HOUSE BILL NO. 938

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE AUTHORITY FOR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF SCHOOL-AGE 3 CHILDREN TO OBTAIN LETTERS OF EXEMPTION FROM VACCINATIONS OR LIMITING THE NUMBER OF VACCINATIONS FOR MEDICAL REASONS IN ORDER 5 FOR THE CHILD TO ATTEND SCHOOL; TO PROVIDE THAT IN ORDER TO CLAIM 6 AN EXEMPTION FROM A REQUIRED VACCINATION FOR MEDICAL REASONS, THE 7 CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST PRESENT A LETTER FROM A PHYSICIAN 8 STATING THAT THE REQUIRED VACCINE IS MEDICALLY CONTRAINDICATED OR 9 POSES A SIGNIFICANT RISK TO OR WOULD BE INJURIOUS TO THE HEALTH 10 AND WELL-BEING OF THE CHILD OR ANY MEMBER OF THE CHILD'S 11 HOUSEHOLD; TO PROVIDE THAT EXEMPTIONS FROM VACCINATIONS FOR 12 MEDICAL REASONS WILL BE VALID THE DURATION OF THE CHILD'S 13 ATTENDANCE IN A SCHOOL DISTRICT; TO PROVIDE THAT THE OPINION OF THE PHYSICIAN WHO SIGNED THE LETTER IS FINAL AND THE SCHOOL TO 14 1.5 WHICH THE LETTER IS PRESENTED MUST ACCEPT THE LETTER; AND FOR 16 RELATED PURPOSES. 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 18 SECTION 1. Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 19 amended as follows: 20 41-23-37. (1) Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer shall specify such immunization practices as may be considered 21 best for the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing 22 23 shall be promulgated annually or more often, if necessary. 24 (2) Except as provided * * * in this section, it shall be 25 unlawful for any child to attend any school, kindergarten or

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- 26 similar type facility intended for the instruction of children
- 27 (hereinafter called "schools"), either public or private, with the
- 28 exception of any legitimate home instruction program, as defined
- 29 in Section 37-13-91 * * * for ten (10) or * * * fewer children who
- 30 are related within the third degree computed according to the
- 31 civil law to the operator, unless they * * * have a certificate of
- 32 vaccination or have submitted to the school a letter of exemption
- 33 from vaccination.
- 34 (3) (a) A letter of exemption from vaccination or a letter
- 35 limiting the number of vaccinations for medical reasons that meets
- 36 the requirements of this subsection written on the stationery of a
- 37 physician may be * * * presented to the school on behalf of a
- 38 child * * * by the child's parent or guardian.
- 39 (b) To claim an exemption from a required vaccination
- 40 for medical reasons, the parent or guardian of the child must
- 41 present a letter written on the stationery of a physician (M.D. or
- 42 D.O.), who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine in
- 43 the United States and who has examined the child, in which it is
- 44 stated that, in the physician's medical judgment and opinion, the
- 45 required vaccine is medically contraindicated or poses a
- 46 significant risk to or would be injurious to the health and
- 47 well-being of the child or any member of the child's household.
- 48 Unless it is written in the letter that a lifelong condition
- 49 exists, the letter of exemption is valid for the duration of the
- 50 child's attendance in the school district. If a child is

- 52 subsection must be met for enrollment and admission in that school
- 53 district.
- 54 (c) If a letter of exemption from vaccination or letter
- 55 limiting the number of vaccinations meets the requirements of this
- 56 subsection, the opinion of the physician who signed the letter of
- 57 exemption is final and may be not contradicted or rejected by the
- 58 local health officer or the State Department of Health, and the
- 59 school to which the certificate is presented must accept the
- 60 letter of exemption.
- 61 (4) Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local
- 62 health officers or physicians on forms specified by the
- 63 Mississippi State Board of Health. These forms shall be the only
- 64 acceptable means for showing compliance with * * * the
- 65 immunization requirements of this section, and the responsible
- 66 school officials shall file the form with the child's record.
- 67 (5) If a child * * * offers to enroll at a school without
- 68 having completed the required vaccinations or submitting a letter
- 69 of exemption from vaccination or a letter limiting the number of
- 70 vaccinations, the local health officer may grant a period of time
- 71 up to ninety (90) days for \star \star that completion when, in the
- 72 opinion of the health officer, such delay will not cause undue
- 73 risk to the child, the school or the community. No child without
- 74 a certificate of exemption from vaccination or letter limiting the

- 75 <u>number of vaccinations</u> shall be enrolled without having had at
- 76 least one (1) dose of each specified vaccine.
- 77 <u>(6)</u> Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall
- 78 term of school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in
- 79 charge of each school shall report to the county or local health
- 80 officer, on forms provided by the Mississippi State Board of
- 81 Health, the number of children enrolled by age or grade or both,
- 82 the number fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing
- 83 vaccination requirements, and the number exempt from vaccination
- 84 by reason * * * of a letter of exemption.
- 85 (7) Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening
- 86 of the fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge
- 87 of each school shall certify to the local or county health officer
- 88 that all children enrolled are in compliance with the immunization
- 89 requirements of this section or have submitted a letter of
- 90 exemption from vaccination or a letter limiting the number of
- 91 vaccinations.
- 92 (8) For the purpose of assisting in supervising the
- 93 immunization status of the children the local health officer, or
- 94 his designee, may inspect the children's records or be furnished
- 95 certificates of * * * vaccination compliance by the school.
- 96 (9) It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge
- 97 of each school to enforce the requirements for immunization and
- 98 exemption from vaccination. Any child not in compliance at the
- 99 end of ninety (90) days from the opening of the fall term must be

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- 101 attribute \underline{s} the delay to lack of supply of vaccine or some other
- 102 such factor clearly making compliance impossible.
- 103 (10) Failure to enforce provisions of this * * * section
- 104 shall constitute a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, be punishable
- 105 by fine or imprisonment or both.
