> COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 782

1 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT ENFORCEMENT OF CERTAIN LAWS REGARDING 2 FIREARMS, ACCESSORIES OR AMMUNITION; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR 3 STATE OFFICIALS, AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES WHO VIOLATE THIS ACT; TO 4 PROVIDE THAT THIS ACT DOES NOT APPLY TO THE ENFORCEMENT OF FEDERAL 5 LAW FOR THE SOLE PURPOSE OF TRANSFERRING FIREARMS; AND FOR RELATED 6 PURPOSES.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 SECTION 1. (1) Other than compliance with an order of the 9 court, any official, agent or employee of the State of Mississippi 10 or political subdivision or agency thereof, who knowingly and willfully orders an official, agent or employee of this state, or 11 political subdivision of this state, to enforce any executive 12 13 order, agency order, law not enrolled by the United States 14 Congress and signed by the President of the United States, rule, 15 regulation or administrative interpretation of a law or statute as provided in subsection (2) of this section upon a personal 16 17 firearm, a firearm accessory or ammunition shall: 18 (a) On a first violation, be liable for a civil penalty 19 not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), which shall be 20 deposited into the State General Fund; and H. 21 (b) On a second violation be quilty of a misdemeanor 22 and, upon conviction shall be fined not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or imprisoned for six (6) months, or both. 23 Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect the law 24 25 of search and seizure as set forth in Section 23, Article 3, 26 Mississippi Constitution of 1890, or as set forth in the Fourth, 27 Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments to the United States Constitution. 28 Notwithstanding anything else in this section, no private cause of 29 action exists under this section.

30 (2) No federal executive order, agency order, law not 31 enrolled by the United States Congress and signed by the President of the United States, rule, regulation or administrative 32 33 interpretation of a law or statute issued, enacted or promulgated after July 1, 2016, shall be knowingly and willfully ordered to be 34 enforced by any official, agent or employee of this state or a 35 36 political subdivision of this state if such action would be 37 contrary to Section 12, Article 3, Mississippi Constitution of 38 1890.

39 (3) "Enforcement" does not include the performance of any 40 act solely for the purpose of facilitating the transfer of 41 firearms under federal law. Any order of enforcement not excluded 42 by the provisions of this subsection that occurs on and after the 43 effective date of this act shall be and is a breach of the oath of 44 office of the official, agent or employee of this state or a 45 political subdivision of this state.
