this chapter:

- 19 (a) "Mississippi rural hospital" means any nonfederal
- 20 general acute care hospital that:
- (i) Has fifty (50) or fewer short term acute beds
- 22 exclusive of geriatric psychiatric beds or any other type of beds
- 23 and is located in a Mississippi county that has a population of
- 24 less than sixty thousand (60,000) or is located in a municipality

- 25 that has a population of less than seven thousand five hundred
- 26 (7,500); or
- 27 (ii) Is designated as a critical access hospital
- 28 under 42 CFR 485, Subpart F.
- 29 (b) "Department" means the State Department of Health.
- 30 (c) "Grant" means a grant by the department to a rural
- 31 hospital in accordance with this chapter.
- 32 (d) "Program" means the Mississippi Rural Hospital
- 33 Transition and Improvement Grant Program established in this
- 34 chapter.
- 35 **SECTION 2.** The Mississippi Rural Hospital Transition and
- 36 Improvement Grant Program is established under the direction and
- 37 administration of the State Department of Health for the purpose
- 38 of making grants to rural hospitals in Mississippi to incentivize
- 39 the implementation of plans and methodologies that will increase
- 40 access to health care in the community and rural hospital
- 41 sustainability.
- 42 **SECTION 3.** (1) Any Mississippi rural hospital desiring to
- 43 participate in the program shall make application for a grant to
- 44 the department in a form satisfactory to the department. The
- 45 department shall receive grant proposals from Mississippi rural
- 46 hospitals. All proposals shall be submitted in accordance with
- 47 the provisions of grant procedures, criteria and standards
- 48 developed and made public by the department. All approved grants

- 49 shall be awarded within thirty (30) days of approval by the
- 50 department.
- 51 (2) The department shall use the funds provided by this
- 52 chapter to make grants until July 1, 2019, to Mississippi rural
- 53 hospitals upon proposals made under subsection (1) of this
- 54 section. Grants that are awarded to Mississippi rural hospitals
- 55 shall only be used by those hospitals to implement plans and
- 56 methodologies that will increase access to health care in the
- 57 community and rural hospital sustainability. Grant monies may be
- 58 used by the rural hospital:
- 59 (a) To modify the type and extent of services provided
- 60 by the rural hospital, in order to reflect the needs of the rural
- 61 hospital and community;
- 62 (b) To develop hospital-based physician practices that
- 63 integrate hospital and existing medical practice facilities that
- 64 agree to transfer their practices, equipment, staffing, and
- 65 administration to the hospital;
- 66 (c) To establish a provider cooperative, a telemedicine
- 67 system, an electronic health records system, or a rural health
- 68 care system or to cover expenses associated with being designated
- 69 as a critical access hospital for the Medicare Rural Hospital
- 70 Flexibility Program; and/or
- 71 (d) To increase accessibility to health services in the
- 72 community that it serves and/or to address efficiency and
- 73 viability of the hospital.

74	(3)	Grants	received	bу	Mississippi	rural	hospitals	under
75	this chap	ter shal	l not be	use	ed:			

- 76 (a) To supplant federal funds traditionally received by
 77 those hospitals, but shall be used to supplement them; or
- 78 (b) To finance or satisfy any existing debt.
- 79 (4) The department shall develop regulations, procedures and 80 application forms to govern how grants will be awarded, shall 81 develop a plan to ensure that grants are awarded to most deserving 82 Mississippi rural hospitals, and shall develop an audit process to

assure that grant monies are used in the manner awarded.

- 84 (5) The department shall administer the fund created by
 85 Section 4 of this act for the purpose of providing service grants
 86 to Mississippi rural hospitals in accordance with this chapter and
 87 the following terms and conditions:
- 88 (a) The total amount of grants issued under this
 89 chapter shall be Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) per state
 90 fiscal year.
- 91 (b) No Mississippi rural hospital shall receive 92 assistance under this program in excess of Five Hundred Thousand 93 Dollars (\$500,000.00) per hospital per state fiscal year.
- 94 (c) Each Mississippi rural hospital receiving a grant 95 shall provide a yearly report to the department that details the 96 expenditure of grant funds and certify that the grant funds were 97 used in the manner awarded.

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98	(6)	The	department	shall	establish	an	advisory	council	to
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- 99 review and make recommendations to the department on the
- 100 Mississippi Rural Hospital Transition and Improvement Grant
- 101 Program and awards of grants. Those recommendations by the
- 102 advisory council shall not be binding upon the department, but
- 103 when a recommendation by the advisory council is not followed by
- 104 the department, the department shall keep a record of the reasons
- 105 for not accepting the advisory council's recommendation, and
- 106 provide for an appeals process.
- 107 (7) The composition of the advisory council shall be the
- 108 following:
- 109 (a) Two (2) employees of the department;
- 110 (b) One (1) representative of the Mississippi Hospital
- 111 Association;
- (c) Two (2) representatives from two (2) separate rural
- 113 hospitals that are critical access hospitals;
- 114 (d) Two (2) representatives from two (2) separate rural
- 115 hospitals that are not critical access hospitals; and
- (e) Two (2) licensed physicians from two (2) separate
- 117 areas designated as a rural county or rural area by the
- 118 department.
- 119 (8) The department may use a portion of any grant monies
- 120 received under this chapter to administer the program and to pay
- 121 reasonable expenses incurred by the advisory council; however, in

122	no	case	shall	more	than	Sixty	Thousand	Dollars	(\$60	,000.00))

- 123 annually be used for program expenses.
- 124 (9) No assistance shall be provided to a Mississippi rural
- 125 hospital under this chapter unless the Mississippi rural hospital
- 126 certifies to the department that it will not discriminate against
- 127 any employee or against any applicant for employment because of
- 128 race, religion, color, national origin, sex or age.
- 129 **SECTION 4.** There is created a special fund in the State
- 130 Treasury to be known as the Mississippi Rural Hospital Transition
- 131 and Improvement Grant Program Fund, from which grants and
- 132 expenditures authorized in connection with the program shall be
- 133 disbursed. All monies received by legislative appropriation to
- 134 carry out the purposes of this chapter shall be deposited into the
- 135 special fund.
- 136 **SECTION 5.** This act shall be codified as a new chapter in
- 137 Title 41, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 138 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 139 and after July 1, 2016, provided that the Legislature has provided
- 140 funding for the program to be established under this act.
