HOUSE BILL NO. 939

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT A CHILD WILL BE EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENT TO 3 HAVE ANY SPECIFIC VACCINATION IN ORDER TO ATTEND A SCHOOL IF THE 4 CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN SUBMITS TO THE SCHOOL A LETTER OR 5 AFFIDAVIT THAT DOCUMENTS WHICH REQUIRED VACCINATIONS HAVE BEEN 6 GIVEN, AND WHICH VACCINATIONS HAVE NOT BEEN GIVEN ON THE BASIS 7 THAT THEY ARE CONTRARY TO HIS OR HER PHILOSOPHICAL OR RELIGIOUS 8 BELIEFS; TO PRESCRIBE THE CONTENT TO BE INCLUDED IN THE LETTER OR 9 AFFIDAVIT SUBMITTED TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR SCHOOL OF 10 ENROLLMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 12 SECTION 1. Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 amended as follows:

41-23-37. (1) Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer 14 15 shall specify such immunization practices as may be considered best for the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing 16 17 shall be promulgated annually or more often, if necessary. Except as provided hereinafter, it shall be unlawful for 18 (2) any child to attend any school, kindergarten or similar type 19 20 facility intended for the instruction of children (hereinafter 21 called "schools"), either public or private, with the exception of 22 any legitimate home instruction program as defined in Section H. B. No. 939 ~ OFFICIAL ~ G1/2 16/HR43/R546

23 37-13-91, * * * for ten (10) or * * * fewer children who are 24 related within the third degree computed according to the civil law to the operator, unless they * * * first have been vaccinated 25 26 against those diseases specified by the State Health Officer have 27 submitted a letter from a licensed physician specifying exemption 28 for medical purposes, or have submitted to the school a letter from a parent or legal guardian explaining, in specificity the 29 30 personal and philosophical aversion to vaccinations. 31 (3) A * * * letter of exemption from vaccination for medical reasons may be offered on behalf of a child by a duly licensed 32 33 physician in any state and written on the stationary of that 34 physician may be accepted by the local health officer and 35 presented to the school on behalf of a child when, in his opinion, 36 is contraindicated for medical reasons and that * * * the 37 exemption will not cause undue risk to the community. 38 (4) (a) No child seeking to attend any school shall be 39 required to comply with the requirements of this section for any specific vaccination in order to attend the school if the parent 40 41 or guardian or adult who has assumed responsibility for the 42 child's care and custody in the case of a minor, or the child 43 seeking admission if an emancipated minor, submits to the school a 44 letter or affidavit that documents which required vaccinations 45 have been given, and which vaccinations have not been given on the basis that they are contrary to his or her religious or 46 47 philosophical beliefs.

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48	(b) The parent or guardian or adult who has assumed
49	responsibility for the child's care and custody in the case of a
50	minor, or the child seeking admission if an emancipated minor,
51	shall submit a letter to the school district or school of
52	enrollment specifically stating the reasons for the philosophical
53	and religious exemption from vaccinations sought in addition to a
54	statement as to whether the aversion is to some or all
55	vaccinations. The letter or affidavit submitted shall also
56	include, but not be limited to, the following:
57	(i) A statement that the parent or guardian who
58	has assumed responsibility for the child's care and custody, in
59	the case of a minor, or the child seeking admission if an
60	emancipated minor, has been informed by a health care practitioner
61	and school district regarding the risks and benefits of receiving
62	vaccinations or not receiving vaccinations; and
63	(ii) A statement of understanding that:
64	1. At the discretion of the State Department
65	of Health or local health officer, the unimmunized child or
66	individual may be removed from day care or school during an
67	outbreak if the child or individual is not fully vaccinated; and
68	2. The child or individual shall not return
69	to school until the outbreak has been resolved and the State
70	Department of Health or local health officer approves the return
71	to school.

H. B. No. 939 16/HR43/R546 PAGE 3 (DJ\EW) 72 (5) Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local 73 health officers or physicians on forms specified by the 74 Mississippi State Board of Health. These forms shall be the only 75 acceptable means for showing compliance with these immunization 76 requirements, and the responsible school officials shall file the 77 form with the child's record.

78 (6) If a child who is not exempt under subsection (3) or (4) 79 of this section * * * offers to enroll at a school without having 80 completed the required vaccinations, the local health officer may grant a period of time up to ninety (90) days for such completion 81 82 when, in the opinion of the health officer, such delay will not 83 cause undue risk to the child, the school or the community. No 84 child shall be enrolled without having had at least one (1) dose 85 of each specified vaccine.

(7) Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall 86 87 term of school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in 88 charge of each school shall report to the county or local health officer, on forms provided by the Mississippi State Board of 89 90 Health, the number of children enrolled by age or grade or both, 91 the number fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing vaccination requirements, and the number exempt from vaccination 92 93 by reason for such exemption.

94 <u>(8)</u> Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening 95 of the fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge 96 of each school shall certify to the local or county health officer

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98 <u>or (4) of this section</u> are in compliance with immunization 99 requirements.

100 (9) For the purpose of assisting in supervising the 101 immunization status of the children the local health officer, or 102 his designee, may inspect the children's records or be furnished 103 certificates of immunization compliance by the school.

104 (10) It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge 105 of each school to enforce the requirements for immunization. Any 106 child not exempt under subsection (3) or (4) of this section is 107 not in compliance at the end of ninety (90) days from the opening 108 of the fall term must be suspended until in compliance, unless the 109 health officer * * * attributes the delay to lack of supply of 110 vaccine or some other such factor clearly making compliance 111 impossible.

112 (11) Failure to enforce provisions of this act shall 113 constitute a misdemeanor and upon conviction be punishable by fine 114 or imprisonment or both.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2016.

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
