HOUSE BILL NO. 976

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-103-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO LIMIT THE HIGHER EDUCATION OUT-OF-STATE TUITION WAIVER FOR 3 VETERANS WHO ARE ENROLLED IN A PROFESSIONAL DEGREE PROGRAM TO 4 THOSE VETERANS WHO MEET CERTAIN FEDERAL CRITERIA; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-103-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

9 37-103-25. (1) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions 10 of Higher Learning and the boards of trustees of the community 11 colleges and junior colleges are authorized to prescribe the 12 amount of tuition and fees to be paid by students attending the 13 several state-supported institutions of higher learning and 14 community colleges and junior colleges of the State of 15 Mississippi.

16 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and 17 subsections (3) and (4) of this section, the total tuition to be 18 paid by residents of other states shall not be less than the 19 average cost per student from appropriated funds. However, the

23 The nonresident student is either a veteran, as (a) 24 defined by Title 38 of the United States Code, or a person 25 entitled to education benefits under Title 38 of the United States Code. Nonresident students enrolled in a professional school or 26 27 college at a state institution of higher learning are excluded 28 from this paragraph (2)(a) except for those nonresident students 29 who must be charged tuition equal to the amount established under subsection (1) due to the provisions of Section 702 of the 30 31 Veterans Access, Choice and Accountability Act of 2014. This 32 paragraph (a) shall be administered and interpreted in the manner necessary to obtain or retain approval of courses of education by 33 34 the Secretary of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs; The nonresident student is an evacuee of an area 35 (b)

36 affected by Hurricane Katrina or Hurricane Rita. This waiver 37 shall be applicable to the 2005-2006 school year only.

38 (c) The nonresident student's out-of-state tuition was
39 waived according to subsection (3) or (4) of this section.

40 (3) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 41 Learning may, in its discretion, consider and grant requests to 42 approve institution specific policies permitting the waiver of 43 out-of-state tuition when such an official request is made by the 44 president or chancellor of the institution and when such request

The board of trustees of any community college or junior 48 (4) 49 college may develop and implement a policy for waiving 50 out-of-state tuition for the college if the policy is determined by the board to be in accordance with the educational mission of 51 the college and if a local industry or business or a state agency 52 53 agrees to reimburse the college for the entire amount of the out-of-state tuition that will be waived under the policy. State 54 55 funds shall be allocated and spent only on students who reside 56 within the State of Mississippi. However, associate degree 57 nursing students who reside outside the State of Mississippi may be counted for pay purposes. 58

59 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 60 and after July 1, 2016.
