COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 968

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-27-203, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO CLARIFY THE SYNONYMOUS MEANING OF THE TERMS "HIGH SCHOOL 3 EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA" AND "GED" FOR PURPOSES OF QUALIFYING STUDENTS 4 IN THE MISSISSIPPI NATIONAL GUARD YOUTH CHALLENGE PROGRAM FOR 5 GRADUATION; TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 37-4-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 6 1972, FOR PURPOSES OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED 7 PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 43-27-203, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 43-27-203. (1) There is created under the Mississippi
- 12 National Guard a program to be known as the "Youth Challenge
- 13 Program." The program shall be an interdiction program designed
- for children determined to be "at risk" by the National Guard. 14
- 15 The Mississippi National Guard shall implement and
- 16 administer the Youth Challenge Program and shall promulgate rules
- 17 and regulations concerning the administration of the program. The
- 18 National Guard shall prepare written guidelines concerning the
- nomination and selection process of participants in the program, 19

- 20 and such guidelines shall include a list of the factors considered
- 21 in the selection process.
- 22 (3) Participation in the Youth Challenge Program shall be on
- 23 a voluntary basis. No child may be sentenced by any court to
- 24 participate in the program; however, a youth court judge may refer
- 25 the program to a child when, under his determination, such program
- 26 would be sufficient to meet the needs of the child.
- 27 (4) The Mississippi National Guard, under the auspices of
- 28 the Challenge Academy, may award an adult high school diploma to
- 29 each participant who meets the requirements for a High School
- 30 Equivalency Diploma equivalent under the policies and guidelines
- 31 of the GED Testing Service of the American Council on Education or
- 32 other high school equivalency exam and any other minimum academic
- 33 requirements prescribed by the National Guard and Challenge
- 34 Academy for graduation from the Youth Challenge Program.
- 35 Participants in the program who do not meet the minimum academic
- 36 requirements may be awarded a special certificate of attendance.
- 37 The Mississippi National Guard and the Challenge Academy shall
- 38 establish rules and regulations for awarding the adult high school
- 39 diploma and shall prescribe the form for such diploma and the
- 40 certificate of attendance.
- 41 (5) The Mississippi National Guard may accept any available
- 42 funds that may be used to defray the expenses of the program,
- 43 including, but not limited to, federal funding, public or private

- 44 funds and any funds that may be appropriated by the Legislature
- 45 for that purpose.
- 46 **SECTION 2.** Section 37-4-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 47 brought forward as follows:
- 48 37-4-5. (1) The terms "Junior College Commission" and
- 49 "State Board for Community and Junior Colleges," whenever they
- 50 appear in the laws of the State of Mississippi, mean the
- 51 "Mississippi Community College Board."
- 52 (2) The term "High School Equivalency Diploma," whenever it
- 53 appears in the laws of the State of Mississippi, means a high
- 54 school diploma that has been approved by the Mississippi Community
- 55 College Board.
- 56 (3) The terms "general educational development," "general
- 57 education development" and "GED," whenever they appear in the laws
- of the State of Mississippi, mean a high school equivalency
- 59 diploma as defined in subsection (2) of this section.
- 60 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 61 and after its passage.
